Awardees will also benefit from ongoing peer-to-peer networking opportunities through the FCCT Professional Forums.

Additionally, the Snapshot Studies 2025 initiative will offer funding of up to £2,000 for innovative agricultural research projects. Successful applicants will develop practical solutions to challenges within the sector, supported by mentorship from FCCT's Board of Trustees.

IAgrM Farm Management Skills Programme

Further supporting the development of future agricultural leaders, IAgrM offers the Farm Management Skills Programme, an intensive course designed for aspiring and current farm managers. Hosted at Harper Adams University, the programme covers essential topics such as leadership, motivation, financial management, and strategic planning. Participants engage in interactive modules that provide practical skills and knowledge applicable to modern farm management.
