

DOCUMENTARY PRESENTATION

The documentary "Lethal Nationalism: Genocide of the Greeks 1913-1923" tells the tragic story of the Smyrna Catastrophe & the Greek Genocide of 100 years ago with never-before-seen footage. The film was made possible through the efforts of the Asia Minor and Pontos Hellenic Research Center (AMPHRC).



The AMPHRC President and Founder George Mavropoulos, who appears in the film, along with a dedicated board and production team worked tirelessly to create this documentary. George Mavropoulos explains, "The Ottoman government tried to get rid of these people because they had a different faith. Their main plan was Turkey for Turks. There was no room for the Christians, so they had to eliminate them."

The film's director, Peter Lambrinatos, said, "I took on this challenging project using actual footage, firsthand accounts, expert testimony, and academic researchers and government documents provided to internationalize a part of history that has been silenced for over a century.

The film's narrator, famed broadcast

journalist and the voice of many great documentaries, proudly lent his voice and talents to this film. "This production is one of the most important projects that I've ever been associated with, and it provides a sobering lesson as to why we should never forget the suffering that is caused by the genocide," said Bill Kurtis.

The film charts the genocide of Asia Minor's indigenous Greek population by the Ottoman Empire and Turkish nationalists—the genocide that unfortunately served as the model for the subsequent Armenian and Assyrian genocides and the Holocaust too. There are many lessons that are still vital for the world to learn. The truth must be told.

The Asia Minor and Pontos Hellenic Research Center (AMPHRC) is a historical society and a 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization based in Chicago, Illinois. Their goal is to document and disseminate information about the Greek communities of the later Ottoman empire and study their expulsion from their ancestral homelands in Asia Minor, Eastern Thrace, and Pontos. FATHER'S LETTER SPEAKING THE TRUTH IN LOVE

This past Sunday, we heard the call of Christ to his disciples to become "fishers of men." The ark of salvation, the church, today is battling against the sea and waves of the secular world. It does not take much to realize that we are living in a confused time where Orthodox Christians are falling away from standard practices of Christianity. Christ in the gospel has offered His teaching to protect our physical, emotional and spiritual health so that we may not be poisoned by the seductive temptations of the world.

Christians are called to be the salt of the earth; but if this salt loses the savor of Christian life, it is therefore good for nothing but to be cast out and to be trodden under foot of men (Matt 5:13). Not only does salt preserve but it also adds savor to that which we season.

Beloved faithful of Saint Spyridon, we must be aware of this one point: The call of Orthodox Christians in the world is to not only preserve the Orthodox Christian faith in its fullness, but to be a witness to it through authentic praxis.

As baptized Orthodox Christians, we belong to the one Church which Christ established on earth. Nothing else is more precious. If we understand it to be so, then we



must offer and sacrifice worldly things to remain in the grace of His Church. This kind of example will add salt to the wounds of the wounded and will bring fish to come and witness life in Christ through you.

Each Orthodox Christian has this missionary calling. It is not through filaftia (love of the self) but one of Orthodoxia – authentic, true and unadulterated worship and practice that we find our true identity in Christ. In a world inundated with tik-tok and selfies, we must transition from a life pointing to ourselves to a life which points to Christ.

We must first and foremost, speak and act with love. The chief distinguishing mark of the Christian as a disciple of God is this. Therefore, when we address sensitive issues, we must till the soil and throw salt on the wounded with Christ-like love. There are so many confused by the opinions of the media, social experiments, and diabolical agendas. The only way our message will be heard is if we convey it in such a loving and positive way so that those who listen to our words will hear the heart that Orthodoxy conveys.

May we not be swayed by the world and wolves, brothers Speaking the and sisters. truth in love and not being afraid to do so is part of our maturing in Christ. The fish are waiting! It is time to cast the net of love and restore creation, our families, and our world to its pre-fallen state of holiness. To quote St. Porphyrios, "worldly love remains for a time and is gradually extinguished, but divine love continually grows and deepens." As Saint Paul Ephesians, says to the "Speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of Him who is the head, that is, Christ" (Ephesians 4:15). Let us train and encourage one another in truth - the truth found in the gospel, the truth about who God is and what He has called us to- hard truths of correction and may our motive to do so always be love.

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Philoptochos,

The ladies of Philoptochos have had a busy month in September and are looking forward to getting into full swing for October.

On September 24th our Philoptochos ladies attended the Metropolis of Chicago Philoptochos Luncheon. The event was well attended by all our chapters with the focus on reaching out to our youth to incorporate philanthropy in their lives. Our Chapter participated by having our children bring a small kitchen appliance or kitchen tools as a donation to help the homeless. Other chapters brought donations for the bedrooms, bathrooms, and other items to needed to furnish a home. All of the items as well as a monetary donation were delivered to "Digs with Dignity", an organization which helps people go from homeless to a real home. It was heartwarming to see the video presentation of all the children participating and working to help the homeless. Our youth is the future and it is imperative to instill our faith and philanthropic values, not only by words but also by action. Throughout the upcoming year, we will continue to develop programs and reach out to our youth to participate in philanthropy. We welcome any ideas and suggestions for programs so please join us. We especially extend this invitation to our younger ladies, who have a more relevant perspective – join us.

As part of our goal to reach out to our youth, we will be preparing a 'Philo bag" for students living away at college. We hope this will serve as a reminder they are an integral part of our community and we are thinking and praying for them. We ask the parents of college students to please forward residential information for students to the office so





we can send these packages out. Our hope is to have them delivered by the end of October.

On Sunday September 25th, Philoptochos announced the recipients of the Peter Manasses Scholarships. With the generous underwriting of Mrs. Tina Manasses, we were able to award four undergraduate scholarships at \$2,000 per student and one graduate school scholarship at \$3,000. We thank the Manasses family for their support of our community's youth and for demonstrating true philanthropic values. So many of us who come from immigrant families understand the sacrifices made to educate and improve the lives of their families. We also thank the Manasses family for sponsoring the fellowship luncheon; memory eternal for Peter Manasses. Thank you to our Philoptochos ladies who prepared and served during this luncheon. It was delicious as always, but so much more enjoyable sitting on our new comfortable new chairs!

Some background: Since 1990 the Philoptochos Society of St Spyridon has promoted and supported the education of our youth by awarding outstanding students in our community scholarships. Each recipient exemplifies the hard work, strong values, relentless commitment to community service and scholarly perseverance that our philanthropic organization embodies. This year's Chairman Maria Baltsas and the Scholarship Committee proudly announce #1, #2, #3 #4 as the recipients of the un-

dergraduate scholarships of \$2,000 and #5 as the recipient of the graduate school scholarship of \$3,000. Congratulations to our recipients on their accomplishments; we wish them success in all their future educational pursuits and remind them St. Spyridon is their home. During the month of October, we traditionally sponsor a Fall Luncheon, however this year we will forego this, as we encourage everyone to attend our Parish's Fall Fellowship Brunch on Sunday October 23rd. During the month of October Philoptochos will be focusing its efforts on feeding the hungry by preparing and delivering food to the homeless living under the bridges. Our goal is to make 100 meals and deliver them on two separate days. We have asked GOYA to assist us in preparing the food and hope to deliver on a Saturday, so they can also participate in the delivery. We will also be preparing small hygiene packages to be included, further information on dates and items needed will be forth coming. If anyone is interested in participating in the "Under the Bridge" program please let me know we always need help. I encourage any high school and college students to consider joining us.

We will once again be sponsoring our "Fall Take and Bake". Orders will begin at the end of October for pastichio, moussaka and homemade spanakopites and tyropites. The orders will be delivered in November, before Thanksgiving. Further details and the flyer/order form will be coming in next few weeks.

We will be scheduling a visit to the Greek American Nursing and Rehabilitation Center to celebrate Liturgy and donate \$1,200 from our previous fundraiser. Father George is working to schedule the date and will let us know when it is confirmed. Our ladies will be preparing our fabulous trays of sweets and looking forward to visiting the residents. We may need some carpooling so if anyone is interested, please contact Toula Georgiopoulos.

On November 8th our Philoptochos will be Feeding the Hungry at Annunciation Cathedral in Chicago. We will be preparing and distributing 100 lunches outside the Cathedral. We are hoping to serve hot lunches which require more servers on site. An additional 50 bagged lunches will be prepared and delivered "under the bridge' to the homeless living under the viaducts on our way home after serving at the Cathedral. Please let me know if anyone is interested in both preparing and delivering the lunches.

As always, we are grateful for your support and encouragement, as only with your help can we continue our philanthropic mission. I whole heartedly and humbly thank you again for your support and your love to Philoptochos.





SAINT OF THE MONTH

ST. ROMANOS THE MELODIST (OCTOBER 1ST)

Saint Romanos was born in Emesa, Syria and was Saint Romanos is said to have produced a thousand ordained a deacon in the Church of Beirut. Then he of these kondakia, of which only eighty remain tomoved to Constantinople under Emperor Anastasi- day. Among these kondakia attributed to him is the os I and Patriarch Euphymios (490-496).

Romanos was pious and virtuous since his childhood. He fervently honored the Mother of God and It is noteworthy that Saint Romanos was the first to attended the Church services regularly.

He had an urge to glorify the Theotokos, but was hindered by insufficient musical and vocal talent.

Then, one time, during the Nativity Vigil in the Church of Blachernes in Constantinople, the Mother of God appeared to him and gave him a scroll, which she commanded him to eat.

It had a sweet taste that filled his mouth. Then Romanos mounted the pulpit in the church and began to chant with an angelic voice the hymn which is known as the kontakion to the Mother of God: "Today the Virgin gives birth to Him who is above all being,

Akathist to the Mother of God that the Church sings during Great Lent.

put the letter (T) in Greek before his name. This letter refers to the word (Tapinos), which means humble. This same sign was later adopted by the bishops, in the form of a small cross.

> The saint's liturgical service for vespers beautifully praises him as follows: "Thou didst show thyself to be a first-offering of good works, a starting-point of salvation, O Romanos our father; for, composing angelic hymns, thou didst show thy life to be godly. Entreat Christ God, that He deliver from perils and tribulations those who hymn thee."

> Saint Romanos reposed in the Lord as a deacon of the great church in Constantinople.

And the earth offers a cave to Him whom no man Apolytikion of Romanos the Melodist can approach.

Angels with shepherds give glory,

And magi journey with a star.

For unto us is born a young child,

The pre-eternal God."

From then on, the gift of the Holy Spirit poured inside him abundantly and did not leave him. He composed an immense amount of hymns which covered most of the liturgical year. Romanos is the inventor of the "kondakion", in reference to the Virgin's scroll that he was given to eat. It is mainly a group of 20-24 strophes called "oikoi" (from the Greek "oikos"- "house"), which contain a number of troparia.

The image of God, was faithfully preserved in you, O Father. For you took up the Cross and followed Christ. By Your actions you taught us to look beyond the flesh for it passes, rather to be concerned about the soul which is immortal. Wherefore, O Holy Romanos, your soul rejoices with the angels.

Kontakion of Romanos the Melodist

As a harmonious harp of lofty wisdom from on high and an expounder of things seen in Godinspired ascents, we extol thee, Father Romanos, and we hymn thee. As a trumpet of the gifts that pass the mind of man, do thou rouse us to divine and saving watchfulness, as we cry to thee: Rejoice, O Father elect of God.
