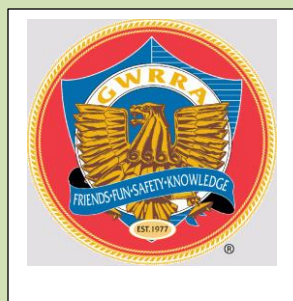

ALABAMA RALLY

Alabama had a great rally at a great venue, the Lakepoint Resort State Park. Opening night was a southern fried chicken dinner followed by a costume contest with a talent contest the following night. As with all my trips I plan as much for the journey as I do the destination and the objective this trip was to avoid Interstate 75. The turnpike, 441 and Canoe Creek got me to St. Cloud where I rejoined the turnpike to Wildwood, the last exit before 75. At Wildwood route 44 goes due west to Crystal River where Charlie's Fish House provided a superb lunch on the water. Route 19 runs all the way up the west coast to intersect route 27 into Tallahassee. The Microtel on 27 just north of Tallahassee provided a nice night's rest and was 418 miles from my starting point in Jupiter. Day two took me up 27 to route 39, which runs up the east side of the Chattahoochee River all the way into Eufaula. I left the Rally Saturday to head north to the Barber Museum, a place that has been on my bucket list. Wing World mentioned scenic roads that riders coming to Wing Ding in Nashville might be interested in and one of them was the Talladega Scenic Byway. Since the Byway only took me a short distance out of my way I decided to try it out. It's a 20-mile scenic ride through the mountains that reminded me very much of the Blue Ridge Parkway.

The Barber Museum houses 1400 motorcycles and is the center point of a 930 acre park with a 2.38 mile race track. Porsche has a driving school that uses the track (only \$9,200 for a four-day competition driving course) and the Indy car circuit holds a race there every April. Son Jeff and I spent three hours touring the five floors before heading out back to watch the Porsches racing around the track. All in all, a great journey to a couple of great destinations.





MEC Report-Follow-up on Life Member Program

Last March I gave you an overview of all the different types of GWRRA membership programs including Life Member and New Life Member designations and I also informed you that the requirements are changing and that GWRRA is in the process of sending out letters that will delineate those changes. I encouraged you to 'stay tuned!' This article is a follow-up that will cover those changes and more!

Since that article was published in the March Newsletter, new information has come to my attention. I have discovered that when the Life Member program ended in 2001 there was a bit of a lapse and then a new program was introduced. I had originally said that it was a 'buy in' period but now I find that it was called the Gold Member program. It allowed those with 10 years of GWRRA membership already to buy the remaining years so that they could become Gold Members. Gold Members had very similar benefits as Life Members including free membership. This program was available from about 2002/03 to 2007.

In 2007 (I had originally said 2006) the New Life Member Program was introduced that continues today. It contains similarities to the original Life Member program but there is a major exception. New Life Members pay reduced dues annually (or multi-year payments are accepted). Commencing on their 21st year, the New Life Member (and/or Family New Life Member) pays a nominal annual membership fee of only \$30 per year. All Members who complete 20 consecutive years of paid membership in GWRRA since the original program ended in 2001, except those who took advantage of the Gold Program, are eligible to become New Life Members. After you pay for the 20th year, you are sent a New Life Membership card and you receive the patches and pins associated with Life Membership as well as the monthly printed Wing World magazine. Plus, you have the opportunity to purchase Rescue Plus.

As promised, the GWRRA letter was recently sent to all those in the Life Member category informing them that the delivery of their services has changed. The letter explained that they will always be Life Members but their Wing World magazine and future Gold books will come to them electronically. Should they choose or want to get both in print, a \$30 per year contribution is requested. If they only want the Gold Book in print, \$5 per book is requested. Please know that this contribution is not to maintain your Life Membership. Life Members are always Life Members of GWRRA whereas New Life Members pay annual dues of \$30/year to maintain their membership.

Again, I want to reiterate the many benefits that all of these programs provide including reduced registration at Wing Ding, discounts at the GWRRA store and other opportunities. I hope you find this information helpful and that it encourages you to keep on riding & enjoying the FUN, FRIENDSHIP, SAFETY and KNOWLEDGE we all share as members of Chapter FL2-O.

I am like many wives who ride "two up". We try to be helpful to our rider driver. We are defined as co-riders and have certain responsibilities to fulfill. Taking co-rider courses, CPR and First Aid classes to name a few are very helpful and boost personal confidence levels.

When Jim and I travel on our Gold Wing we have written check lists for everything. Our clothing check list has everything on it from swimsuits to rain suits. We keep our pieces of clothing to a minimum but always include a nice outfit for dinners or tours. We go over maps in advance and plan our routes. Jim makes up 3 x 5 cards with our "intended" routes and I keep them handy in my co-rider pocket on the seat back. It is easier to refer to a card than to stop and get out a road map. In our bike luggage we make sure to have chargers for phones, cameras, and e-readers.

We make sure to stay hydrated and each brings an insulated water bottle. Energy bars are easy to pack in the small storage pockets and within reach. Agreeing on the length of daily trips is important. That way the trip can be broken down into comfortable segments and no one gets overly tired.

Stopping for photo opportunities is a must. Looking at photos can bring back vivid memories. Taking time along the way to smell the roses adds to the fun.

KD Cycle sells about 250 trikes a year. At any one time they have about 35 to 40 on the property, but most are already sold. They concentrate only on RoadSmith conversions because of the many qualities they like about the brand.

A LITTLE BIT OF TECHNICAL ADVICE FROM WILLARD HACKETT

- I haven't ridden over 30 miles in June. The problem is that I left my bike in my buddy's shed for seven months while I went to Florida for the Winter. Although he kept my battery on a maintainer while I was gone, when we got out the Wing and put the battery in, it started, but did not run very well. (I forgot the Sea Foam). It would not idle without the choke on and I could barely get it going after a stop. I filled the tank with fresh gas and added an entire bottle of Sea Foam. After that it idled a stop light but still had a hard time taking off - sputtering and not wanting to get going. Next, I added double the recommended Sea Foam and it got a little better. At 70 or 80 mph it runs like a charm. Friday, I purchased some K100 which my buddies say is the best. I plan on putting some of that in today and do a warm-up run. I am hoping not to have a carb job done.
- Wish me luck.

- During May it rained every other day here in Maryland and I just left the bike in the shed. Remember - put in your Sea Foam when you are leaving your baby sit for awhile.
