FATHER'S LETTER

The feast of Theophany is amongst us and it is celebrated for eight days (January 6 through January 14). We will bless the waters because Christ is baptized in the river Jordan by John the Forerunner, and it is taught by the Church that this baptism was not for the forgiveness of any sins by Jesus. We know that Jesus is sinless. Rather, He is baptized so that Christian baptism can be initiated to sanctify the whole world.

We think of baptism typically as a Christian practice, but there are other religions that also baptize, and the first-century Judaism was one of them. Before Jesus was baptized, His cousin, John the Baptist, was out in the wilderness baptizing people. Certainly, John was not baptizing anyone into the Church because the Church hadn't been established yet.

When John was baptizing before Christ, he was following the Jewish ritual associated with repentance and remission of sins. This was not an invention of John's but was already an established part of Jewish tradition. Ancient Judaism had a number of different kinds of ritual washings for different purposes. The Scriptures tell us in this case that John was baptizing people as part of repentance and forgiveness of sins, doing his job as "the voice crying in the wilderness" prophesied by the fortieth chapter of Isaiah, preparing people for the coming of the Lord. There is also a Jewish custom using full-immersion washing that is required in order to convert to Judaism.

So we see three elements of Jewish baptism that are familiar to us – repentance, forgiveness and conversion. All three of these elements are retained in Christian baptism. Some may not think too much about repentance and forgiveness or even conversion when a baby is baptized, but these things still happen. Even a newborn infant who has not committed any sins bears the inheritance of the infection of sin from Adam and Eve that needs baptism for cleansing. It is more clear when an adult is baptized, which is always preceded by confession, because adults have committed sins.

But when Jesus is baptizing, He is not merely continuing this Jewish ritual. He is adding something to it. When people are baptized into the Church, they are not only repenting, being forgiven and converting. They are also putting on Christ, as St. Paul says in Galatians 3:27. We sing this verse at baptisms and on days of which catechumens were brought into the church (Christmas, Holy Saturday/Pascha, Pentecost): "Those who have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ."

When someone is baptized, Christ truly comes to dwell in him and His identity begins to work on the newly-illumined baptized person's identity. The image of God in that person can begin to grow that person into the likeness of God. This potential is activated, and we must cultivate it. The union of the divine and human that is Christ's by nature can become ours by grace. We can become human beings in union with God.

But baptism into Christ is not absolute and perfect for all time. As mentioned above, it needs to be cultivated for it to become truly effective. Baptisms are not "magic spells" that guarantee the recipient a place in the resurrection of the righteous at the end of time. Rather, it is a preparation for the synergistic work of man and God that is the spiritual life, which has potential to lead to life everlasting, but only if worked out "with fear and trembling."

So we can put on Christ, but we can also put off Christ. Baptism is only effective for the person who keeps it and nurtures it and helps it grow. And that is part of what Christian baptism retains from Jewish baptism – the characteristic of repentance and the forgiveness of sins. Baptism will only continue to work in us if we continually repent. Baptism is not a one-time event that seals our place in God's kingdom.

FATHER'S LETTER (CONTINUED)

Baptism is the beginning of a journey with Christ to become more like Christ. As we journey, we will notice that sanctification works on what is around us as well. When others see the love of God genuinely in us and through us, then they are also attracted to God's love and may also become filled with that grace, which is His real presence within.

Many of the saints even saw the natural world begin to work differently around



them, no longer by the curse laid when Adam and Eve sinned. Animals became tame. The earth and even water miraculously also provided fertility to it when obstacles were in the way. The harmony sometimes witnessed in creation sparingly can grow to influence much of the world.

And this makes sense because when Christ is baptized in the Jordan, He does so to begin reclaiming all creation again with mankind at the center of it. Christ's love, power, glory and healing flow into the water and from there into the world. It can also flow through us if we open ourselves up to it.

Life can be complicated, confusing, difficult and even tragic. What makes it possible for Orthodox Christians to endure all this and even thrive and progress is knowing that someday, this will all pass away. Someday, the disharmony will again become harmony. All tears will be wiped away. What began in the Jordan river 2,000 years ago will finally be complete and will reach into every place.

Until then, we keep going with hope and love. God has called us not only to endure the suffering of this world, but actually to participate in His sanctification and transformation of it. He calls us to His holiness by means of the purification and operation of holy water. And he calls us to bless those around us with that same holy water. We bless people, the whole world and all of creation. Holy water has the potential to change everything – good and bad.

And the greatest of all the blessings of holy water is that great mystery of holy baptism, which was given to us so many centuries ago but remains just as new today for all who come and receive its cleansing power.

May we cultivate a life of holiness, brothers and sisters, with our own repentance, forgiveness and conversion, so that the world may also be sprinkled with these waters, sanctifying ourselves and all of creation.




In gratitude for God's blessings, I commit to Christ and His Church as a Steward of Saint Spyridon with my 2024 Stewardship.



ΘΕΟΦΑΝΕΙΑ: Η ΕΟΡΤΗ ΤΗς ΕΜΦΑΝΙΣΗς ΚΑΙ ΤΩΝ ΤΡΙΩΝ ΠΡΟΣΩΠΩΝ ΤΗς ΑΓΙΑς ΤΡΙΑΔΟς



Η εορτή των Θεοφανείων αποτελεί μια από τις κυριότερες εορτές της Ορθόδοξης παράδοσής μας. Δεν πρόκειται μόνον για την ανάμνηση ενός σημαντικού γεγονότος της επίγειας ζωής του Χριστού. Η ουσία της εορτής που πλησιάζει αποκαλύπτεται στην ίδια την ονομασία τους: Θεοφάνεια, δηλ. αποκάλυψη, εμφάνιση Θεού.

Βεβαίως, κάθε σελίδα της Παλαιάς και της Καινής Διαθήκης αποκαλύπτει την ύπαρξη του Θεού. Ειδικά, όμως, στην εορτή του Βαπτίσματος του Χριστού στον Ιορδάνη, η Εκκλησία μας έδωσε αποκλειστικά αυτόν τον χαρακτηρισμό, καθώς έχουμε εμφάνιση και των τριών προσώπων της Αγίας Τριάδος: Του Πατρός, που επιβεβαιώνει με τη φωνή Του τη σχέση Του με τον Χριστό, του Υιού, που βαπτίζεται, και του Αγίου Πνεύματος, που ίπταται "εν είδει περιστεράς".

Ο Θεός της πίστης μας είναι Θεός αγάπης και ενότητας. Το μυστήριο της Αγίας Τριάδος παραμένει παντελώς απρόσιτο στον ανθρώπινο νου, αξιωνόμαστε όμως την ημέρα αυτή, έστω και αμυδρά, να γίνουμε μάρτυρες αποκάλυψης της σχέσης των τριών προσώπων της Αγίας Τριάδος. Η σχέση αυτή δεν μπορεί να περιγραφεί με λόγια, γι΄ αυτό και η Εκκλησία μας επιστρατεύει την λατρευτική της τέχνη, με αποκορύφωμα τον υπέροχη εικόνα της Αγίας Τριάδος, ιστορημένη από τον Αντρέι Ρουμπλιώφ. Εκεί, με τρόπο λιτό και μεγαλειώδη, αναδεικνύεται η απόλυτη ταύτιση, η απόλυτη διάκριση και η απόλυτη ισοτιμία ανάμεσα στα τρία Πρόσωπα της Τριάδος.

Στα Θεοφάνεια της ημέρας εκείνης, η ανθρώπινη φύση δεν βρέθηκε μόνον παρατηρητής. Ο Χριστός μας, ενδεδυμένος την ανθρώπινη φύση, την κάνει συμμέτοχο αυτού του μυστηρίου και την φέρνει ξανά σε άμεση επαφή, όχι μόνον με τον Αίτιο αλλά και με τον φυσικό τρόπο της ύπαρξής της. Με άλλα λόγια, η αποκάλυψη του Τριαδικού Θεού της αγάπης αποκαλύπτει το κεντρικό νόημα και σκοπό της ζωής μας, που δεν είναι άλλο από την αγάπη και την ενότητα.

Οι δύο αυτές λέξεις, αποτελούν, χωρίς αμφιβολία, όραμα και διακαή πόθο όλων των ανθρώπων, όλων των εποχών. Η ανθρώπινη ιστορία όμως έδειξε πως, όσο η ανθρώπινη φύση παραμένει αποξενωμένη από τον Θεό της Αγάπης και μοιραία εγκλωβισμένη στην φθορά, το όραμα αυτό αποτελεί μια τραγική ουτοπία. Αντίθετα, η Εκκλησία του Χριστού, με περισσότερο ρεαλισμό από κάθε κοσμική ιδεολογία, αναγνωρίζει την αδυναμία της ανθρώπινης φύσης να ανακαλύψει την αγάπη μέσα σ΄ αυτόν τον κόσμο. Καλεί, λοιπόν, τον άνθρωπο να στραφεί προς την Πηγή της και να την δεχτεί ως Θείο μυστήριο και Θεία δωρεά.

Μπορεί η αγάπη να αποτελεί αόρατο μυστήριο, τα έργα της όμως είναι ορατά, ιδίως σε εποχές σαν τη δική μας. Δεν είναι διόλου τυχαίο πως, μέσα σε ένα γενικευμένο κλίμα αποσύνθεσης, ατομικισμού και απαξίωσης συλλογικών οραματισμών, η Εκκλησία διατηρεί την συνοχή της πίστης της, αλλά και τις πνευματικές προϋποθέσεις να προσφέρει με αμείωτη ένταση το πολύτιμο ανθρωπιστικό της έργο. Όσο οι κοινωνικές δομές καταρρέουν, τόσο η προσφορά εκ μέρους των μελών της, όχι μόνον σε είδη πρώτης ανάγκης, αλλά κυρίως σε δυνάμεις σωματικές και ψυχικές, αυξάνει. Είναι όμως σημαντικό, η δράση της να αναδειχθεί σε όλες της τις διαστάσεις: Η Εκκλησία δεν δρα απλώς ως ένας φιλανθρωπικός οργανισμός. Πολύ ευρύτερα, οραματίζεται μια ανθρώπινη κοινωνία, στην οποία τα οράματα για αλληλεγγύη και δικαιοσύνη θα παραμένουν ζωντανά. Συγχρόνως, δίνει μαρτυρία έμπρακτη πως η πίστη στον Θεό της αγάπης και η υποδοχή της Χάρης Του οδηγεί σε έργα χειροπιαστά, που δίνουν λύσεις σε προβλήματα και αδιέξοδα, που πληγώνουν την σημερινή ανθρωπότητα.

Στις εορταστικές ημέρες, που προηγήθηκαν, γίναμε μάρτυρες μαζικής συμμετοχής συνανθρώπων μας, τόσο στη λατρεία, όσο και στις δράσεις της Εκκλησίας. Και μάλιστα, η συμμετοχή αυτή χαρακτηρίστηκε από βαθιά πνευματική διάθεση και πρωτόγνωρο ζήλο. Το γεγονός αυτό, αλλά και οι ευρύτερες περιστάσεις, μπορούν να αποβούν καθοριστικές για το μέλλον μας, αρκεί να αποτελέσει συνείδηση για τον καθένα μας ξεχωριστά πως η έξοδος από την κρίση και τις συνέπειές της θα βασιστεί τελικά στην πνευματική μας ανακαίνιση, την ψυχική μας εξισορρόπηση και στην νοηματοδότηση των έργων μας.

Τώρα , που τα ερωτήματα ανακύπτουν επιτακτικά για το «πού πάμε», ως άνθρωποι και ως κοινωνία, αποτελεί χρέος απέναντι στους εαυτούς μας και τους συνανθρώπους μας να ανακαλύψουμε όλες τις διαστάσεις της Ορθόδοξης Εκκλησιαστικής μας συνείδησης και να δώσουμε στον κόσμο την ευκαιρία να τις γευτεί, μέσα από το προσωπικό μας παράδειγμα σε πνευματικότητα και έργα.

Ύψιστο όμως χρέος μας, επιτακτικό για τους καιρούς μας και λυτρωτικό για όλους, αποτελεί η διατήρηση της ενότητας και της αγάπης και η αποκάλυψη του μυστηρίου των Θεοφανείων στην προσωπική, αλλά και στην Εκκλησιαστική μας ζωή.

ΟΙ ΑΓΙΟΙ ΑΘΑΝΑΣΙΟΣ ΚΑΙ ΚΥΡΙΛΛΟΣ

Στις 18 Ιανουαφίου η Εκκλησία εοφτάζει και τιμά την ιεφή μνήμη δυο μεγάλων ιεφαφχών και οικουμενικών διδασκάλων, του αγίου Αθανασίου και του αγίου Κυφίλλου. Και οι δύο υπήφξαν αφχιεπίσκοποι Αλεξανδφείας.

Κι οι δυο, πρώτα ο άγιος Αθανάσιος κι ύστερα ο άγιος Κύριλλος, υπήρξαν από τους μεγάλους αγωνιστές κατά των αιρέσεων και πρόμαχοι της Ορθοδοξίας. Η Εκκλησία τους εορτάζει χωριστά. Τον Άγιο Αθανάσιο στις 2 Μαΐου και τον άγιο Κύριλλο στις 9 Ιουνίου. Αλλά τους εορτάζει και τους δύο μαζί σήμερα.

Απέχουν 80 χρόνια επιγείου ζωής ο ένας από τον άλλο. Ο Άγιος Κύριλλος γεννήθηκε δυο χρόνια μετά το θάνατο του αγίου Αθανασίου.

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Και οι δυο με το πέρασμά τους από το θρόνο της Αλεξάνδρειας σφράγιζαν την ιστορία και τη ζωή της Εκκλησίας.

Ο άγιος Αθανάσιος γεννήθηκε στην Αλεξάνδρεια το έτος 295. Οι γονείς τους ήσαν Χριστιανοί. Μετά τις σπουδές του, έφυγε στην έρημος κι εκεί ασκήθηκε στην αρετή. Τότε γνώρισε και τον άγιο Αντώνιο, του οποίου αργότερα έγραψε το βίο.

Όταν γύρισε από την έρημο, ο αρχιεπίσκοπος της Αλεξάνδρειας Αλέξανδρος τον χειροτόνησε διάκονο και τον πήρε μαζί του. Τότε φάνηκε η μεγάλη αίρεση του Αρείου. Ο Άγιος Αθανάσιος στάθηκε άξιος και ικανός βοηθός του αρχιεπισκόπου. Όταν το έτος 325 έγινε η πρώτη οικουμενική Σύνοδος στην Κωνσταντινούπολη, ο άγιος ήταν μαζί με τον αρχιεπίσκοπο Αλέξανδρο, αν και ήταν ακόμα διάκονος, εν τούτοις υπήρξε ο στύλος της Συνόδου. Η νίκη της Εκκλησίας εναντίον του Αρείου ήταν κυρίως νίκη του Αγίου Αθανασίου.

Το έτος 326 ο άγιος διαδέχθηκε τον Αλέξανδοο στο θρόνο της Αλεξάνδρειας, αλλά οι αρειανοί, που ήσαν πολλοί και επηρέαζαν ακόμα και τον αυτοκράτορα, δυσκόλεψαν πολύ το έργο του.

Κατόρθωσαν και συγκάλεσαν τοπικές Συνόδους και καθαίρεσαν δύο φορές τον άγιο Αθανάσιο. Σχεδόν σαράντα χρόνια τα πέρασε στην εξορία. Και το 366 γύρισε οριστικά στο ποίμνιό του και εκοιμήθει το 373 σε ηλικία 78 ετών. Παρόλο που έζησε τόσα χρόνια εξόριστος από τόπο σε τόπο, έγραψε και μας άφησε σπουδαία θεολογικά συγγράμματα του, που είναι η βάση της ορθόδοξης θεολογίας.

Ο Άγιος Γρηγόριος ο θεολόγος, αρχίζοντας το λόγο του στον άγιο Αθανάσιο, λέγει«Αθανάσιον επαινών, την

αφετήν επαινέσομεν». Ταυτίζει δηλαδή τον άγιο με την αφετή.

Το έτος 375, δηλ. δυο χρόνια μετά το θάνατο του αγίου Αθανασίου, γεννήθηκε ο άγιος Κύριλλος. Ήταν ανηψιός του αρχιεπισκόπου Αλεξανδρείας Θεοφίλου. Στην αρχή υπηρέτησε ως διάκονος κοντά στο θείο του. Και μετά το θάνατο του θείου του ο άγιος Κύριλλος έγινε αρχιεπίσκοπος Αλεξανδρείας. Είναι και αυτός από τους μεγάλους Πατέρες της Εκκλησίας και οικουμενικός διδάσκαλος. Στα 32 χρόνια της αρχιερατείας του, μέχρι το 444 που πέθανε, εργάστηκε πολύ για να ξεκαθαρίσει την Εκκλησία της Αλεξάνδρειας από τις αιρέσεις. Υπήρξε ο αρχηγός στην Τρίτη οικουμενική Σύνοδο που έγινε το 431 στην

Έφεσο, που κατεδίκασε το Νεστόριο.

Η Τοίτη Οικουμενική Σύνοδος εδογμάτισε και ομολόγησε, ότι η αγία Παοθένος είναι Θεοτόκος.

Αφησε ο άγιος Κύοιλλος σπουδαία θεολογικά συγγράμματα, ερμηνευτικά, και θεολογικά, που είναι πολύτιμη πηγή για τη σπουδή της ορθόδοξης Θεολογίας.

Το «Θεοτόκος» είναι η λέξη κλειδί της Ορθοδοξίας. Απ΄ όλα τα ονόματα, με τα οποία η Εκκλησία εκόσμησε την Παναγία, το Θεοτόκος εκφράζει τέλεια το μυστήριο της σάρκωσης του Θείου Λόγου. Η Παρθένος Μαρία γέννησε το Θεό, που έγινε άνθρωπος. Ο Άγιος Κύριλλος διδάσκει «Ει γαρ εστί Θεός ο Κύριος ημών Ιησούς Χριστός, πώς ου Θεοτόκος η αγία Παρθένος»; Αφού ο Κύριος ημών Ιησούς Χριστός είναι Θεός, πώς η αγία Παρθένος που τον γέννησε δεν είναι Θεοτόκος; Ο Άγιος Αθανάσιος και ο Άγιος Κύριλλος, όπως

Ο Άγιος Αθανάσιος και ο Άγιος Κύριλλος, όπως είπαμε είναι και οι δύο Αλεξανδρινοί και μεγάλοι πρόμαχοι της Ορθοδοξίας. Αυτός είναι και ο λόγος που η Εκκλησία μας τους εορτάζει μαζί. Ο ένας στην πρώτη κι ο άλλος στην τρίτη Οικουμενική Σύνοδο πρωτοστάτησαν. Ο ένας εναντίον του Αρείου και ο άλλος εναντίον του Νεστορίου, που και οι δυό αρνιούνται τη θεότητα του Ιησού Χριστού. Ο Άρειος έλεγε ότι ο Υιός δεν είναι γέννημα, αλλά κτίσμα του Θεού και ο Νεστόριος έλεγε ότι η Παρθένος Μαρία δεν είναι Θεοτόκος, αλλά Χριστοτόκος.

Οι άγιοι όμως κατετοώπωσαν τους υπεναντίους. Πολύ σωστά το τροπάριο των δυό μεγάλων πατέρων και οικουμενικών διδασκάλων λέγει® «έργοις λάμψαντες ορθοδοξίας, πάσαν σβέσαντες κακοδοξίαν, νικηταί τροπαιοφόροι γεγόνανε... ταις των πρεσβείαις ο Θεός ελέησον και σώσον ημάς.
