Rent to Ride By Jim Rich

Renting is a great option versus towing the bike a long way to ride a specific area or spending days on the bike to get to a destination. Airfare and rental costs are often about the same as travel costs would be to get to a destination and certainly a quicker alternative. Eagle Rider is a great source of rentals and has numerous locations around the country and many Harley Davidson dealers have Eagle Rider or their own rental operation. We've found two alternatives in our rent and ride experiences; a large roll aboard suitcase will hold a saddlebag and a trunk pack with a second roll aboard with the other saddlebag and top pack. You can carry, rent or, as we did, buy a hard case suitcase to transport your helmets. Once at the rental location you pack the bike and leave the suitcases for your return trip. The second alternative is to choose a central location from which to do day rides, requiring only helmets, rain suits and minimal riding clothes. We used that alternative in the Finger Lakes in upstate New York and in Rapid City, South Dakota allowing us to head off in a different direction every day. Besides New York and South Dakota, we've rented in Montana, Colorado, Arizona, California and Hawaii

I would like to explain the logistics of what it takes to set up a Riding Class. First the best way to acquire a Class would be for a Chapter's Director or CSEA to poll the members of their Chapter and determine how many Members are interested in taking a Riding Class and what type of Class they want to take, an ARC or TRC. They would then submit to me an email with the results and a preferred date they would like to attend and at what location. I would prefer a minimum of 6 bikes with a maximum of 12 bikes for each class. (Co-Riders are not factored in the count.) If the Chapter does not have a minimum of 6 bikes I will fill the empty spots with Individual Members I already have on a waiting list or if none, I will advertise the Class on Group Works to fill the empty spots. I then have to check with the specific Riding Range Site to see if the date requested is available. Once the location and the date is secured I will notify the Chapter Director, the CSEA, and all the Individual Members that the Class is scheduled and they are on the list of attendees. The Chapter Director or CSEA would then collect and hold a \$30.00 Deposit Check refundable upon successful completion of the course. I would collect the \$30.00 Deposit Checks from all of the Individual Members who will be attending. If a Member could not attend for a legitimate reason (to be determined on a case by case decision) the Deposit Check would still be returned. The reason for the Deposit Checks is because Range Rental Fees and in some cases Instructor Fees must still be paid regardless of whether or not a Member shows up. If there are any further questions in this area feel free to contact me with your questions.

I have many sources for the safety information I provide in my Newsletter Articles. It is particularly rewarding when I see one of our Members write an article about something that is important to us and worth sharing. Such is the case of an Article I recently read in a FL1-H Chapter Newsletter. The Article was written by Member, Jerry Wells. The following is his Article:

BRAKE FLUID

I was checking my motorcycle over and noticed the DOT 4 on the cover of my brake reservoir. I wondered what does that mean and why DOT 4 as opposed to DOT 3. What would happen if I inadvertently added DOT 3. With the invention of the internet came Google. Just ask and it will tell you anything. The first thing I discovered is that DOT stands for Department Of Transportation. They regulate the highways and what happens on them; especially safety. The 3 and 4 are specifications for the brake fluid. There are also 2, 5, 5.1, 6, and 7. Unless you have special needs such as race cars or operate in extremely high temperatures you won't need anything but 3 or 4. They are both poly glycol based. DOT 3 is the one most used especially in automobiles. It has a higher water absorption rate and should not be used instead of 4. It is classed for use in non-aggressive breaking applications. The reason is it has a lower boiling point than 4. With aggressive breaking the brakes heat up, the fluid boils you now have vapor in your lines and you lower pressure at your brake pads. Not a situation you want to be in. Part of the specification is the wet and dry boiling points. Dry, means new brake fluid is never exposed to air and has 0% water in it. Wet means exposed to air and up to 3.7% water. The dry boiling point for DOT 3 is 410 deg. F for DOT 4 it is 446 deg. F. The wet boiling point for 3 is 284 deg. F and 4 is 311 deg. F. DOT 4 contains borate and glycol. This makes it harder to absorb water which as we just pointed out, lowers the boiling point, so it is better for aggressive breaking. Liquids are hard to compress, air isn't. We want only liquids in our brake lines and cylinders. Compare it to water. Water boils at 212 deg. F. At this temperature it turns to vapor (steam). As it cools it turns back into liquid. The brake fluid does the same. When it boils we get vapor in the lines and the brakes feel soft. The vapor compresses and we no longer get full pressure to the pads. Our stopping ability is greatly compromised. One day coming off of the Blue Ridge Parkway I was on a steep winding road. I used the front brake until it overheated. Suddenly I had no front brake. I downshifted and used the rear brake sparingly until I came to a church with a big parking lot. I circled the lot until I slowed enough to stop. I parked in the shade until the brakes cooled down and the fluid became liquid again then continued. If your system specifies DOT 3 you can add DOT 4 but never the other way. It would lower the boiling point and your brakes may fail. It is also recommended that you change your brake fluid every year and never let it go over 2 years. I am willing to bet most of you have never changed brake fluid. They also recommend that you use a new sealed can when you add fluid. This guaranties you are using dry fluid and not compromising it.




