FATHER'S LETTER

THE GOOD WORD AND ACTION OF BLESSING

Recently, I had the opportunity to teach our Archangels Preschool the gesture of blessing. Whenever we kiss the hand of a priest, we receive a blessing. One of the children asked me, "what is a blessing?"

We commonly say things like "God bless you" but when we do say this, what exactly do we mean?

There are many times in the scripture where the word "bless" is used. In Romans 12:14, Paul writes to the Romans "Bless those who persecute you; bless, and do not curse." What is he telling us to do to those who persecute us?

The word "bless" is used hundreds of times in the bible. When it mentions someone offering a blessing, many times there are words spoken. For example, when God creates mankind, in Genesis 1:18 it says "Then God blessed them, and God said to them, be fruitful and multiply." Therefore we know that blessings are sometimes associated with words.

When the Lord Ascended into heaven, He lifts up His hands to bless His disciples (Luke 24:50). In other areas, blessing has to do with the lifting up of hands. When Ezra the prophet blessed the Lord, people lifted up their hands and bowed before God (Nehemiah 8:6). In these two examples, blessing is associated with physical action.

We can come to the conclusion that sometimes blessings consist of words and actions. The word "blessing" in Greek is "Evlogia" which literally means the "good word." So these "good words" have some kind of an intention for action.

So why bless? Why receive blessings?

Because heartfelt blessings have power.

Think about how many times within the Divine Liturgy blesses with his right hand and says "peace be to all." The priest, who holds his hands in the shape of IC XC, transfers the peace of our Lord, Jesus Christ, into the hearts and souls of our people so that they may be able to experience and receive the Risen Christ. Christ's first words to His apostles upon His resurrection were "Peace be to You." These words were meant to bring peace into their hearts (action) so that they would recognize Him. Blessings have power to open our hearts! While in the pews, the chanter's response (and therefore, all parishioners who are present) reply with the words "and to your spirit." In other words, you are asking God to transfer that peace toward the priest as well! Although this interaction is short, think about the beauty and intimacy of this short dialogue between the clergy and laity in our worship!

These blessings have power! If you are not sure about this, think about a time when someone you know said something that touched you deeply and made you feel loved. On the contrary, think about a time when someone hurt you by their words. How did these experiences effect and shape your relationship with those people?

Words really do have power. Blessings have the power to do good, and curses have the power to do evil. When God blesses, He has great power, but we also have power in our blessings and curses too. When our actions do not match the words we say, this blessing loses power and also credibility. Our actions are to reflect whatever blessing may be bestowed onto others. So when St. Paul says, "Bless those who persecute you; bless, and do not curse," offer your blessing in the form of good words and actions, and watch how God gives that blessing power.

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Philoptochos,

We begin November with a celebration of Saints Cosmas and Damianos, the patron saints of Philoptochos. The saints were distinguished physicians dedicated to helping the needy; traveling and providing medical care for free. As is our tradition we will celebrate on November 6th with a memorial service to remember our departed members and an artoclasia for the health of our current members. Our scholarship presentation honoring our recipients was held in September. We honor the past members who paved the way for us, the ladies of the present who continue to work hard to help those in need and to the future members who will carry on our



philanthropic mission: multiple generations of Philoptochos members dedicated to service and care for those in need.

One of our members recently submitted a short synopsis describing Philoptochos that I will share. "The Philoptochos is a ministry of our Church which promotes charitable, benevolent and philanthropic outreach; to perpetuate and promote our Orthodox faith and traditions. When Philoptochos sees pain and suffering, they offer comfort. When Philoptochos sees hunger, they aspire to offer sustenance. When Philoptochos sees despair, they seek to offer hope." This is what we strive to be!

It is together with your support that we can fulfill our philanthropic mission.

On November 8th our Philoptochos will be Feeding the Hungry at Annunciation Cathedral in Chicago. Due to the Covid-19 precautions, we will be preparing and distributing 100 hot lunch meals outside the Cathedral. An additional 50 lunches will be prepared and delivered to the homeless living under the viaducts in Chicago "under the bridge program". We pass the homeless, living in tents on our way home and have included them as a stop whenever we go to the Cathedral.

A reminder to order spanakopites, tyropites, pastichio and moussaka for the fall "Take and Bake" fundraiser. All orders are due by November 14th with pick up on November 19th. Each item can be stored in your freezer to be baked when needed. To make it even easier to order you can use Event Brite, or save the fees and email or call your order in and just pay when you pick up.

It is hard to believe, but it is time to think about our Annual Christmas Craft Show taking place on December 3rd & 4th. Sophia Kopanitsanos, Tasia Pappas, and Olga Paxinos are the chairwomen for the pastries and are finalizing the baking schedule. This is our largest fundraiser supporting all of our outreach programs; we welcome everyone's help. You don't have to be a baker, there is always enough work and never enough hands. Please consider volunteering your time and your gifts towards this event, gentlemen are also welcome!

In addition to the delicious homemade pastries offered at the craft show, we will also be offering beautifully packaged combination platters "Pastries to Go". These must be preordered and are available for pick up after December 2nd. The pre-order will include small and large combination plates and prepackaged dozens of melomakarouna and kourambiedes. These are perfect gifts for sharing our Greek Christmas Cheer with neighbors, colleagues and friends. Homemade delicious sweets without you baking! The order forms for the "Pastries to Go" are available and we ask that all orders be submitted by Nov. 27th. You can email or call in your order and pay at pick up. We encourage you to share the order forms with friends,

neighbors, colleagues and family. A portion of the proceeds from this fundraiser will go to Operation Classroom to help children and provide tools for teachers in lower income schools.

The American Cancer Society, established in 1913, is a nationwide voluntary health organization dedicated to eliminating cancer. Philoptochos sponsored a Cancer Walk for "to remember those we've lost to cancer, for support and hope to those that continue the fight and for those who are survivors". Thank you to all of our parishioners for their support and special thanks to Ruth Faklis and her committee: Peggy Zippman, Stella Parhas, Thalia Colompos. We hope to make this an annual fundraiser and involve our sister southside parishes.

Finally, on October 22nd, the ladies of Philoptochos supported our sister parish of Holy Apostles by attending their Fashion Show Fundraiser. This event was well attended and we were pleased to be there to support the Philoptochos of Holy Apostles' outreach and philanthropic programs. This has become an annual tradition for us to share fellowship and this year was extra special as our very own Maria Baltsas won 1st prize. As for fashion advice all I can say is that there is a lot of metallics and bling!

In closing I humbly thank all the parishioners for your support of Philoptochos; only together in faith and fellowship can we make a difference to those in need.
