


Tom & Connie Lowther-Chaffin's - Can AM Travels July 2024

Connie and I have had several exciting weeks since we left Hobe Sound on June 17. We planned on trailering our Can Am back to Kentucky for the summer, so decided to take a couple extra days and ride the "Tail of the Dragon", Deals Gap North Carolina, and surrounding areas.



We stayed at a Quality Inn in Robbinsville, NC



318 curves in 11 miles. Read that

last sentence again. We loved the challenge. Just loved it. I bet those of you who ride 2 wheelers would love it even more! The next day we rode a leisurely 80 miles on the Cherohala Skyway, that connects Robbinsville N.C to Tellico Plains Tennessee. The skyway passes through the Cherokee and the Nantahala National Forests. The vistas and overlooks are breathtaking. The Skyway runs from 900 to 5,400 feet! Just imagine the highs and lows we felt.





After arriving in Ashland Ky and resting a few days we decided to visit Snowshoe W.Va. in Pocahontas County. This area is famous for their snow skiing trails in the winter, but motorcycle rides in the summer are awesome. We trailered our bike the 225 miles from Ashland to Snowshoe and stayed at the Corduroy Inn and Lodge on top of Snowshoe Mountain. We parked the car, took the bike off the trailer and rode the Can Am for the next two days. We visited the Robert C. Bird National Observatory in Green Bank, WV. The site of the largest satellite dish in the USA (2.3 acres) We rode through Cass WV, home of the famous Greenbrier Express, an old steam driven locomotive which travels a 30-mile trek, 5 hours through wild wonderful WV (our home state). In total we toured 5 counties and areas like Cranberry Glades Botanical Park, Seneca State Forest, Marlington and Watoga State Park, much of which is in the Monongahela National Forest. We visited too many sites to detail here, but that area of WV is a wonderful way to get away from

the city. The best part was the temperatures in Snowshoe were about 20 degrees cooler than the mid 90's we had been having in Ashland, KY.

We bought a "Go Pro" to document our travels. Great way to remember the lovely views of the mountains when we get back to the sunny south.

During our stay in Ashland, we always look forward to participating in the annual 4th of July parade. We decorated the Can Am with our beloved Old Glory and had a lot of fun until the parade was hit with 3 inches of rain in 30 minutes. No...we did not have our rain gear on! Big mistake.

We have collected many motorcycle maps of Kentucky, West Virginia and Virginia. We are now contemplating where out next adventure will take us. We look forward to sharing those rides with all of you when we see your smiling faces in a couple of months.

It's 98 degrees outside and 100% humidity so I'm sitting here in the air conditioning while the bike sits idle in the garage. Just because I cannot ride does not mean I can't reminisce about some of the great rides of the past. It has been a short time since Jeff and I did the Cherohala Skyway, the Tail of the Dragon and route 19 along the Nantahala River. I look through our pictures and it brings back memories of the time we followed friends through the rain and up to the Beartooth Pass. There was snow on the mountain, but just down the other side was the Chief Joseph Scenic Byway to Cody, Wyoming. I break into a sweat when I recall our trip from Ouray, Colorado to Durango along the Million Dollar Highway. Going south on the highway means there is a 500 foot drop off inches from the road and, in a couple of places, taking part of the road into the canyon. Marilyn calmly asks how I like the scenery and I explain that I am concentrating on staying as close as possible to the yellow line. There are a lot of rides that have been, and a lot of rides that will be, which is why we ride.

RIDING IN THE HEAT

It's hot!!! I guess I don't have to tell you that. Here are a few tips and facts that might help you make the best of it. Ride early in the morning or in the evening when it is cooler. Use sunscreen in direct sunlight. Wear long sleeves. I know that is contrary to what most riders want to do. Having covered skin in hot weather is actually better physically for you. If your skin is exposed the hot air rushes past your body and will dry you out. Just in the same manner you dry your hands in the hand blower in the restroom. Wear a helmet visor to keep the hot air from hitting you in the face. You can wet your shirt under your mesh motorcycle jacket. You could put a cool tie around your neck. You could wear an ice vest. You could carry a mist spray bottle. Have drink holders on your bike for you and your passenger.

There are three physical concerns you should think about: **Dehydration**, **Heat Exhaustion**, **and Heat Stroke**.

Dehydration Symptoms:

Dry or sticky mouth

Low or no urine output or concentrated urine appears dark yellow

Not producing tears

Sunken eyes

Lethargic

Dehydration Treatment:

Seek shade or air conditioning

Drink additional water or sport drinks (diluted 50/50 with water)

If possible, decrease the time between rest stops

Heat Exhaustion Symptoms:

Loss of large amounts of fluid through sweating

Sweating, clammy and moist skin with pale or flushed complexion

Extreme weakness or fatigue, giddiness, nausea, headache, or irritability

Vomiting

Loss of consciousness

Heat Exhaustion Treatment:

Drink additional water or sport drinks (diluted 50/50 with water)

Apply cool compresses or ice packs to the neck, groin, and arm pits

Heat Stroke Symptoms:

Hot, dry, flushed or spotted skin

Severe headache

Exhaustion

Bizarre behavior

Hallucinations

Altered mental status

Confusion

Disorientation

Possible convulsions and coma

Heat Stroke Treatment:

Call EMS (911) this is a medical emergency

Move rider to a cool place

Reduce rider's body heat immediately be any means avai


