

FATHER'S MESSAGE

Beloved Faithful,

Prayer Gives us Vision

At the clergy laity conference in San Diego, I was sitting on the couch in the lobby when I looked in front of me and saw a tv screen with six different channels running at the same time. As if one screen isn't enough! This image is a reflection of how we are often tempted to live our lives. It seems as if we are sucked into so many images and distractions, from bill boards to social media, it can be almost impossible to be productive with our minds scattered in so many directions!

In our social-media driven society, we are in danger of losing ourselves. The relationships of many people are struggling from the effects of inattentiveness to life: their own health (physical and spiritual) and their relationship to God and to others (their spouse, children, family and friends).

As we enjoy the summer months, many of us go on vacation in order to find rest and rejuvenation, and to "get away" from distraction. During vacations, we are often gifted with the opportunity to slow down, think, and reflect about our current condition in relationship to our life and the

parts of it mentioned above. The Panagia fast (August 1 through August 14), often referred to as the Summer Pascha, blesses us with this same opportunity. On vacation or in the trenches of this fast, let us use seize the opportunity to encourage our parish toward a greater emphasis of removing distractions by focusing on intensified prayer.

There are many books written on the subject of prayer, many seeking to define it. I think the best definition that I have found of prayer is the following: prayer is the remembrance of God in all things. We could also say that this really is the goal of all prayer. The Fathers of the church speak a lot about prayer and all seem to come back to this one point – that prayer helps us become mindful of God in the midst of every area of our lives. This includes not only intentional prayer at specific times throughout the day, but also in the midst of one's tasks and responsibilities at work and at home. St. Paul's teaching to "pray

without ceasing" (1 Thess 5:17) is certainly a possibility with this definition of prayer.

Origen once said "He who prays unceasingly combines prayer with necessary duties and duties with prayer. Only in this way can we find it practicable to fulfill the commandment to pray always. It consists in regarding the whole of Christian existence as a single great prayer. What we are accustomed to call prayer is only part of it." Thus, prayer can encompass our whole lives. Our whole life then can be an extension of unceasing prayer. St. John Cassian once said "For whoever is in the habit of praying only at the hour when the knees are bent prays very little. But whoever is distracted by any sort of wandering of heart, even on bended knee, never prays. And therefore, we have to be outside the hour of prayer what we want to be when we are praying." Our lives become the activity to our prayer. We become a living

prayer always offering up ourselves to God in all things. In this way, whatever we are doing, we are continually praying.

The Jesus prayer (Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me), gives us the opportunity to look at our life through this special lens. When our words, mind and

heart are focused on the Lord, Christ becomes the motive for all of our choices, decisions, and motives in life. We can always ask ourselves in the context of any situation, what would Christ want for me? The more we give ourselves to this prayer, the more we receive clarity and direction. Our vision for the world and our mission no longer is motivated by the world. It is motivated by what Christ wants. The distractions become less. Our goal and vision are clear. We can then discern what is spiritually nourishing from that which goes against what Christ wants for us and our parish. The six screens no longer exist, and the antenna or signal of our television is tuned into the icon of Christ and His will for us.

If we are never praying, then it will be difficult to accomplish much at all in terms of spiritual growth. Some of us may be saying "I'm doomed. I never pray." If this is how you are feeling, I want to offer you the opportunity to begin collecting yourself through prayer. Prayer is the key which opens the

door to a focused and centered life on Christ. Begin by praying minutes a five (preferably in the morning when your mind is clear). Use the Jesus prayer (Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, Have mercy on me), incorporate a little scripture too, and let your lips recite the prayer. Let the prayers resonate in your mind and let it descend into the heart. Over time and with proper instruction from a priest who prays, your thoughts, desires, and motives for life will be influenced to actualize what the great theologian, Paul Evdokimov writes:

"It is not enough to say prayers. one must become, be prayer incarnate. It is not enough to have moments of praise. All of life, every act, every gesture, even the smile on the human face, must become a hymn of adoration, an offering, a prayer. One should not offer what one has, but what one is."

May God help us to see the totality of our life as one ceaseless prayer especially as we soon will enter the Panagia Fast. Let us be open to seeing the presence of God in all things. It will only be possible if we redirect our lives, eliminate distractions and learn to pray with intent so that the soul may see things for what they truly are – opportunities that God presents for our healing, growth and resurrection in this world for the Kingdom to come.



YOU ARE THE VOICE OF CHRIST IN A CHANGING WORLD

The base from which we serve as the Voice of Christ in a Changing World is the parish. SAINT SPYRIDON MINISTRIES

Archangels Academy: The institution of the family lies at the center of the success of every Orthodox community because it is in the family setting that dedicated Christians grow and thrive. It is in the family context where Christian values and the Orthodox way of life is instilled and adopted by tomorrow's generation. Archangels Academy, the first Orthodox Bilingual Preschool of the south suburbs offers an excellent Preschool program for our Orthodox families. Archangels Academy is welcoming all students who are 3 years old by September 1st. Classes are held Monday through Friday, 9:00am — 12:00am. School begins the day after Labor Day and ends the Thursday before Memorial Day.

<u>Sunday School</u>: Sunday School is held during the regular school year (September thru May). Grade levels are from Preschool through 12th grade and registration is held in August and September. We ask all parents to enroll their children in Sunday School and have them attend on a regular basis so that they may come close to the Church and learn more about our beautiful Orthodox faith. Registration Fee for Sunday School is \$40/ student payable to Saint Spyridon.

Plutarchos Academy: The Afternoon Greek School is held twice a week on Mondays and Fridays from 4:30-6:30p.m. and recognized by the Education Department of Greece and the FEK 49/T.B./6-2-1991. Grade levels are Pre-School through 6th Grade followed by the Ellinomathia seminars and Adult Classes. The curriculum encompasses the Greek language, Reading, Writing, Speaking, History, Religion, Ecclesiastical Hymns, Geography of Greece, Greek Ethnic Hymns and Greek Dance. Tuition Agreement Form Required.

Family Night: Our family night ministry is for children in Pre-School through 5th grade. We meet monthly on Friday evening, from 6:30-8:00. Light dinner is served, followed by games, lesson and craft. We also have social events planned. Flyer is forthcoming. Our first gathering is on September 20.

<u>Cherubs</u>: Under the wing of the Archangels Academy, Cherubs is a toddler-caregiver program that welcomes our young children from 6 months to 4 years old, along with caregivers. The group meets ever other Wednesday, 10:00a.m.—12noon. The program runs September through May and it is offered free of charge to all area Orthodox families. Our first gathering is September 18.

<u>Athletics</u>: All youth (boys and girls) between the ages of 5-17 are invited to join the Athletics Program of our parish. We are in need for coaches for the basketball season and for Jr. Olympics. For more information or to volunteer as a coach for one of the teams, please contact our athletic directors, Mr. Demetrius Marines &Mr. Nick Tsinoukas through the Church Office.

<u>G.O.Y.A.</u> Boys and girls in 6th-12th are welcome to join. Various athletic, social, outreach, and religious activities are held as well as other programs. Meetings are bi-monthly.

<u>Altar Boys:</u> Boys in 1st grade through High School are called to serve as Altar Boys. Along with their Altar duties, regular meetings and other programs are held. If you wish for your child to participate please contact Fr. George, Labros Malfas or Zachary Chibucos.

<u>Handmaidens</u>: Girls ages 7-17 are called to serve as Handmaidens. Meetings are geared toward service projects that teach young girls to offer their time and talents to the church and to the community at large. All meetings are held on Saturdays at 10:00. A schedule is forthcoming.

<u>Choir:</u> Our Senior and Junior Choir meet together once a month. The Choir chants hymns during the Divine Liturgy during the entire year except the summer months of July and August. Practice and Liturgy schedule will be announced.

<u>Floga Greek Dancing:</u> Greek ethnic and cultural dances are taught to children of all ages. The Dancers participate in community ethnic events as well as the parish festival.

<u>Iconography Class:</u> The art and prayer of iconography is taught weekly on Wednesdays from 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm by iconographer Panayiotis Michalopoulos. Our first class will take place on September 25.

Byzantine Music Classes: Adults and Students 1st grade through 12th grade are St. Spyridon Hellenic Orthodox Church 9 Saint Spyridon Ministries welcome. Level 2 Classes are held every Saturday from 3:30 pm — 4:15 pm, and Level 1 and Level 3 classes every Saturday from 4:15 pm — 5:00 p.m.






