

FATHER'S MESSAGE

HEALING THE BODY OF CHRIST FROM THE POISON OF GOSSIP, NEGATIVITY AND DIVISION:

In every community, words have the power to build up or tear down. This truth is especially significant in the Church, the Body of Christ, where unity is essential for spiritual growth and the fulfillment of God's mission in the world. Gossip, negativity, and hurtful speech, especially when these are allowed to spread within the Church, act as a poison that not only harms relationships within a parish, but it also undermines the integrity and witness of the Christian community.

The Book of Acts, while primarily focused on the early days of the Church and the apostles' missionary work, also addresses the destructive potential of divisive behavior. In Acts 20:29-30, the Apostle Paul warns:

"I know that after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; and from among your own selves will arise men speaking twisted things, to draw away the disciples after them." (Acts 20:29-30)

This warning about "wolves" infiltrating the flock is not only a warning about false teachings but also about the dangers of divisive behavior that originates from within the community itself. The Apostle Paul highlights the internal threats to the Church: those who seek to lead others astray, often through the spread of malicious gossip or sinful attitudes.

Gossip and negativity can take root when people begin to speak ill of others behind their backs, criticize the leadership, or sow doubt and discord among the faithful. The Apostle James gives a clear admonition against the misuse of speech in James 3:5-6:

"So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great things. How great a forest is set ablaze by such a small fire! And the tongue is a fire, a world of unrighteousness. The tongue is set among our members, staining the whole body, setting on fire the entire course of life, and set on fire by hell." (James 3:5-6)

Here, Saint James compares the tongue to a small spark that can ignite a vast fire. A single word or comment, especially when spoken with ill intent, can spread and cause lasting damage to relationships and unity within the Church.

The Fathers of the Church on Gossip and Sinful Speech

The Fathers of the Church were deeply concerned about the destructive power of gossip and slander. St. John Chrysostom, one of the most influential Fathers of the Church, offers a strong warning about the impact of harmful speech within the community:

"A man who speaks ill of others is worse than a thief. The thief only robs a person of temporal goods, but a slanderer robs the soul of a person." (Homily 7 on Ephesians)

St. Chrysostom's words highlight that the damage caused by gossip and slander is not merely temporal but eternal, as it corrupts the soul and destroys the unity of the Church. He emphasizes that those who gossip not only harm others but also wound their own spiritual well-being, for they participate in the sin of division and discord.

St. Gregory the Great, in his *Morals on the Book of Job*, also speaks to the spiritual dangers of negative speech:

"He who engages in gossip and false accusations is one who wounds the soul. His words become a source of bitterness that lingers in the hearts of those who hear them."

This reflection reinforces the idea that gossip is not a trivial matter but a profound spiritual sickness. It spreads bitterness and poison within the community, leading to division, distrust, and sorrow.

The Spiritual Harm of Gossip and Negative Speech

The spread of gossip, negativity, and sin within the Church not only disrupts the peace of the

community but also hinders the spiritual growth of all involved. The Church is called to be a place of healing, where believers come together in Christ to grow in holiness, love, and mutual respect. Gossip and divisive speech create an atmosphere of suspicion and distrust, making it difficult for the faithful to experience the unity that Christ desires for His Church.

The Apostle Paul gives a clear exhortation in Ephesians 4:29:

"Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear." (Ephesians 4:29)

Rather than tearing others down with our words, we are called to use speech that encourages and strengthens the faith of those around us. The destructive nature of gossip can never be overstated, for it not only damages relationships but also hinders the work of God in the Church.

St. Basil the Great, in his *Homily on the Holy Spirit*, writes:

"When one sows discord in the Church, they are working against the Holy Spirit, who is the source of the unity of the faithful. The Holy Spirit seeks to unite, but the one who speaks evil seeks to divide." This teaching emphasizes that divisive speech is not merely a human sin—it is a direct opposition to the unity that the Holy Spirit seeks to foster in the Church. In the Orthodox view, the Church is the Temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 3:16), and anything that causes division within the community threatens to undermine this sacred presence.

How Should We Handle Those Who Poison the Church?

When faced with individuals who poison the Church with gossip, negativity, or sinful behavior, the Orthodox Christian response is one of correction, love, and, when necessary, discipline. The goal is always to restore the person to the faith, heal the damage done to

the community, and preserve the unity of the Church.

St. John Chrysostom, in his *Homily on Ephesians*, writes:

"If you see your brother sin, do not speak ill of him, but approach him with kindness. Correct him, pray for him, and help him to return to the right path. For the restoration of a soul is a greater joy than the destruction of evil."

This teaching reflects the importance of offering correction in a spirit of love and compassion. The process of correction is meant to be carried out with humility and a desire for restoration. Instead of gossiping about someone's wrongdoing, we are called to address the issue directly with the person, offering the opportunity for repentance and reconciliation. When this happens, peace can be restored and it ensures that the unity of the Church is maintained.

Gossip, negativity, and sinful speech are among the most dangerous threats to the unity of the Church. These behaviors poison relationships, sow division, and hinder the spiritual growth of the faithful. The Fathers of the Church and the Scriptures make it clear that such actions are not merely trivial offenses but serious sins that disrupt the peace and unity that Christ desires for His Body.

As Orthodox Christians, we must strive to guard our speech, cultivating words that edify, encourage, and build up the community. When we encounter those who cause division through harmful words or actions, we must respond with correction, love, and humility, caring for the soul of those who fall and always with the goal of reconciliation and restoration.

Let us remember the teachings of the Fathers and the wisdom of Scripture, seeking to preserve the unity of the Church, which is the foundation of our faith and the path to our salvation.

Τα έργα αυτά θα περιλαμβάνουν αποκατάσταση όλων των δαπέδων Terrazzo, αποκατάσταση όλων των στασίων, τοποθέτηση καινούριων καγγέλων στη σόλεα, τοποθέτηση βρόχου ακοής, και τέλος τοποθέτηση νέου χαλιού.

Greetings, I wish you all a good month of February filled with love, health, and happiness.

I am excited to announce that on January 7, 2025 the St. Spyridon Parish Council voted to begin a Church Beautification Project. We hope that all of you will join us for a Special Parish Assembly on February 2, 2025, right after liturgy, to hear about these projects

Our beloved St. Spyridon Hellenic Orthodox Church was built in 1986, and was consecrated in 1996 by Metropolitan Iakovos, of blessed memory. The stewards that built the church worked tirelessly as one UNITED team, offering their time, talent, and treasure, and in the process sacrificed everything to build the church that we are privileged to stand and worship in today. To honor our St. Spyridon the Wonderworker, and the memory of those dedicated stewards, we are committed to restore the church, to preserve and safeguard it for the next generation.

All of this began with an amazing blessing of a \$12,000 grant from the Hellenic Foundation to install a hearing loop, which transmits sound directly into hearing aids, significantly enhancing the listening experience of our parishioners with hearing aids. The Hellenic Foundation has graciously provided this technology to several Hellenic Orthodox churches within our Metropolis.

When we humbly accepted the Hellenic Foundation grant, we recognized that we would have to replace the carpet, which is 18 years old, since the hearing loop must be installed under the carpet. The Parish Council voted to proceed with the hearing loop installation and carpet replacement.

In further examining our beloved parish's flooring, we realized the terrazzo floors had settlement cracks, significant wear and tear, and erosion from winter salts and other elements, especially in the church narthex, but also under the pews, on the solea, and in the altar. All of the floors, which have not been refinished since their installation in 1986, are in dire need of repair, which if not addressed, would be at risk of failing and needing to be replaced at cost of at least 5 times the restoration cost. The Parish Council prudently voted to proceed with the floor restoration.

Since the floor restoration project would require the removal of the wooden pews, which are also in need of restoration, **the Parish Council voted to refinish them as well**. We will also repair the kneeling benches and any components that need to be addressed.

And finally, and perhaps most importantly, many of our stewards have asked for accessibility railings to be installed on the solea steps to

provide safer access to the solea, particularly during Holy Communion. Upon assessment of the radiant heating location, the Parish Council approved moving forward with church railing project as well.

The total cost of the project is \$103,000. To date we have received approximately \$68,000 in donations, with the current net difference of \$35,000 to be funded by the Church Building Fund.

We are blessed to have all of you helping our beloved St. Spyridon Hellenic Orthodox Church in every way that you do.

All of these projects are for **St. Spyridon the Wonderworker**, and our **St. Spyridon Hellenic Orthodox Church** should be completed within 4 to 6 weeks. We humbly ask for your patience during this time.



Την Κυριακή 9 Φεβρουαρίου, του Τελώνου και Φαρισαίου, ξεκινά φέτος το Τριώδιο.

Τριώδιο: Ἡ περίοδος τοῦ Τριωδίου ἀποτελεῖ τὸ κινητὸ ἐκεῖνο τμῆμα τοῦ ἐκκλησιαστικοῦ ἔτους πού προπαρασκευάζει τὸν πιστὸ γιά τὸν ἄξιο ἑορτασμὸ τῶν Παθῶν καὶ τῆς Ἀναστάσεως μὲ ἀνάλογα βιώματα, πνευματική καλλιέργεια καὶ συμμετοχή, μὲ ἀγῶνα μετανοίας, προσευχῆς καὶ νηστείας.

Ἡ περίοδος τοῦ Τριωδίου εἶναι ἕνα στάδιο «προετοιμασίας» γιά τὴν νηστεία τῆς Μεγάλης Τεσσαρακοστής καὶ ξεκινᾶ ἀπὸ τὴν Κυριακή τοῦ «Τελώνου καὶ Φαρισαίου» καὶ τελειώνει τήν Ε' Κυριακή τῶν Νηστειῶν.

Τὸ Τριώδιο εἶναι ἕνα ἀπὸ τὰ λειτουργικὰ βιβλία τῆς

Έκκλησίας. Στό βιβλίο αὐτὸ περιέχονται σχεδον κάθε μέρα ύμνοι, που λέγονται Τριώδια, υμνοι δηλαδή μὲ τρεῖς ἀδές. Οἱ ὕμνοι αὐτοὶ γενικὰ λέγονται Κανόνες.

Οί Κανόνες, στήν ἄρτια μορφή τους καὶ αντίθετα πρὸς τὰ Τριώδια, ἀποτελοῦνται ἀπὸ ἐννέα ὠδές. Οἱ ὠδές, εἶναι ὁμάδες ἀπὸ τέσσερα ώς πέντε ἢ καὶ περισσότερα τροπάρια, ποὺ ψάλλονται ὅλα μὲ τὸν ἴδιο τρόπο. Ἐνῶ λοιπὸν οἱ Κανόνες εἶναι ὕμνοι μὲ ἐννέα ώδές, τὰ Τριώδια εἶναι μικρότεροι ὕμνοι

μὲ τρεῖς μόνο ἀδές. Ἀπὸ τὰ Τριώδια λοιπὸν αὐτά, λέγεται καὶ τὸ βιβλίο Τριώδιο.

Τοιώδιο λέγεται καὶ ἡ ἐκκλησιαστικὴ πεοίοδος ἀπὸ τήν Κυριακή τοῦ Τελώνου καί Φαρισαίου ώς τὸ Πάσχα, ἐπειδὴ ὅλο αὐτὸ τὸ χρονικὸ διάστημα, εἶναι σὲ χρήση τὸ λειτουργικὸ βιβλίο τοῦ Τριωδίου.

Περιλαμβάνει, τίς τέσσερις έβδομάδες πρίν ἀπὸ τή Μεγάλη Τεσσαρακοστή, τίς πέντε έβδομάδες τῆς Μεγάλης Τεσσαρακοστῆς ὡς τὸ Σάββατο τοῦ Λαζάρου, καὶ τή Μεγάλη Ἑβδομάδα.

Τὴν δεύτερη έβδομάδα γίνεται «καταλύση εἰς πάντα», όλες τίς ήμέρες ἐκτὸς τῆς Τετάρτης καὶ Παρασκευῆς. Τὴν τρίτη ἑβδομάδα, τῆς Τυροφάγου ἢ Τυρινῆς γίνεται δλες τίς ἡμέρες καταλύση σὲ ὅλα τὰ γαλακτοκομικὰ προϊόντα, τοῦ αὐγοῦ, τῶν ψαριῶν καὶ φυσικὰ τοῦ έλαιολάδου, ἀπαγορεύεται ὅμως ἡ κρεοφαγία.

Κυριακή τοῦ Τελώνη καὶ τοῦ Φαρισαίου:

Ή ἐκκλησία θέλει νά μᾶς ἐμπνεύσει τὴν ταπείνωση τοῦ Πηγή: https://www.vimaorthodoxias.gr/ Τελώνη καὶ νά μᾶς προφυλάξει ἀπὸ τὴν ὑπερηφάνεια

τοῦ Φαρισαίου. Ὁ Κύριος διδάσκει: πᾶς ὁ ὑψῶν ἑαυτόν ταπεινωθήσεται, ὁ δέ ταπεινῶν ἑαυτόν ὑψωθήσεται.

Κυριακή τοῦ Ἀσώτου:

Τρία πράγματα διδάσκει ή παραβολή:

- α) τὴν ἄθλια καταστάση τοῦ ἁμαρτωλοῦ
- β) τὴν ἀξία τῆς μετανοίας καὶ
- γ) τὸ μεγαλεῖο τῆς συγχωρέσεως.

Τὸ Σάββατο ποιν τὴν τοίτη Κυριακὴ ὀνομάζεται Ψυχοσάββατο ἢ Σάββατο τῶν Ψυχῶν. Καθιερώθηκε ἀπὸ τὴν ἐκκλησία ὡς ἡμέρα πού προσφέρουμε κόλλυβα καὶ προσευχόμαστε γιά ὅλους αὐτούς πού γιά

> διαφόρους λόγους δέν μνημονεύονται σὲ μνημόσυνα: γιά παράδειγμα ἄνθρωποι πού δέν έχουν ἐν ζωῆ κανένα συγγενῆ.

Κυριακή τῆς Ἀπόκρεω:

Λέγεται ἔτσι διότι μετὰ τὴν Κυριακὴ αὐτὴ ἀπέχουμε ἀπὸ τὸ κοέας. Τή μέρα αὐτή ἡ Ἐκκλησία μας, φέρνει στή μνήμη μας τήν φοβερή Δευτέρα Παρουσία τοῦ Κυρίου.

Κυριακή τῆς Τυρινῆς:

Λέγεται ἔτσι διότι μετὰ τή μέρα αὐτή καθώς καὶ τὴν ἑβδομάδα πού

προηγεῖται καταλύουμε τυριὰ καὶ ἄλλα γαλακτώδη.

Τὸ Εὐαγγέλιο τῆς μέρας αὐτῆς παροτρύνει τοὺς πιστούς νά συγχωρήσουν αὐτούς πού τοὺς ἔφταιξαν ώστε νά τοὺς συγχωρήσει καὶ ὁ Θεός. Ἡ νηστεία νά μὴ γίνεται ἀφορμὴ ἐπιδείξης ὅπως ἔκαναν οἱ Φαρισαῖοι καὶ νά διάγουν βίο ἐνάρετο καὶ ἐλεήμονα. Τή μέρα αὐτή ἡ ἐκκλησία, μᾶς θυμίζει τὴν ἐξορία τοῦ Ἀδὰμ ἀπὸ τὸν Παράδεισο.

Ή ίερη ύμνολογία, ή βυζαντινή ψαλμωδία, καὶ ή θεία λατρεία γενικά τῆς Ἐκκλησίας, μαζὶ μὲ τὴν ἀναγνώση τῶν Γραφῶν καὶ τὸ θεῖο κήρυγμα εἶναι τὰ ἱερὰ γράμματα καὶ ἡ παιδεία τῶν ὀρθοδόξων. Γιά μᾶς τοὺς Έλληνες εἶναι καὶ ἡ ἐθνικὴ μας γλῶσσα, γιατὶ ὅλα αὐτὰ εἶναι γραμμένα στά Ἑλληνικά,ὅπως καὶ ἡ Ἁγία Γραφή καὶ οἱ ἱερὲς Ἀκολουθίες.

Όλη ή περίοδος τοῦ Τριωδίου γιά τοὺς ὀρθοδόξους χριστιανούς εἶναι καιρὸς μετανοίας, προσευχῆς καὶ νηστείας. Γι' αὐτὸ κι ἀπὸ τή μέρα ποὺ ἀνοίγει τὸ Τριώδιο, ό κάθε πιστὸς προσεύχεται κατανυκτικά καὶ ψάλλει· «τῆς μετα-νοίας ἄνοιξόν μοι πύλας, Ζωοδότα...».

ΑΓΙΑ ΦΙΛΟΘΕΗ Η ΑΘΗΝΑΙΑ

Νεανικά χρόνια:

Η Αγία Φίλοθέη γεννήθηκε το έτος 1522 μ.Χ. στην τουρκοκρατούμενη τότε Αθήνα. Ήταν κόρη αθηναϊκής αρχοντικής οικογένειας γαιοκτημόνων, του Άγγελου Μπενιζέλου και της Σηρίγης Παλαιολογίνας και το κοσμικό της όνομα ήταν Ρηγούλα ή Ρεβούλα (Παρασκευούλα) Μπενιζέλου. Η μητέρα της ήταν στείρα και απέκτησε την Αγία μετά από θερμή και συνεχή προσευχή. Καθώς η Ρηγούλα μεγάλωνε, διακρινόταν για το ήθος και την ευφυΐα της. Έλαβε μόρφωση εξαιρετική, κάτι σπάνιο για κορίτσι της εποχής της.

Σε ηλικία 14 χρονών, οι γονείς της την πάντρεψαν, παρά τη θέλησή της, με τον κατά πολύ μεγαλύτερό της Ανδρέα Χειλά, έναν από τους άρχοντες της Αθήνας. Ο γάμος διήρκεσε μόνο τρία χρόνια. Στα 17 της χρόνια η Ρεβούλα έμεινε χήρα. Η ομορφιά της, τα πλούτη της, η ευγενική της καταγωγή, η μόρφωσή της την καθιστούσαν περιζήτητη νύφη που διεκδικούσαν οι σημαντικότερες οικογένειες της Αθήνας και όχι μόνο. Οι γονείς της την πίεζαν έντονα να συνάψει δεύτερο γάμο, όμως αυτή τη φορά η Ρεβούλα δεν εισάκουσε την επιθυμία τους. Επιδόθηκε σε σπουδαίο φιλανθρωπικό και κοινωνικό

έργο και δέκα χρόνια μετά το θάνατο των γονιών της γίνεται μοναχή με το όνομα Φιλοθέη.

Το έργο της:

Το 1571 ξεκίνησε να πραγματοποιεί την ανακαίνιση του ναΐσκου του Αγίου Ανδρέα, ο οποίος βρισκόταν στον περίβολο του πατρικού της αρχοντικού, μετατρέποντάς τον σε κοινόβιο.

Υστερα από εντολή του Αγίου Ανδρέα του Πρωτόκλητου, τον οποίο είδε σε όραμα, οικοδόμησε ένα γυναικείο μοναστήρι με αρκετά κελιά, στο οποίο και έδωσε το όνομα του Αγίου για να τον τιμήσει. Εκεί μόνασε ως ηγουμένη της αδελφότητας μαζί με κόρες εύπορων οικογενειών, αλλά και εκχριστιανισμένες μουσουλμάνες και κατατρεγμένες Κύπριες. Ακόμα και οι γυναίκες που ήταν στην υπηρεσία της οικογένειάς της ακολούθησαν το παράδειγμά της, αγωνιζόμενες στην άσκηση και την αρετή. Σε λίγο διάστημα, η μονή έφθασε να έχει διακόσιες αδελφές. Η μονή της Οσίας Φιλοθέης γίνεται ένα πραγματικό λιμάνι, στο οποίο βρίσκουν προστασία οι ταλαιπωρημένοι από τη σκλαβιά, θεραπεία οι άρρωστοι, τροφή οι πεινασμένοι, στήριγμα οι γέροντες και στοργή τα ορφανά.

Στο φιλανθρωπικό, κοινωνικό, εκπαιδευτικό και εθνικό έργο της η Αγία Φιλοθέη αφιέρωσε ολόκληρη την πατρική και προσωπική της περιουσία. Η Οσία, παρά τις αντιδράσεις των Τούρκων ιδρύει σχολεία, βιοτεχνικά και χειροτεχνικά εργαστήρια, νοσοκομεία, ξενοδοχεία, ορφανοτροφεία, «σχολεία διὰ τοὺς παίδας τῶν Ἀθηναίων, διὰ ν' ἀνοίξη τοὺς ὀφθαλμοὺς αὐτῶν πρὸς τὴν παράδοσιν καὶ τὴν δόξαν τῶν προγόνων των».

Βασική επιδίωξη της αγίας Φιλοθέης ήταν η τόνωση του ορθοδόξου ιδεώδους και η διατήρηση της ελληνικής συνείδησης. Το έργο της, κατά βάση εθνικό και θρησκευτικό, ξεπέρασε τα όρια της Αθήνας και έγινε γνωστό σε όλη την Ελλάδα.

Η όλη όμως δράση της Αγίας Φιλοθέης εξαγρίωσε τους

Τούρκους. Κάποια στιγμή την συλλαμβάνουν και εκείνη με πνευματική ανδρεία ομολογεί: «Εγώ διψώ να υπομείνω διάφορα είδη βασανιστηρίων για το όνομα του Χριστού, τον οποίο λατρεύω και προσκυνώ με όλη μου την ψυχή και την καρδιά, ως Θεό αληθινό και άνθρωπο τέλειο και θα σας χρωστάω μεγάλη ευγνωμοσύνη αν μπορείτε μια ώρα πρωτύτερα να με στείλετε προς Αυτόν με το στεφάνι του μαρτυρίου». Ύστερα από την ηρωική αυτή απάντηση προς τους κατακτητές, όλοι πίστευαν ότι η πανευτυχής και φερώνυμη Φιλοθέη εντός ολίγου θα ετελειούτο διά του μαρτυρικού θανάτου. Όμως, κατά θεία βούληση, την τελευταία σχεδόν στιγμή πρόφθασαν κάποιοι Χριστιανοί και καταπράυναν τον ηγεμόνα με διάφορους τρόπους. Έτσι πέτυχαν να ελευθερώσουν την Αγία.

Το οσιακό τέλος:

Οι Τούρκοι, όμως, προσπαθούσαν με κάθε τρόπο να ανακόψουν τη δράση της. Έτσι μια νύχτα, στις 2 Οκτωβρίου του έτους 1588 μ.Χ., πήγαν στο μονύδριο που είχε οικοδομήσει στα Πατήσια, την ώρα που η Αγία μαζί με τις άλλες αδελφές βρίσκονταν στον Ιερό Ναό επιτελώντας ολονύκτια αγρυπνία, εορτάζοντας τη μνήμη

του Αγίου Ιερομάρτυρος Διονυσίου του Αρεοπαγίτου και πέντε από αυτούς ανεβαίνοντας στον εξωτερικό τοίχο πήδηξαν μέσα στην αυλή. Στην συνέχεια εισέβαλαν στον ναό, άρπαξαν την Αγία και την μαστίγωσαν με μανία και βαναυσότητα, εγκαταλείποντάς την ημιθανή έξω από τη μονή της. Έξω από το ναό, στα δεξιά της εισόδου

του, σώζεται η κολώνα, όπου η αγία Φιλοθέη δέθηκε και μαστιγώθηκε. Οι μοναχές την μετέφεραν στην κρύπτη της στην Καλογρέζα. Εκεί η Φιλοθέη υπέκυψε στα τραύματά της στις 19 Φεβρουαρίου 1589 μ.Χ. Ενταφιάστηκε στο δεξιό μέρος του Ιερού βήματος του Αγίου Ανδρέα, ενώ αιώνες αργότερα το σκήνωμά της μεταφέρθηκε στη Μητρόπολη Αθηνών, όπου φυλάσσεται σε ασημένια λάρνακα μέχρι σήμερα.

Είκοσι ημέρες μετά από την κοίμηση της Αγίας ο τάφος της ευωδίαζε. Ακόμη, όταν μετά από ένα έτος έγινε η ανακομιδή, το τίμιο λείψανό της βρέθηκε ακέραιο. Επιπλέον ήταν γεμάτο με ευωδιαστό μύρο, τρανή και λαμπρή απόδειξη της θεάρεστης και ενάρετης πολιτείας της, προς δόξα και αίνο του Θεού και καύχημα της πίστεώς μας.

Η Αγιοποίηση:

Η Φιλοθέη ανακηρύχθηκε αγία επί Οικουμενικού Πατριάρχου Ματθαίου Β΄ (1595 – 1600 μ.Χ.). Ο Νεόφυτος ο μητροπολίτης Αθηνών, αφού εξέτασε και ερεύνησε τα κατά τον βίον και το μαρτύριον της οσίας, σύνταξε αναφορά στο Πατριαρχείο μαζί με τους επισκόπους Κορίνθου και Θηβών και με τους προκρίτους της Αθήνας για να τάξει την οσία Φιλοθέη στους χορούς των αγίων. Το Καθολικό του Αγίου Ανδρέα και το πηγάδι της μονής της σώζονται με τη Χάρη του Θεού μέχρι σήμερα στον περίβολο της Αρχιεπισκοπής Αθηνών, πολλά έτη μετά την κοίμηση της Αγίας. Dear Beloved Parishioners of Saint Spyridon,

Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

We hope this letter finds you in good health and high spirits. Recently, the Parish Council approved several maintenance projects to be completed in the Church. We have organized a General Assembly for Sunday, February 2 immediately after the Divine Liturgy to inform our stewards about the plans for these projects.



We would also like to inform you of a recent vacancy on our Parish Council. This position has become available and we are now seeking eligible parishioners who are interested in filling this role and serving the parish community.

In accordance with the governing structure of our parish and as outlined in Article VII - Section 8 of the Parish Council Bylaws, the following procedure will be followed to fill this vacancy:

"A vacancy on the Parish Council, after the Parish Council Officers have been sworn in, shall be filled by the Parish Council in the following manner: All eligible parishioners will be invited to submit their names as nominees no later than one week before the Parish Council meeting, at which the election will be held, and the Parish Council will elect as many as vacancies exist from among them."

Eligibility Criteria:

To be considered for election to the Parish Council, candidates must meet the following criteria:

- 1. <u>Canonical:</u> The nominee must be an active and practicing member of the Orthodox Christian faith.
- 2. <u>Spiritual:</u> The nominee must regularly attend Divine Services and participate in the sacramental life of the Church.
- 3. <u>Financial</u>: The nominee must be in good standing with the financial obligations of the parish, including regular stewardship contributions.

We invite all eligible parishioners who meet these criteria to submit their names as nominees for the vacant position. All nominations must be received no later than one week prior to the Parish Council meeting, at which the election will be held.
