

FATHER'S LETTER

FIGHT THE ENEMY: PREPARE FOR CHRIST'S BIRTH

How often do we blame others for our problems? Whether it involves an individual or group, we often think that if others would do "what we want them to do" then everything would work out well. We all know that things are much more complicated than that.

When I think of Saint Paul, he had many opportunities to try and blame others for his problems. Beatings, ship-wreck, imprisonment, and criticism were just some of the struggles he experienced as he offered Himself to the Lord. Instead of blaming other people, he was spiritually mature enough to recognize that the corrupt spiritual powers tempted others to sin.

His message to the Ephesians, who encountered various struggles, was to prepare themself so that they may resist temptation and spiritual assault by putting "on the whole armor of God." With the "shield of faith, the gospel of peace, you can quench all the fiery darts of the evil one." By putting on "the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." In other words, he encouraged these new Christians to live in contrast to the standards of their culture. Instead of serving worldly things, they were encouraged to offer themselves fully to the Lord. They had to be strong spiritually so that they could respond faithfully to the challenges they would face for devoting their lives to Christ. The Romans would soon torture and kill Christians for not worshiping the pagan gods.

A "normal" human reaction would be to hate their persecutors. But we Christians are to look at our enemies as children of God created in His divine image. Our real enemies are the spiritual forces of darkness that encourage us to hate those who harm or hurt us and to refuse to forgive them.

Putting on the armor of God means opening up our lives as much as possible to the sacramental and ascetical life of the Church. If we fuel our bodies with prayer, learn self control through fasting, and participate in Holy Confession, we can be strengthened by the reception of Holy Communion. The more we live in communion with Christ and reject temptation, the better prepared we are to share in His life.

The Nativity fast has been given to us and calls us to prayer, fasting and almsgiving in order to prepare our hearts and souls to welcome the Savior born at Christmas. As we battle our temptations, we put on the armor of God, we battle against our thoughts and temptations to look for fulfillment in worldly things.

St. Paul and so many martyrs in our church's history found strength to love their persecutors following in the example of Christ on the Cross who said" Father, forgive them for they know not what they do." Their victory lies in the conquering of temptations to preserve their lives in this world by denying Christ.

Today, it is easy for us to be blinded by our own passions to the point where we feel we are justified in hating or refusing to forgive people for wronging us in much smaller ways. When this happens, we become blind to the identity of our real enemies: the demons who tempt us in order to divide us and not share in the life of Christ. We prefer the weakness of Adam and Eve, who stripped themselves of our divine glory instead of wearing the full armor of God.

It is when we feel like we have lost all hope that we are to be persistent in our daily prayers, our fasting and almsgiving, and our participation in the sacramental and ascetical life. This is how we start to recognize the true enemy and open ourselves up to God's healing.

If we want to put on the whole armor of God every day, let's stop pointing fingers and making excuses and look to Christ as our example. Put yourself in the place of the Saints and have the courage to do battle against the evil one. Identify the true enemy – the forces of darkness – so that we may not judge but love the person as Christ loves us.

May we prepare our hearts to welcome the Lord at His birth this Christmas. He did not come to deliver us from people; He is born to make us radiant with divine glory so that we may participate in His life. He is born to conquer our true enemies so that we may love all who bear His image and His likeness. Prepare your heart and truly receive Him.

FOOD PANTRY

On Monday, November 21, our St. Spyridon Food Pantry distributed Thanksgiving meals to 45 families from our local community. Each meal included the following items:

1 turkey, 2 boxes of gravy, 2 packages of stuffing, 2 cans of cranberry sauce, 1 box of brown and serve rolls, 1 can of diced tomatoes, 1 pint of vegetable oil, 1 can of yams, 1lb of butter, 1 box of salt, 1 can of pepper, 1 bottle of salad dressing, 1 box of chicken broth, 1 box of brownie mix, 1 box of pasta, 1 bag of rice, 2 cans of corn, 2 cans of peas, 2 cans of green beans, 1 box of pancake mix, 1 bottle of pancake syrup, 1 stalk of celery, 1 bag of



carrots, one 10lb bag of potatoes, one 5lb bag of frozen vegetables, 1 pumpkin pie, a big bag of assorted fresh fruit (apples, oranges, pears, bananas), 1 dozen eggs.

The value of each basket was roughly \$65.00. We also provided 10 meals to Kingdom Church (the old St. Spyridon) consisting of turkey, stuffing, gravy, canned corn, peas and green beans, soup, mac & cheese, and mashed potatoes.

Beyond the baskets, \$1200 in gift cards will be distributed to St. Spyridon families in need.

The total value of items that were distributed this Thanksgiving was \$4,665.

Thank you to all who donated and those who took their time assemble and distribute the baskets. We are also grateful to Mrs. Vicky Kournetas' Sunday School class for creating beautiful cards to the families. This is the most baskets we have distributed in years, and without your support, this event would not have been possible.
