RIDE SAFE By Jim Rich

GWRRA stresses all the gear, all the time (ATGATT), but all that safety gear does not protect the rider from being stupid. In addition to proper gear a rider needs to stay within his or her comfort zone in terms of speed, types of road and weather conditions. Watch the road! A rider should constantly be checking the furthest visible point on the horizon, scanning the mirrors to check behind them and being aware of possible threats to either side. A good safety tip is to always assume drivers are going to do something unexpected and/or stupid. Going around a mountain curve to the left, be prepared for the idiot coming the other direction to cross the yellow line. Coming to a stop in traffic, the person behind you may be in the middle of texting his girlfriend so flash your brake lights and be prepared to swerve out of the way. See a car come to a stop at a side street, slow down and watch their wheels for any sign they are going to pull out because they will explain to the officer "I never saw the motorcycle." Nov. 18, visit the Edison Museum and the Ford Museum and ride home after the Rally on Sat. Nov. 20. Sandy Pisano announced that the Spirit Team is planning another Food for Families drive for Thanksgiving. The food drive was a huge success last Christmas when we donated 300 lbs. of food for needy families and another 170 lbs. in the spring. We encourage everyone to join in the effort to give back to our community by bringing non-perishable items and/or toiletries to the Sept., Oct. and Nov. Gatherings. Sandy has a cloth food bag for everyone. You may pick one up at the end of the meeting and fill it with non-perishable food that will go to the House of Hope to help feed and sustain our underprivileged neighbors in Martin and St. Lucie counties. The Spirit Team is also planning another Picnic in the Park. We all had a wonderful time last spring at Jonathan Dickinson Park in Hobe Sound. This year we will go to Timer Powers Park in Indiantown on Sat. Oct. 23. The Chapter Ride Coordinator, John DuBose, will plan the ride and we will all bring our own lunches and enjoy a beautiful setting along the St. Lucie Canal. Sandy also shared some ideas for the annual Holiday party. Jim also said that he took an ARC course in a huge shopping center in Ocala. He said that Dominic & Diane Desiato are excellent instructors. As a retired motor officer, Dominic really knows how to run an Advanced Rider Course and Experienced Rider Course and calls on his years of experience as an instructor for MSF and GWRRA. Jim said that the 90 degree weather was tough but it was a great ARC course! Jim invited Metalflake to give a Tech Talk and he talked about the braking system on the 1800 Gold Wing.

She learned how to identify and help victims of heart attacks, what to do when someone is choking or has an open wound. In order to be current on the Levels Program you will need to do the Medic/First Aid course every two years and the ERC, ARC and TRIKE courses every three years.



FROM THE BACK OF THE BIKE

ZEPHYRHILLS, FLORIDA

The town of Zephyrhills originally established as the village of Abbott in 1888. At the turn of the century, Captain Howard B. Jeffries, a retired Civil War Union officer, bought several thousand acres around Abbott. He wanted to build a community for Civil War Veterans and formed The Zephyrhills Colony Company in 1909. At that time the town residents voted to change the name to Zephyrhills which describes the local topography of rolling hills. Many fresh springs dot the area and the town has become famous for Zephyrhills Spring Water brand now owned by Perrier Company. The water is derived from many area springs, the main one being Crystal Springs. Although it is surrounded by woodland it is a suburb of Tampa. There are lots of parks to visit including Hillsboro State Park and Withlacoochee River Park. Camping, fishing, hiking, and boating are popular activities you can enjoy. In the town there are three museums. The Zephyrhills Train Depot, the Pioneer Museum with many old farm implements and tools, and the Museum of Military History with artifacts from several eras. Zephyrhills is located north of Tampa and northwest of Lakeland. It is about a three hour auto trip from Stuart.



Riding in the Rain

It's that time of year again. Afternoon showers are here. Be prepared! Make sure you pack a rain suit in your bike or bikes if you have more than one. It is easier to put a rain suit in each bike rather than transferring your rain suit around each time you change bikes. There is too much of a chance that you might forget to do so. Alter you riding habits when it is raining. Slow down! Visibility is limited when the rain is hitting you in the face. The water staying on your windshield, face shield and/or glasses is limiting your ability to see as far as needed to avoid obstacles. Increase you following distance. You don't want to have to stop in a hurry and risk sliding on the wet roadway. Remember when you do stop or slow around intersections there is a buildup of oil in the center of the lane that floats to the surface when it rains. This area is extremely slippery especially at the beginning of the rain. If you have to ride on the interstate use the right lane so the high-speed idiots (cars, trucks or motorcycles) can go flying by you. Expect to get splashed as they pass so you are not caught off guard. Ride in the center of the right lane. Thanks to the heavy trucks, the center of the right lane is the highest point with no or less water so that is where you need to be. A two-wheel motorcycle or Trike can hydroplane. Don't let this freak you out if it happens. If it does happen don't go for the brakes. Just roll off the throttle and let your machine settle itself down and regain traction. Remember most Florida rains have a short part of a heavy downpour. It is best to pull into some shelter and wait out the heavy stuff. Your cell phone is a good source to look at the weather Doppler and plan your route accordingly. Sometimes you can go a few miles out of your way and avoid the rain altogether. Expect to get caught in afternoon rains this time of the year and plan and ride accordingly.




