Sandy made packets with appropriate materials for our chapter members to handout to friends, family, and businesses. Barb Parish reported that she would be publishing up-coming events and rides. Barb also questioned whether there was any interest in Chapter flags for our motorcycles. The cost is approximately \$15.00 per flag and American flags are also available. She is diligently researching a new source for out chapter shirts. Various styles may be available, and she will report further details at the next meeting. The date for our Christmas Party and place were also discussed.

Dave introduced our District Director, Bill Smith who enlightened us about next year's District Rally. Lots of fun activities including guided rides, test rides, seminars, vendors, etc. Bill expects the motorcycle raffle tickets for 2020 to be available in May. Bill suggested that individuals RSVP to Don Scantlan, ride coordinator, concerning participation in the "Point to Point Ride". There will be a District ride on Oct.26th. It will be a Sunrise to Sunset ride going from east coast to west coast.

GWRRA MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES

It is my pleasure to provide you with relevant information regarding our various GWRRA membership categories as well a brief history of the Life Member designation which, as you will discover, has evolved over the years. The original Life Member category required you to have 10 continuous years of membership in order to qualify, but in 1994 it was terminated. However, between '94 & '04, GWRRA members who joined prior to '94 but didn't have their 10-year requirement were given an opportunity to 'buy in' and become Life Members. GWRRA 'grandfathered' them in granting them rights to purchase the designation of Life Member at a cost that varied based on their years of continuous membership. Those who became members before '94 & those who were 'grandfathered' in between '94 & '04 now enjoy 'free membership.' Congratulations go out to our Couple of the Year, Jim and Sondra Cuff, who joined GWRRA in 1983 and are, therefore our longest, continuous Life Members.

The year was 2006 when the Life Member category was resurrected and given a different name. It is now called New Life Membership and it has new qualifying requirements. There is no 'buy in' cost as before. In fact, you are automatically awarded the New Life Member designation on your 20th Anniversary of continuous membership. Commencing on your 21st year, an Individual New Life Member pays a nominal annual membership fee of only \$20 per year and a Family New Life Member pays only \$30 per year. Not only is the savings a great incentive to maintain your relationship with GWRRA throughout your lifetime but it also encourages you to enjoy the great sport of motorcycle riding *consistently*. All Life Members and New Life Members who have enjoyed over 20 years of safe riding receive a Griffin Life Member patch and a Life Member pin to proudly display on your vest. Plus, you get a 20% discount on merchandise in *Wing World* magazine, 50% off your registration fee at Wing Ding & reduced rates on Rescue Plus Roadside Assistance. Your New Life Membership is a well-deserved and valuable designation and we congratulate all those in Chapter FL2-O who have achieved this outstanding milestone!

As new members, you join GWRRA and receive an Individual Membership or you join with your family and have a Family Membership. The Individual Membership fee is \$55 for one year, \$105 for two years and \$150 for three years. As you can see, GWRRA has provided an incentive to pay your dues in advance and save up to \$15 when you pay for three years up front. Family Memberships for two or more people in the same household are \$65 for one year, \$125 for two years and \$180 for three years. GWRRA has provided our members with this outstanding opportunity to add more people from your household to your Membership for only an additional \$10 for one year. Again, when you pay for three years, you can save up to \$15 for a Family Membership.

There is also a Subscriber Membership category for those who wish to receive 12 issues of *Wing World* magazine for \$40 per year.

I also want to point out the tremendous benefits of a GWRRA Membership. You receive a monthly subscription to *Wing World* magazine, the opportunity to purchase Rescue Plus Roadside Assistance for your bike, automobile or RV at deep discounts. You receive free Rider Education Training for Florida residents paid for by the Gold Wing Raffle ticket sales and the opportunity to enjoy negotiated 'host hotel' rates at District Conferences and the annual Wing Ding. And one more benefit that is priceless; the benefit of enjoying our time with good friends who eventually become 'family' as we grow in our passion for motorcycle riding together. Our GWRRA slogan of FRIENDS for FUN, SAFETY & KNOWLEDGE says it all!!!


PS: I called the corporate offices and learned that GWRRA is still evolving. Formerly, there was an Associate Family Membership category for families with two or more people in the household who wanted to take advantage of GWRRA and its benefits but did not own a Gold Wing or Valkyrie motorcycle. The Associate Family Membership category is no longer in existence. When we told them that we saw that designation on their website, they thanked us for bringing it to their attention and it will be taken off the site immediately. Plus, they told us that the Life Membership requirements are changing. GWRRA is in the process of sending out letters that will delineate the changes. So, stay tuned!




