MIRACLE EAR

No, I'm not referring to the hearing aid company. I've never liked the wind noise that's always been prevalent at highway speeds, nor do I like wearing "foamy" ear plugs that muffle everything. I tried a full-face helmet, but that seemed even noisier than my three-quarter helmet with a face shield. I read an article about musician's ear plugs that block noise above certain frequencies or decibels, so I decided to do some research. Wing World had a blurb about a company that made that type of ear plug that marketed specifically to motorcycle riders and drag racers. When I went on their website their "low price" model started around \$1,800, so that eliminated them. I talked with an audiologist who offered to custom fit a pair for around \$150, and, while I seriously considered that option, I decided to do a Google search. On Amazon, which has everything from knee replacement parts to shoelaces, I found an ear plug made by Alpine that comes with two filters. One filter blocks around 50% of the surrounding noise, while the second filter blocks 75 – 80% of the noise. What I found was that with filter number two the wind noise was completely blocked, but still allowed me to hear my headset speakers clearly and distinctly. The icing on the cake was that they were only \$19, made of soft silicone for comfort, and have a screw-top metal carrying case.

Well, I think it's official, WE ARE IN THE RAINY SEASON!! Forget about Love Bugs! Watch out for water holes!! I know the ole adage here in Florida, "if you don't like the weather just wait ten minutes it'll change". Well, it sure hasn't held to that lately. Least ways not around my area. Been raining almost all day every day for the past several weeks. Okay, I know we have been needing the rain but, not all at once please. Sheesh

On a serious note, if you do get out to ride in between some of the "liquid sunshine" and get caught in the wet stuff please do be careful. Be mindful that the two-wheeler can and does have the ability to hydroplane, even though the front tire throws the water away from the rear tire. Trikes have a quicker tendency to hydroplane, due to the front tire throwing the water out to the side where the rear tires will run over the runoff. If you find yourself in this situation just reduce your throttle, square your handlebars and don't panic. Whatever you do, do not apply your brakes. As your speed reduces, you should regain traction and control.

With this unpredictable Florida rainy season ahead of us for the next several months, prudent planning and common sense are the words of the day.
