Six outstanding agricultural educators have been selected to receive a share of just over £25,000 to undertake groundbreaking study tours across Lesotho, the USA, Canada, Botswana, and Zambia. Funded by The Farmers Club Charitable Trust (FCCT), these educators will extend their expertise across a diverse range of agricultural themes, enhancing education and innovation in the sector.

The FCCT selection panel, chaired by Mr. Tim Jackson, retired principal of Sparsholt College and University Centre Sparsholt, alongside Farmers Club Chairman Karen Mercer and FCCT Trustees Meryl Ward and Des Lambert, carefully evaluated the applications and agreed to support six visionary projects.

Exploring Global Innovations in Agriculture

Each recipient will embark on a transformative journey, with insights and findings shared through their own teaching platforms and also through the FCCT's social media channels. Final reports and video presentations will be published on the FCCT website, creating a knowledge bank for the wider agricultural community.

 School of Veterinary Medicine, travelling to Canada and the USA to explore successful learning environments for teaching livestock skills.
