This year it is on Feb.22 and 23. The sabal palmetto is also know as cabbage palm and is the source of hearts of palm and was originally eaten by Native Americans. SPOTLIGHT Herb "Metalflake" Jebb

We all have enjoyed the interesting stories, tech talk and humorous jokes that Metalflake shares with us at our Gatherings, but you may not know that Metalflake has been riding motorcycles for over 65 years and is a Lifetime Member of GWRRA. He was born in New York but his family moved to Miami, Florida when he was just 10 years old. When he went to high school in Miami, there was a Triumph dealer very close by so, like many of our Gold Wing friends, he took advantage of the opportunity to 'hang out' at the dealership and help the mechanics. At 16 he purchased his very first bike, a Cushman Scooter, and he is proud to say that his first Triumph was also purchased from that same Triumph dealership and it was a beauty! There was chrome everywhere including the gas tank. He is still a big fan of chrome as we can all see when he drives up on one of his 6 beautiful chrome clad bikes at our group rides.

Yes, that's right, Metalflake has 6 bikes! When I asked him where he stores them, he said, "They are all under cover in my two car garage and my cars are under a carport." I guess that gives you some idea of Metalflake's priorities. He LOVES to ride motorcycles!!! He recently traded in one of his bikes for a brand new 2020 Triumph and he still has a '55, '57, '63 and a '67 Triumph. Of course, his 6 bikes also include a 2012 Gold Wing with a 2018 California Side Car. When asked which do you prefer, the Triumph or the Gold Wing, Metalflake said, "If somebody told me that I could only own one motorcycle, it would be a Gold Wing because the ride is the best!"

Metalflake has driven over 1,000,000 miles in his lifetime. He keeps careful track of his mileage and has a lot of 100,000 mile patches on his vest to prove it. "I'm proud of those miles," he said. "I'm running out of room on my vest to display the patches, so I guess I'll need a new vest soon." His most fun and exciting trips were out to Fort Collins, Colorado where his son's family lived for many years.

He said, "My son is a computer science genius and his wife graduated from Colorado State in mathematics. I rode my bike to Colorado three times to see them." "Now my son & his wife are in San Diego, CA where she is working as a math teacher at San Diego State and he is supervising 700 people as the lead software engineer for Otterbox, a company that manufactures protective casings for cell phones. I'm so proud of them."

His favorite ride with his wife, Pat, was from San Diego County to Seattle, WA. As they were driving through Los Angeles, he took a ride up Mulholland Drive to a famous motorcycle 'hang out' at brunch time. Pat was wearing a hurricane t-shirt from 2004 printed with the names of the hurricanes that year. He was asked, "How do you put up with all the hurricanes in FL?" Metalflake answered, "How do you put up with the earthquakes in CA? At least we have a few days notice." That same day, Jay Leno drove up to the 'hang out' in a 1915 Hispano Sweeza car. The engine was enormous, built originally for airplanes so it was 2x the size of a Chevy engine. Metalflake couldn't resist the opportunity to shake Jay Leno's hand so he walked up to him and said, "Hi, Jay, I've come all the way from FL to visit with you." With that simple introduction, Metalflake proceeded to talk to Jay about his 1915 Hispano Sweeza. The only door in the car was the passenger door and there was no hydraulic brake just a brake pedal that moved an arm and pulled a chain to stop the car. Eventually, Metalflake & Pat continued on their trip up the scenic US Hwy. 1 through Big Sur into the giant Redwood forest where he saw a fallen Redwood tree on display showing the rings inside the trunk that determine the age of the tree. "That tree dated all the way back to the year Columbus discovered America in 1492. It was such an interesting ride! I will never forget it." We all appreciate the fact that Metalflake is a very active member of Chapter FL2-0. You will always see him at our Wed. Gatherings and you can count on him being at our Kick Tire dinners and group rides. He enjoys riding his new pearl white Triumph complete with a gorgeous chrome package but he's partial to his pearl white Gold Wing Trike. "The Gold Wing ride is incomparable and the chrome is outstanding!" Now I understand why he goes by the name, Metalflake. Christened, Herb Jebb, Metalflake seems to suit him better because not only are his bikes shiny and sparkly but he shines with authenticity & humor.

RIDER EDUCATION





Our New District Ride Educators are: Dominick & Diane Desiato from Chapter FL1-A.

A recent motorcycle crash in Sarasota involving five motorcycles was what inspired me to write this article. The way the news report read was that there was a group of motorcycles riding on the interstate. The lead rider lost control of his motorcycle while passing a tractor trailer truck, fell off his motorcycle and struck the wheel of a truck and was killed. The next four motorcyclists then lost control of their motorcycles and fell off of their bikes. Three of them went to the hospital. So my question to you is this: Ignorance or Arrogance? Ignorance as defined by the dictionary is simply "the lack of knowledge." This would include not knowing "how to ride, where to ride, and what to do should something go wrong." The 1981 Hurt Report, whose findings are still true today, stated that in 80% of motorcycle crashes the rider did not do anything to avoid the crash. The news story did not state the exact cause the first rider went down but it could have been something as simple as being too close to the tractor trailer truck he was passing and getting startled by the sudden wind blast that often occurs. That cause could fall under the "Ignorance" category for being too close to the truck and not anticipating the wind blast. How about now seeing how the cause might fit in the "Arrogance" category. We have all seen it. The riders with the bold attitude of: "This is my road, I have a right to be here, and I am going to intimidate everyone to get out of my way" (usually by excessive exhaust noise and purposely riding too close to other vehicles they are passing). We really don't know the reason of the first rider going down at this point but it was probably one of the examples I have just described. How about the next four riders who went down? Obviously they were all following too close to the lead bike to properly react. Again, why were they following too close: "Ignorance or Arrogance"? We can all make mistakes through "Ignorance" but let's not contribute to the possibility of crashing by adding "Arrogance." Ride safe! **Dominick & Diane**
