FATHER'S MESSAGE -THE ACCEPTABLE YEAR OF OUR LORD

There's a movie called "Chariots of Fire" which was released in 1981 that tells the story of Eric Lidell. This man was born in 1902. Eric was the second son of missionary parents born in China. He was an extremely athletic man who enjoyed rugby and running. He was so gifted in running that he ran in the 1924 Paris Olympics. As he prepared for this great moment, He was ready to participate in the 100-meter run. Liddell, a devout Christian, dropped out of this race – his strongest event – because of one thing; the qualifying heats were scheduled for a Sunday. The great issue for Eric was keeping Sunday holy. He believed that he should not run in the Olympics on the Lord's Day. Keeping Sunday holy for him

was a very important spiritual matter. When all the persuasive powers of the British Olympic team and the Duke of Windsor were brought to help him change his mind, Eric remained absolutely immovable! Eric is quoted in his book saying "Every Christian should live a


God-guided life. If you are not guided by God, you will be guided by someone or something else. God made countries, God makes kings and the rules by which they govern, and those who ruled say that the Sabbath is His."

In the gospel read on September 1st, every year we read from St. Luke of Jesus' entry into Nazareth where he was given the book of the Prophet Isaiah to read. When he opened it, he found the place where it is written, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, for which cause He has anointed me" (Luke 4:18).

These words fulfill the prophecy that Christ is the anointed one chosen by God to accomplish His mission – to preach the good news to the poor; to recover sight to the blind; for the release of captives; and to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord" – quoting the book of Isaiah in the 61st chapter from the Old Testament. For Christians, we are left inspired to help carry out this mission also!

There is a detail in this passage that is often overlooked. St Luke tells us that "He went to the synagogue as was his custom, on the sabbath day" (Luke 4:15 – 16). He did not go now and then, not on special occasions, not just when he felt like it; he went habitually.

A life in Christ means that we do the very things that Christ does. We too, are meant to come to the temple on the sabbath day habitually. Today the convictions of Eric Liddel seem old-fashioned. There are many who do not give the importance of keeping the Lord's Day a second thought. Today, many go to work and engage in play or recreation on the Sabbath. Some may go to church when it is "convenient."



cause we have forsaken the one true God. We have allowed the false gods, the idols of this world to crowd Him out of life.

Ask the common person: "Do you follow the ten commandments in your daily life?" They will say, "Yes, I do. I have never murdered anyone, I honor my parents, I don't worship idols." We often forget, however, the fourth commandment – Honor the Sabbath day and keep it holy. Why do we honor the other commands but neglect this one so easily?

Participation in Liturgical Life, especially on Sundays, is one of the prime barometers of true discipleship. It is hard to be with God during the week if we are not with Him in the beginning of the week. How can we live seven days a week without words to direct us and without His Presence in the Eucharist to give us power? Is it any wonder the early Church decreed that the Christan absenting himself/herself from worship for three consecutive Sundays (except for illness) was to be excommunicated?

FATHER'S MESSAGE -THE ACCEPTABLE YEAR OF OUR LORD

If we don't attend on Sundays at least, we are destroying one of our main lines of communication to God. We become like a plant during a hot summer that is not watered throughout the week. Our heart is the plant that needs to be watered so that the flowers of faith, hope, love, joy, peace and forgiveness can blossom. The flowers become droopy at times and need watering which brings revival. This is exactly what the Divine Liturgy does for us. It gives us the strength to go through the first part of the week, and then yearn for it again as we approach the end of the week.

A devout Orthodox woman said, "Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, I still live under the spell of the Lord's Day. On Thursday, Friday and Saturday, I already live in the anticipation of the joy to the Lord's Day."

Hitler knew he could wean a whole generation of Germans away from the Christian faith if he could prevent their attendance at regular weekly worship. He didn't outlaw Christian worship. He just made sure that the youth kept marching up and down, cleaning barracks and keeping busy with other activities during church hours.

If we convince ourselves that we are "just as good Christians" on the golf course or in the market on Sunday morning, it is only a matter of time that God will play no real part in our lives.

Sunday – our Sabbath – is important because, above all, it is the day in which we encounter the living and risen Christ. It is on the Lord's day that St. John saw the vision of God and was told to write the book of Revelation (Rev. 1:10-11). It was on Sunday when the disciples gathered behind closed doors and encountered Christ risen from the dead and gave the apostles His peace (Matt. 28:9). On our Sabbath, the Resurrected Christ appears and speaks to us in the preaching of His word and comes to dwell in us when we receive Him in the chalice. Sunday is a celebration in which we encounter the risen Christ.

According to a legend attributed to St. Basil, there are two angels at the entrance of each

church. Their task is to write in their scrolls the names of those who come to worship God. In some Orthodox monasteries, these two angels, with their scrolls, are painted on the walls of the gate as one is about to enter. On the last day, how many times will your name be on this scroll? "Jesus went to the synagogue as was His custom on the sabbath day." (Luke 4:16)

Brothers and sisters, we all have an inner fire which burns in our hearts. It is illuminated by the Holy Spirit at baptism and it needs to be constantly fueled. If we don't attend to it, it will go out. Every Liturgy is an opportunity to tend to this inner flame that provides the warmth of God's presence to all.

In the beginning of this Ecclesiastical year, let us make a resolution to come to Sunday worship more often than last year; on time so that our hearts may be filled with prayer, to hear the proclamation of the gospel and its message to inspire and motivate us to be in communion with Him. Let us make it custom so that we may glorify God, rejoice in His resurrection and our coming resurrection. May the real and personal encounter with Christ at every Divine Liturgy inspire us to inwardly change so that we too may preach the good news to the poor; so that we may recover our vision from our blindness; so that we may be released of the captivity of "busyness"; so that we, with Christ, can proclaim this year to be "the acceptable year of the Lord" (Luke 4:19). For to You belong glory, honor and worship, Father, Son, Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.



Sunday School is held during the regular school year (September thru May). We encourage families to come to Divine Liturgy at 9:30 am to worship together. After Holy Communion, students go to Sunday School. Grade levels are from Preschool through 12th grade and registration is held in August and September. We ask all parents to enroll their children in Sunday School and have them attend on a regular basis so that they may come close to the Church and learn more about our beautiful Orthodox faith. Registration Fee for Sunday School is \$40/ student payable to Saint Spyridon. Classes begin on September 8th.

Plutarchos Academy

The Afternoon Greek School is held twice a week on Mondays and Fridays from 4:30-6:30 p.m. and is recognized by the Education Department of Greece and the FEK 49/T.B./6-2-1991. Grade levels are Pre-School through 6th Grade followed by the Ellinomathia seminars and Adult Classes. The curriculum encompasses the Greek language, Reading, Writing, Speaking, History, Religion, Ecclesiastical Hymns, Geography of Greece, Greek Ethnic Hymns and Greek Dance. Classes begin Friday, September 6th with an Agiasmo Service. Adult classes begin of Friday, September

20th at 6:45 p.m. Tuition Agreement Form is required to participate.

Family Night

Our Family Night ministry is for families with children in Pre-School through 5th grade. We meet monthly on Friday evening, from 6:30-8:00. Light dinner is served, followed by games, lesson and craft. We also have social events planned. Our first gathering is on September 20th.

Cherubs

Under the wing of the Archangels Academy, Cherubs is a toddler-caregiver playgroup program that welcomes our young children from 6 months to 4 years old, along with caregivers. The group meets every other Wednesday, 10:00a.m.—12noon. The program runs September through May and it is offered free of charge to all area Orthodox families. Our first gathering is on September 18th.

Athletics

All youth (boys and girls) between the ages of 5-17 are invited to join the Athletics Program of our parish. We are in need for coaches for the basketball season and for Jr. Olympics. 
