GWRRA NEWS: David shared the fact that after 45 years in business, the founders of GWRRA had announced at Wing Ding in Shreveport, Louisiana that they had decided to close the doors to GWRRA as of Dec. 31, 2022. David took this opportunity to communicate how he feels about this sudden news and how it will impact Chapter FL2-0. He said that he had joined GWRRA over 20 years ago in MA and always enjoyed riding his Gold Wing on group rides. SAFETY was always of paramount importance. After retirement, he moved to Florida where he could ride in every season rather than only 3 or 4 months out of the year. He didn't know anyone in Florida except his daughter in Palm Beach so he immediately looked up the closest GWRRA Chapter which was FL2-A in Boynton Beach at the time. When he went to the FL2-A Gathering in Boynton, he met Jim Cuff who told him about the Stuart chapter. Eventually, David moved to Hobe Sound and joined FL2-0 where he has served as Chapter Director for over 9 years. David said that, as a new resident, it was so comforting to know that he could join a GWRRA chapter and make FRIENDS with like-minded people who love to ride Gold Wings. He believes that one of the most valuable benefits of this association is the opportunity to enjoy the camaraderie, mutual trust and close FRIENDSHPS that GWRRA encourages. He then enumerated how we will move forward in the future.

Future Gatherings: David said that there will be 5 more GWRRA Gatherings before Dec. 31, 2022. The next Gathering will be on Aug. 10. David and Terry will not be in town for the usual Gathering in Sept. so the Sept. Gathering will be on Wed. Sept. 21. Please mark your calendars with this revision and the following Gathering dates...Oct. 12, Nov. 9. The Dec. Christmas Party Gathering date will be announced soon.

Membership News according to GWRRA:

GWRRA will disband as of Dec. 31, 2022.

<u>All memberships</u> will be dissolved as of July 31, 2022 and if members have paid their dues in advance, refunds will be prorated and distributed in August.

<u>Rescue Plus</u> will no longer be available after July 31, 2022. All members will need to find their own towing service. We looked into AAA and they are offering insurance for your car and bike for about \$180. Progressive Insurance may include towing for up to 5 miles.

GroupWorks will remain but GWRRA will no longer exist after Dec. 31, 2022.

Chapter FL2-0 Website is ours and will continue.

The Newsletter will continue through Dec. 31, 2022.

The Spirit Team will continue through Dec. 31, 2022.

<u>Gatherings</u> will continue to be held at the Southern Pig and Cattle on the second Wed. each month except in Sept. when we will meet on the third Wed. Sept. 21.

News from Virginia: David said that John DuBose sent some information from VA. <u>GWRRA</u> *will continue* through Dec. 31 but there will be no organization per se at the AZ home office.

<u>Voice Mail</u> only *will be available* at the GWRRA home office in AZ after July 31, 2022. You may call & leave a message and someone will get back to you.

Helmet Logo is no longer available and should not be used.

Wing Ding will *not be* on the calendar next year.

Patches....members *may continue* to wear patches.

Gatherings...members may continue to get together for Gatherings.

Rides....members may continue to ride together.

Wing Ding: David called on Assistant District Director and District COY, Doug and Donna Goethel, to give a report on their trip to Wing Ding. Donna said that she and Doug arrived in Shreveport, Louisiana and were anticipating seeing a lot of friends and having a ball! There were 2830 people in attendance and the hotel was beautiful. Jim and Sondra Cuff and Joe and Sandy Pisano rode their bikes to the event. Donna said that at the very first Thurs. night dinner, they learned the sad news from the founders that after 45 years, they were closing GWRRA. Why? Because at their peak there were 82,000 GWRRA members and now there are only 10,000 members. Everyone was totally shocked and in disbelief, but Doug and Donna continued to participate in all the activities and made the best of a difficult situation. One day Donna, Sandy and Sondra went on a tour of the city and enjoyed seeing a 19 ft. Dalmatian with white spots that lighted up at night. She said that the city treated GWRRA members to a dinner and show at the Shreveport Louisiana Municipal Auditorium. The show called 'Louisiana Hayride' promoted and featured up and coming artists like Elvis Presley. They also visited a great restaurant called Shababys' Cajun Cooking and enjoyed delicious southern fried food.

Future Plans: So, what's next? ACD Doug Goethel said that there are plans in the works to establish and continue the motorcycle organization under new management. It is all very much "up in the air" right now. He cautioned us not to listen to rumors but to wait and see what develops. The prospects are very good!! The District will keep us posted so stay tuned for more exciting new information about our future as a motorcycle group! Continue business as usual and keep on keeping on until further notice!

HOW TO REMOVE OVERFILLED OIL FROM A 2021 GOLDWING TRIKE WITHOUT JACKING IT UP

I can't believe I put too much oil in my 2021 GL1800 trike. For an accurate oil check I have always let my bike sit overnight and then with a cold engine and all the oil drained down checked the oil with the dipstick. One time I checked the oil and it was a quarter of a quart low so I added oil. A few days later the same thing happened. Two weeks later when I checked it was a quart low, again I added what was needed. This is the fifth new Goldwing I've owned, none of them have ever burned or leaked oil so I was getting very concerned. I started the engine let it run for a few minutes and shut it down. A short time later I checked the oil and found it was way over full. Now what? The first thing I did was go to the owner's manual to make sure I was using the right oil, I was. In the manual I happened to notice that for my year wing there was an oil check procedure, which I was not aware of. It states: with a cold engine, start the engine and let it idle for 3 to 5 minutes; turn the engine off for 2 to 3 minutes then check the oil which I did. YIKES! It was almost 2 quarts over full. Again, now what, how do I drain the excess oil? It is Saturday, I am leaving on a 2K mile trip in three days and I don't want to jack up the trike to drain the excess possibly draining too much and burning my hands with hot oil. Next, I thought, I will have to pump it out somehow. The smallest hose I could find in my garage had and O.D. (outside diameter) of 1/4 inch. Well, it would not go down into the oil in the dip stick port. The oil fill port is bigger but a 1/4-inch hose will not go in far enough to reach the oil either. Now I was racking my brain trying to come up with a way to pump the excess oil out. I decided to have lunch and think about it. The thought occurred to me that maybe the thin tube in a spray bottle might work. I had a new one in the cabinet which I quickly retrieved. To my surprise, the plastic tube which was 3/16-inch O.D. not only fit but went well into the oil through the dip stick port. Now, how to pump the oil out? I thought, the oil is warm and will flow easily being 10W, why not try the spray bottle pump. After pulling the trigger many times on the spray bottle pump with the plastic tube attached and pushed well into the engine oil, the oil was about halfway up the tube. Next, I pulled the pump out of the engine case with the tube attached, turned it upside down and repeatedly pulled the pump trigger and was able to prime the pump. This time with the plastic tube placed back below the surface of the oil and after a few pumps I couldn't believe it, it actually worked! The results were not immediate and it is messy but I pumped out about one and three-quarter quarts in about 15 to 20 minutes and I didn't have to jack up the trike, crawl under it etc. you know the drill. One picture I sent shows the spray bottle used. Try to get one with a plastic tube no bigger than 3/16 inch in diameter and at least 9 1/2 to 10 inches long, you don't want to drop a short one down into the crank case. When you pump be sure to open the spray nozzle. Also in the picture is an empty 1-quart oil, container with a sight window on the side which was handy for measuring how much oil I pumped out.

The other picture shows how I used the pump. It is a little messy so use a lot of rags, drip pan and a piece of plastic or something so the oil that comes out the bottom of the pump will drain into the drip pan. This procedure pulled me out of a jam and maybe it will help someone else.

There were approximately 2,800 Wingers in attendance to the 43rd Wing Ding. It was great meeting up with all our new friends, as well as old, from Texas, South Carolina, Oklahoma, Georgia, North Carolina, Mississippi, Wyoming, Colorado, and Wisconsin. There had to be over 30 vendors in attendance and yes everyone went home with something, whether it was swag, bike accessories or jewelry. We had another great dinner and Louisianan entertainment at the Welcoming Dinner put on by the City of Shreveport. Elvis was even in the house!

We met up with Joe and Sandy, Jim and Sondra and had a fantastic Welcoming dinner sponsored by the City of Shreveport where we had even more great Louisianan food along with Louisianan music and a visit by Elvis. Yes, there was even an ice cream truck oh and a donut truck!

Overall, we had a fantastic time and are extremely pleased to have been a part of GWRRA and look forward to the next chapter with our Winger Family!











Where is your First Aid Kit?

If I were to ask you where your First Aid Kit is located on your bike, trike, or trailer you could probably answer me without hesitation, exactly where it is located. What would happen if you were the one who is incapacitated and is in need of your First Aid Kit? Would other members on the ride be able to quickly find it without your assistance? Any GWRRA Member who is a Level 3 or higher is required to carry their own First Aid Kit, but this is not a perfect world and it could be possible they do not have one with them. In an emergency, it is possible for people to go into panic mode and they might not be thinking clearly as they frantically search for a First Aid Kit.

What could we do to make it easier to locate a First Aid Kit in an emergency? You could place "First Aid Kit" vinyl stickers on the exterior of your bike, trike, or trailer to indicate the location of a First Aid Kit. Attached are photos of what the stickers look like and where you could mount them. They can be purchased on Amazon or other places on line for a couple of





dollars.


You or someone in your Chapter may also carry an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) with them. It would also be necessary to quickly locate this device in an emergency. Vinyl

stickers for that device can also be purchased and placed on the outside of the location on your bike, trike, or trailer where it can be found.

Florida District Riding and Medic First Aid (MFA) classes are available upon request to maintain your Levels status. For ARC (Advanced Two-Wheel Riding Courses) or for TRC (Trike Riding Courses) contact Dominick at Dominickflde@gmail.com. For MFA Classes contact Claudia at rvega19854@gmail.com.
