



GWRRA Motorcycle Safety Dynamics: FL2-O Road Captain Notes

Lead bike Alert - Follower Reaction

1. Lead bike communications that will be used on the ride, CB or hand signals discussed in pre-ride meeting. How bikes will be lined up for a safe ride.
2. One new function we will be using for slowing due to hazards: **lead bike will double tap front brake** causes a double flash of the brake signal. Whenever you see a double flash of brake lights ahead of you your reasonable response and automatic response **MUST BE** to duplicate the signal (with a double tap of your own) and then slow down.
3. This accomplishes three things once: it passes along the warning, it insures that your brakes are 'covered', and it adds space between you and the bike ahead just in case you will need it.
4. If it turns out that the treat is not real, nothing has been lost. If, after 10 seconds nothing has happened, you can resume normal spacing and speed.

FROM THE BACK OF THE BIKE

Packing Made Simple



I like to be organized when I travel. It saves time, space and energy to have all the clothes easy to find and grouped according to types. The simplest solution is a set of packing bags/cases. The set pictured is one I have used both for the motorcycle and in suitcases for air or car travel. The largest bag is 16 X 20 inches which I use for jeans, pants, and light jackets. The medium bag is 12 X 17 inches perfect for t-shirts, blouses, scarves, etc. The small square bag 8 X 12 inches is perfect for underwear and nightgowns or pj's and the long bag 6 X 14 inches is just right for socks.

It is so easy to fit them into the GoldWing compartments inside the motorcycle travel bags then remove them to drawers at stops. No need to unpack as everything is neatly folded in each compartment bag. Clear plastic make-up and toiletry cases will make those items easy to see and store.
