

FATHER'S LETTER

A MONK WHO NEVER JUDGED

In the Prologue from Ochrid, St. Nicholai Velimirovich offers a marvelous account of the lives of many saints. In the month of March on the 30th day, there is an unnamed monk who is commemorated who is described as "Lazy, carless, disinclined to prayer..." This is not the description we would expect to read in the life of any Saint of the Church!

Within this reading, we are told that as this monk was close to his departure from this world, he was full of joy. His brother monks knew very well of this monk's short There are three things here; run--comings, and they all were confused how one so seemingly negligent could be facing death so joyfully. When they asked him how this could be possible, he responded: "I have seen the angels, and they showed me a page with all my sins. I said to them: The Lord said, 'Judge not, that you not be judged.' I have never judged anyone and I hope in the mercy of God, that He will not judge me." The monk ended his remarks by telling his brothers that the angels, upon hearing that the monk had never judged anyone, immediately tore up the long list of his sins. The story ends by saying that all the monks marveled at this and learned should scrutinize our own sin and from it.

There is probably nothing to which our Lord attached a greater warning than judging our brother. "Judge not so that you may not be judged. For with what judgment you judge, you will be judged and with the same measure you use, it will be measured back to you" (Matthew 7:1-2). So many of our Saints speak to us about not judging! St. Dorotheos of



Gaza from the 7th century said, "Nothing angers God so much or strips a man so bare or carries him so effectively to ruin as condemning or despising his neighbor. ning a man down; condemning him unjustly, and despising him." For St. Dorotheos, running a man down is gossiping about his behavior or lifestyle. Condemning a man is judging the state or condition of his soul. Despising, of course, is wishing or rejoicing in his ruin or destruction.

Is it any wonder that God hates it when we judge our brother? We now understand why this unnamed monk was assured of heaven. Despite his negligence, he never judged anyone.

Instead, St. Dorotheos tells us if we want to be saved we should never scrutinize the sins of anyone. We we should then set out to eliminate

He continues by telling the story of Isaac the Theban. An angel appeared before Isaac and presented before him the soul of someone who had just died. "Here is the soul of a person you have judged," said the angel. "Where do you order him to be put, into the Kingdom or into eternal punishment? Since you want to judge the just

and the unjust, what do you command for this poor soul?" Isaac was afraid to hear these words, and therefore he spent the rest of his life praying with tears to be forgiven of this sin. He had seen how serious it is to judge.

During this Christmas season, let us learn from Isaac, St. Dorotheos and the unnamed monk and make the decision to not "run a man down, condemn him or despise him." The more we judge, the more we gossip, the farther away from the love of God we drive ourselves.

There will be a day, like there was for the unnamed monk, when we will be confronted with death. Let us pray that our sins are also torn apart. Will we be judged to the degree that we judged others? Like Isaac, may we feel the severity of judgement and also tremble at the thought of the consequences of judging others. Instead, let us dedicate the remaining time of our lives to Christ our God, repenting and avoiding this dangerous sin. Stop judging – stop condemning – Don't despise!

I leave you with a quote from St. Makarios the Great – "Christians should judge no one, neither an open harlot, nor sinner, nor dissolute people, but should look upon all with simplicity of soul and a pure eye. Purity of heart, indeed, consists in seeing sinful and weak men and having compassion for them and being merciful." Let us do our best to be pure so that we may emulate and present the pureness and love of God's kingdom, always, now and forever.

SAINT STORY OF THE MONTH



DECEMBER 13

HOLY VIRGIN MARYR LUCY OF SYRACUSE (304)

DURING DIOCLETIAN'S PERSECUTIANS, THE CHRISTIAN MAIDEN LUCY
WENT WITH HER MOTHER ON PILGRIMAGE TO THE TOMB OF ST AGATHA
(FEBRUARY 5), TO PRAY FOR HER MOTHER'S HEALING FROM AN
AILMENT. SAINT AGATHA APPEARED TO LUCY IN A DREAM AND SAID
'LUCY, MY SISTER, WHY DO YOU ASK FROM ME WHAT YOUR OWN FAITH
CAN OBTAIN? YOUR MOTHER IS HEALED. YOU WILL SOON BE THE GLORY
OF SYRACUSE AS I AM OF CATANIA.' LUCY'S MOTHER WAS HEALED
FROM THAT DAY, AND LUCY DETERMINED TO CONSECRATE HERSELF
ENTIRELY TO GOD. SHE BROKE OFF AN ENGAGEMENT TO A NOBLY-BORN
YOUNG MAN AND GAVE HER LARGE DOWRY OF LAND AND JEWELS TO
THE POOR. HER WOULD-BE HUSBAND ANGRILY DENOUNCED HER AS A
CHRISTIAN TO THE GOVERNOR OF SYRACUSE.

AT THE TRIBUNAL, LUCY FIRMLY CONFESSED HER FAITH IN CHRIST AND REFUSED TO MAKE SACRIFICE TO THE GODS. THE GOVERNOR ORDERED THAT SHE BE PLACED IN A BROTHEL, BUT HIS MINIONS WERE UNABLE TO MOVE HER FROM THE PLACE WHERE SHE STOOD, EVEN WHEN THEY TIED HER WITH ROPES AND ATTEMPTED TO DRAG HER WITH OXEN. THE GOVERNOR ASKED WHAT WITCHCRAFT SHE USED, TO WHICH SHE ANSWERED 'I DO NOT USE WITCHCRAFT — IT IS THE POWER OF GOD THAT IS WITH ME. BRING TEN THOUSAND OF YOUR MEN IF YOU WISH: THEY WILL NOT BE ABLE TO MOVE ME UNLESS GOD WILLS IT.' THE MEN THEN LIT A FIRE AROUND HER, BUT IT DID NOT HARM HER. FINALLY THEY BEHEADED HER WHERE SHE STOOD. WITH HER LAST WORDS, SHE PREDICTED THE DEATHS OF MAXIMIAN AND DIOCLETIAN, AND THE COMING OF PEACE TO THE CHURCH.




