FATHER'S LETTER

THE WORLD CAN KNOW HIS PEACE THROUGH US

"When the power of love overcomes the love of power the world will know peace." This is a quote by the late guitarist and musician, Jimi Hendrix. As a young guitarist, I enjoyed his creativity and skill as a musician, but as I continue to grow in Christ, these words mean so much more to me.

Of all the blessings of God, peace is something we hope to acquire. In the Liturgy, we begin our petitions with a Litany of Peace: "In peace, let us pray to the Lord. For the peace from above..., for the peace of the whole world..." We pray for heavenly peace but also for peace in the world.

Peace is so important for cooperation, happiness, families, work and our church. Without it, nothing constructive can be achieved and we cannot reach our full potential.

Though peace is desirable, many neglect what is necessary to pursue it. How is peace attained? In the Epistle of St. James (James 3:11 – 18), the apostle and first Hierarch of Jerusalem states,

"Does a spring send forth fresh water and bitter from the same opening? Can a fig tree, my brethren, bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? Thus no spring yields both salt water and fresh. Who is wise and understanding among you? Let him show by good conduct that his works are done in the meekness of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and self-seeking in your hearts, do not boast and lie against the truth. This wisdom does not descend from above, but it earthly, sensual, demonic. For where envy and self-seeking exist, confusion and every evil thing are there. But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peacable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality and without hypocrisy. Now the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace."

In order to have peace, we must actively make peace. What comes to mind is the teaching of our Lord in His sermon on the Mount: "Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called sons of God" (Matthew 5:9).

If we want to foster peace then we must sow peace, plant peace and nurture peace. It cannot happen without effort and self-knowledge.

The Lord and the apostle teach us that peace starts within our heart. In the Liturgy of Saint Basil that we will pray throughout Great Lent on Sunday, we will pray "Remember... all civil authorities, grant them a secure and lasting peace; speak good things in their hearts concerning Your Church and all Your people, that we, in their tranquility may lead a calm and peaceful life..." Having a peaceful heart creates the climate of peace for the Church and for all.

We cannot have peace and war together. Warfare begins with the turmoil of our heart. With this thought in mind, and in the Apostle's writing above, there are two types of wisdom – the wisdom from below and the wisdom from above. The wisdom from below harbors envy and self-seeking in the heart. It is boastful and full of pride; It is earthly, sensual and demonic. When these habits of the world possess us, they compel us to stir up our own heart and the souls of others.

But the wisdom from above is pure. It does not contain hypocrisy or partiality. It has no desire to compete with pride but it competes for virtue. Therefore, we are full of peace, gentle and full of mercy and good fruit. This is how the peacefulness within can help bring or transfer peace to those near us and within our domain of existence.

In the Philokalia, it says the Beatitudes make man a god by grace: he becomes gentle, longs for righteousness, is charitable, dispassionate and a peacemaker...". Thus, we are taught that when we let the Holy Spirit take full charge of our souls, the inner warfare of the flesh against the spirit ceases. We have peace with God. And when we possess the peace of God with all its attributes, we can share it with the world around us. This is how the love of God is made manifest. And this kind of love will help the world experience His peace.

As a parish family, in every interaction and encounter, in every committee meeting, in worship and within our homes, let us do our very best to live with peace, purity and a spirit of gentleness so that we can bear fruit and bear witness to the "Wonderful Counselor, the mighty God, the everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace" Isaiah 9:6). May His peace reign in our hearts and in our Spirit.


