FATHER'S LETTER

SILENCE ON THE INSIDE – THE DORMITION FAST

Beloved Faithful,

There has been a surge of rain, strong winds and tornadoes that have stormed through Illinois in the month of July. Whenever we experience these things, they deprive us of calmness, peace, and joy. These storms are a good reminder that everything is temporary in this world. Very few things will remain forever.

Without inner peace and silence, it is impossible to hear God and eternity. How can one hear or contemplate God, faith, and eternity, which will be beautiful and bright if we can never live in silence?

But external silence is not enough. We need to be able to silence our inner being. It is with inner silence that we begin to hear and experience the inner kingdom of God.

Thankfully, we are given the gift of the Dormition fast to help teach us hesychia (silence). The wisdom of the church gives us this period in the middle of summer when the ripe fruits are harvested, and we have reaped the benefits of our labor. It provides us with the opportunity to contemplate His surrounding beauty and admire the miraculous work of our Lord!

The Paraklesis services that we will pray will lead us to the Falling Asleep of the Theotokos. Her Dormition creates a special environment and mood that reminds us to be still, humble and bear our cross. Within her life, the Theotokos exemplifies humility and obedience to God's will, trust in Him, readiness and reverence for the Lord.

Fasts, of course, are voluntary. In a similar way, a person cannot be saved if he or she doesn't want it. Every year, a life preserver is thrown out to the world and can only lead to salvation if it is accepted. In the same way, fasting will not be beneficial, it will not bring joy and transformation, if there is no inner desire to keep the fast.

Fasting is our temporary withdrawal from the world, withdrawal into oneself. It is that which helps us disconnect from the raging waters of information that drown us. Silence allows us to rethink our life, which is essential for spiritual life. May the time of the Dormition fast become beneficial and healing for our souls. May the light of the feast day of the Dormition, she that is "a protection of Christians unshakable" illuminate our path, inspire, and comfort us during these fifteen days.



Αύγουστος: Ο Μήνας της Παναγίας μας

Μητροπολίτου Φαναρίου Αγαθαγγέλου

Από τὰ ὀνόματα καί μόνο πού ἔδωσε ὁ λαός μας στήν Παναγία, καί πού μέ αὐτά τήν καταστόλισε, φαίνεται πόσο πνευματική ἀληθινά εἶναι ἡ τιμή πρὸς τὸ ὑπερευλογημένο πρόσωπο τῆς Παναγίας στήν ὀρθόδοξη πίστη καί ζωή. Θεοτόκος, Παναμώμητος, Τιμιωτέρα τῶν Χερουβίμ, ἔνδοξωτέρα τῶν Σεραφεῖμ, Κεχαριτωμένη, ἔμψυχος κιβωτός, ἡγιασμένος ναός, παράδεισος λογικός, ῥόδον τὸ ἀμάραντον, χρυσοῦν θυμιατήριον, χρυσή λυχνία, μαναδόχος στάμνος, κλίμαξ ἐπουράνιος, πρεσβεία θερμή, τεῖχος ἀπροσμάχητον, ἐλέους πηγὴ, τοῦ κόσμου καταφύγιον, Βασιλέως καθέδρα, χρυσοπλοκάματος πύργος καί δωδεκάτειχος πόλις, ἡλιοστά-λακτος θρόνος, σκέπη τοῦ κόσμου, δένδρον ἀγλαόκαρπον, ξύλον εὐσκιόφυλλον, ἀκτίς νοητοῦ ἡλίου, Σιών ἁγία, Θεοῦ κατοικητήριον, ἐπουράνιος πύλη, ἀδικουμένων προστάτις, βακτηρία τυφλῶν, θλιβομένων ἡ χαρὰ, καί μύρια ἄλλα, πού βρίσκονται μέσα στὰ λειτουργικά βιβλία τῆς Εκκλησίας καί στὰ κείμενα τῶν Πατέρων μας. Κοντὰ σ' αὐτά εἶναι καί τὰ ὀνόματα πού ἔχουν ἀποδοθεῖ στὰ ἱερά εἰκονίσματά της: Ὁδηγήτρια, Γλυκοφιλοῦσα, Πλατυτέρα τῶν Οὐρανῶν, Ἐλπίς τῶν ἀπελπισμένων, Ταχεῖα Ἐπίσκεψις, Ἀμόλυντος, Παραμυθία, Ἐλεοῦσα, Ἐπακούουσα, Γοργοῦπήκοος, Μυροβλί-τισσα, Ἀντιφωνήτρια, Παραμυθία, Γαλακτοτροφοῦσα, Φανερωμένη, Παμμακάριστος, καί ἄλλα πολλά. Πόση ἀγάπη, πόσο σέβας καί πόσα κατασκευαστικά δάκρυα φανερῶνουν μοναχὰ αὐτά τὰ ὀνόματα, πού χαράχθηκαν στίς ψυχές μέ πόνο, μέ ταπείνωση, μέ πίστη.



Αὐτή ἡ κοινὴ πίστη καί ἡ καθολικὴ συνείδηση καί διαχρονικὴ ἐμπειρία τοῦ ἐκκλησιαστικοῦ σώματος γιὰ τὸ πρόσωπο τῆς Παναγίας μας ἀποτυπώθηκε καί στήν ἐκκλησιαστικὴ τέχνη καί ἰδιαίτερα στήν ἀγιογραφία καί τὴν εἰκόνα.

Ἡ εἰκόνα δέν εἶναι διακοσμητικὸ στοιχεῖο, οὔτε ἀκόμη καί μία ἀπλή εἰκονογράφηση ἑνὸς προσώπου. Εἶναι ἀναπόσπαστο μέρος τῆς λειτουργίας τοῦ ἐκκλησιαστικοῦ σώματος καί ἀποτελεῖ μέσο γιὰ νὰ γνωρίσουμε τὸν Θεὸ καί νὰ ἐνωθοῦμε μαζί Του. Ὁ λόγος καί ἡ εἰκόνα στή λειτουργία σχηματίζουν μιὰ ἀδιάσπαστη ἐνότητα καί ὁλότητα διὰ μέσου τῆς ὁποίας ἡ Παράδοση καθιστᾷ ἐπίκαιρο καί ζωντανό τὸ Εὐαγγέλιο. Ἡ εὐλάβεια πρὸς τίς εἰκόνες εἶναι συνεπῶς μιὰ θεμελιώδης ὄψη τῆς λειτουργικῆς ἐμπειρίας, δηλαδή τῆς προθεωρίας, τῆς πρόγευσης, τῆς Βασιλείας τῶν Οὐρανῶν μέσα ἀπὸ τίς πράξεις τοῦ Βασιλέως Χριστοῦ.

Σημαντικὸ ἀκόμη στοιχεῖο γιὰ τὴν ὀρθὴ κατανόηση τῆς ὀρθοδόξου εἰκόνας εἶναι καί ἡ σημασία πού ἀποδίδει ἡ Ἐκκλησία στὰ πρότυπα τῶν εἰκόνων της. Γι' αὐτὸ καί ὁ Μέγας Βασίλειος διακηρύττει ὅτι «ἡ τῆς εἰκόνας τιμὴ ἐπὶ τὸ πρῶτότυπον διαβαίνει».

Ἡ Πατρίδα μας εἶναι «κατάσπαρτη» ἀπὸ θαυματουργές ἱερές εἰκόνες τῆς Παναγίας πού φυλάσσονται σὲ Ναοὺς καί Μοναστήρια καί ὑπενθυμίζουν σέ ὅλους μας τὴ χαρὰ τῆς λυτρώσεως τοῦ ἀνθρώπου ἀπὸ τὸν Χριστό, γιατί Ἐκείνη ὑπηρετήσε πιστὰ τὸ μυστήριον τῆς σωτηρίας μας. Ἔτσι ἀποτυπώσαμε τίς σκέψεις αὐτές μέ τὴν εὐχὴ νὰ ἀτενίζουμε τὸ πρόσωπο τῆς Παναγίας μας καί νὰ σφυρηλατεῖται στήν καρδιά μας ἡ ἐλπίδα καί ἡ ὑπέρβαση τοῦ φόβου τοῦ θανάτου. Ἐναποθέτοντας τὴν ἐλπίδα μας στὸν ποταμὸ τὸν γλυκερὸ τοῦ ἐλέους τῆς Ὑπεραγίας Θεομήτορος, ἅς ἀγωνισθοῦμε νὰ καρποφορήσουμε καρπούς ἀξιους τῆς σωτηρίας, κάτω ἀπὸ τὴ δικὴ της χαριτόβρυτη προστασία. Εἶναι αὐτὸ πού κάθε ἀπόβραδο ἐκμυστηρευόμαστε μπροστὰ στήν εἰκόνα της: «Τὴν πᾶσαν ἐλπίδα μου εἰς σέ ἀνατίθημι, μῆτερ τοῦ Θεοῦ, φύλαξόν με ὑπὸ τὴν σκέπη σου».

THE GREAT MIRACLE OF ST. SPYRIDON ON AUGUST 11, 1716

Vigil of St. Spyridon on Thursday, August 10th at 7:00 pm

Our holy father among the saints, Spyridon, wrought miracles at all times. However, the most exceptional and remarkable one was whereby he preserved Kerkyra impregnable in the face of the Turkish invasion of 1716. Every corner of the island marvels and proclaims this extraordinary event in a resounding voice. The matter took place as follows:

War erupted between the Venetians and Ishmaelites (Turks), resulting in the capture of the Peloponnesos. The Turks considered it to their advantage to take Kerkyra also. Therefore, on the 24th day of June, in the year 1716, a powerful Turkish fleet sailed into the city's harbor. Due to this unexpected move, the inhabitants were overwhelmed and surprised. A great army of Turks landed on the beautiful island shores, their purpose being to lay siege and pillage the island by land and sea.

A fierce battle ensued, but the barbarians succeeded in overpowering the Christians by fire and sword. After fifty days of violent combat, the infidels' main thrust came to be directed against the city of Kerkyra. Then, the beleaguered Orthodox Christians, having no other recourse, sought refuge in their holy hierarch and defender, Saint Spyridon. Day and night, they entreated him with tears and vigils, begging him to rescue them from imminent annihilation. (Verily, this occurred!)

One day, the Turkish army stormed the outer walls of the city (and shortly after, many of them met an evil end, as they were evil). They were vanquished by the intervention of the wonderworking Spyridon. The outcome of this further enraged the barbarians, so they marched on the outlying towns, committing heartless and brutal murders wherever they went. In addition to this, they threatened new raids which would exterminate all the natives either by an evil death or by bitter enslavement.

The hapless islanders intensified their vigils and


prayers to the saint to deliver them from this peril. At the point where they anticipated defeat by the Turks, suddenly, at dawn, our great father Spyridon appeared against them, accompanied by a vast celestial host, wielding a sword of lightning in his hand with which he angrily scattered the marauders. This awesome sight struck panic in their ranks, and they turned to flight; their eyesight having been darkened, they were cast into confusion and slew one another. Therefore, they were routed, driven from the land by fear rather than by fire, sword, or any adversary. All this was accomplished solely by Saint Spyridon and the incorporeal hosts of heaven.

Meanwhile, the infantry and cavalrymen fled, and the fleet sailed away in the face of the great power of the holy hierarch, which delivered the city of Kerkyra. However, after calm was restored

(unbeknownst to the islanders), the Kerkyraeans expected further attacks, yet there was no enemy in sight, nor sound to be heard; only absolute silence. Therefore, being puzzled by these peculiar circumstances, they left the city walls and proceeded in the direction of the enemy tents. It was then that they realized that a miracle had taken place, to their utter amazement, and with sheer delight, they leapt for joy. For strange it was and unprecedented for Turks to disappear and leave all their gear behind. As they fled, they acknowledged to everyone

wherever they went that they were driven out by a venerable monk (that is, Saint Spyridon) and a glorious celestial army which appeared in the air, forcing them out with great speed.

Therefore, with extreme reverence everyone hastened to render honor and chant hymns of thanksgiving to the wonderworking hierarch. Furthermore, the expulsion was acknowledged by the Venetians (who ruled the island at the time), who proclaimed the rescue by the saint and the Christ-loving heavenly host, and honored them with a procession and hymns of praise. The memory of this miracle is celebrated on the 11th of August.



THE DORMITION OF THE THEOTOKOS

At the time of Her blessed Falling Asleep, the Most Holy Virgin Mary was again at Jerusalem. Her fame as the Mother of God had already spread throughout the land and had aroused many of the envious and the spiteful against Her. They wanted to make attempts on Her life; but God preserved Her from enemies.

Day and night She spent her time in prayer. The Most Holy Theotokos went often to the Holy Sepulchre of the Lord, and here She offered up fervent prayer. More than once, enemies of the Savior sought to hinder Her from visiting her holy place, and they asked the High Priest for a guard to watch over the Grave of the Lord. The Holy Virgin continued to pray right in front of them, yet unseen by anyone.

In one such visit to Golgotha, the Archangel Gabriel appeared to Her and announced Her approaching departure from this life to eternal life. In pledge of this, the Archangel gave Her a palm branch. With these heavenly tidings the Mother of God returned to Bethlehem with the three girls attending Her (Sepphora, Abigail, and Jael). She summoned Righteous Joseph of Arimathea and other disciples of the Lord, and told them of Her impending Repose.

The Most Holy Virgin prayed also that the Lord would have the Apostle John come to Her. The Holy Spirit transported him from Ephesus, setting him in that very place where the Mother of God lay. After the prayer, the Most Holy Virgin offered incense, and John heard a voice from Heaven, closing Her prayer with the word "Amen." The Mother of God took it that the voice meant the speedy arrival of the Apostles and the Disciples and the holy Bodiless Powers.

The faithful, whose number by then was impossible to count, gathered together, says Saint John of Damascus, like clouds and eagles, to listen to the Mother of God. Seeing one another, the Disciples rejoiced, but in their confusion they asked each other why the Lord had gathered them together in one place. Saint John the Theologian, greeting them with tears of joy, said that the time of the Virgin's repose was at hand.

Going in to the Mother of God, they beheld Her lying upon the bed, and filled with spiritual joy. The Disciples greeted Her, and then they told her how they had been carried miraculously from their places of preaching. The Most Holy Virgin Mary glorified God, because He had heard Her prayer and fulfilled Her heart's desire, and She began speaking about Her imminent end.

During this conversation the Apostle Paul also appeared in a miraculous manner together with his disciples Dionysius the Areopagite, Saint Hierotheus, Saint Timothy and others

of the Seventy Apostles. The Holy Spirit had gathered them all together so that they might be granted the blessing of the All-Pure Virgin Mary, and more fittingly to see to the burial of the Mother of the Lord. She called each of them to Herself by name, She blessed them and extolled them for their faith and the hardships they endured in preaching the Gospel of Christ. To each She wished eternal bliss, and prayed with them for the peace and welfare of the whole world.

Then came the third hour (9 A.M.), when the Dormition of the Mother of God was to occur. A number of candles were burning. The holy Disciples surrounded her beautifully adorned bed, offering praise to God. She prayed in anticipation of Her demise and of the arrival of Her longed-for Son and Lord. Suddenly, the inexpressible Light of Divine Glory

shone forth, before which the blazing candles paled in comparison. All who saw it took fright. Descending from Heaven was Christ, the King of Glory, surrounded by hosts of Angels and Archangels and other Heavenly Powers, together with the souls of the Forefathers and the Prophets, who had prophesied in ages past concerning the Most Holy Virgin Mary.

Seeing Her Son, the Mother of God exclaimed: "My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit hath rejoiced in God My Savior, for He hath regarded the low estate of His Handmaiden" (Luke 1:46-48) and, rising from Her bed to meet the Lord, She bowed down to Him, and the Lord bid Her enter into Life Eternal. Without any bodily suffering, as though in a happy sleep, the Most Holy Virgin Mary gave Her soul into the hands of Her Son and God.

Then began a joyous angelic song. Accompanying the pure soul of the God-betrothed and with reverent awe for the Queen of Heaven, the angels exclaimed: "Hail, Full of Grace, the Lord is with Thee, blessed art Thou among women! For lo, the Queen, God's Maiden comes, lift up the gates, and with the Ever-Existing One, take up the Mother of Light; for through Her salvation has come to all the human race. It is impossible to gaze upon Her, and it is impossible to render Her due honor" (Stikherion on "Lord, I Have Cried"). The Heavenly gates were raised, and meeting the soul of the Most Holy Mother of God, the Cherubim and the Seraphim glorified Her with joy. The face of the Mother of God was radiant with the glory of Divine virginity, and from Her body there came a sweet fragrance.

Miraculous was the life of the All-Pure Virgin, and wondrous was Her Repose, as Holy Church sings: "In Thee, O Queen, the God of all hath given thee as thy portion the things that are above nature. Just as in the Birth-Giving He did preserve Thine virginity, so also in the grave He did preserve Thy body from decay" (Canon 1, Ode 6, Troparion 1).



SAINT SPYRIDON MINISTRIES

Archangels Academy: The institution of the family lies at the center of the success of every Orthodox community because it is in the family setting that dedicated Christians grow and thrive. It is in the family context where Christian values and the Orthodox way of life is instilled and adopted by tomorrow's generation. Archangels Academy, the first Orthodox Bilingual Preschool of the south suburbs offers an excellent Preschool program for our Orthodox families. Archangels Academy is welcoming all students who are 3 years old by September 1st. Classes are held Monday through Friday, 9:00am — 12:00am. School begins the day after Labor Day and ends the Thursday before Memorial Day.

Sunday School : Sunday School is held during the regular school year (September thru May). Grade levels are from Preschool through 12th grade and registration is held in August and September. We ask all parents to enroll their children in Sunday School and have them attend on a regular basis so that they may come close to the Church and learn more about our beautiful Orthodox faith. Registration Fee for Sunday School is \$40/ student payable to Saint Spyridon.

Plutarchos Academy: The Afternoon Greek School is held twice a week on Mondays and Fridays from 4:30-6:30p.m. and recognized by the Education Department of Greece and the FEK 49/T.B./6-2-1991. Grade levels are Pre-School through 6th Grade followed by the Ellinomathia seminars. The curriculum encompasses the Greek language, Reading, Writing, Speaking, History, Religion, Ecclesiastical Hymns, Geography of Greece, Greek Ethnic Hymns and Greek Dance. Tuition Agreement Form Required.

Family Night: Our family night ministry is for children in Pre-School through 5th grade. We meet monthly on Friday evening, from 6:30-8:00. Light dinner is served, followed by games, lesson and craft. We also have social events planned. Flyer is forthcoming.

Cherubs: Under the wing of the Archangels Academy, Cherubs is a toddler-caregiver program that welcomes our young children from 6 months to 4 years old, along with caregivers. The group meets ever other Wednesday, 10:30a.m. — 12noon. The program runs September through May and it is offered free of charge to all area Orthodox families.

Athletics: All youth (boys and girls) between the ages of 5-17 are invited to join the Athletics Program of our parish. We are in need for coaches for the basketball season and for Jr. Olympics. For more information or to volunteer as a coach for one of the teams, please contact our athletic directors, Mr. Demetrius Marines & Mr. Nick Tsinoukas through the Church Office.

JUNIOR G.O.Y.A. & G.O.Y.A. Boys and girls in 6th-12th are welcome to join. Various athletic, social and religious activities are held as well as other programs. Meetings are weekly, a schedule will be announced.

Altar Boys: Boys in 1st grade through High School are called to serve as Altar Boys. Along with their Altar duties, regular meetings and other programs are held. If you wish for your child to participate please contact Fr. George.

Handmaidens: Girls ages 7-17 are called to serve as Handmaidens. Meetings are geared toward service projects that teach young girls to offer their time and talents to the church and to the community at large. All meetings are held on Saturdays at 10:00. Our first meeting will be on Saturday, September 9th.

Choir: Our Senior and Junior Choir meet together once a month. The Choir chants hymns during the Divine Liturgy during the entire year except the summer months of July and August. Practice and Liturgy schedule will be announced.

Floga Greek Dancing: Greek ethnic and cultural dances are taught to children of all ages. The Dancers participate in community ethnic events as well as the parish festival.

Byzantine Music Classes: Adults and Students 1st grade through 12th grade are St. Spyridon Hellenic Orthodox Church 9 Saint Spyridon Ministries welcome. Beginner Classes are held every Saturday from 3:30 pm — 4:15 pm, and Intermediate classes every Saturday from 4:15 pm — 5:00 p.m.

Orthodox Missions: A program that seeks to bring our Lord's message of salvation to all who thirst for the water of Life, supporting in any possible way the overseas and home missions of the "Orthodox Christian Mission Center" Saint Augustine, FL.

Kentro of Orthodox Martyria: The Kentro is a ministry of our parish whose aim is to spread the word of God, further educate all the faithful in the Orthodox faith. The bookstore has available for purchase Byzantine Icons, religious books, religious videos of various Saints, cassettes analyzing our Orthodox faith (in Greek and English) and more.

Diakonia Agapes: A Parish ministry that provides aid and relief to those in need, the poor, the destitute, the sick and all those who may need help. Major food distributions are given to families in need for the major holidays of Pascha, Christmas, and Thanksgiving. Assistance is also provided to these and other families throughout the year. Please support our food pantry and our donation box for the poor located in the church narthex.




PETER MANASSES PHILOPTOCHOS SCHOLARSHIP PRESENTATION
