ADVANCED RIDER COURSE

The Advanced Rider Course, ARC, was developed by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation. The Foundation is the internationally recognized developer of the comprehensive, research-based, Rider Education and Training System (RETS). The ARC class is a one-day course providing more in-depth riding techniques and procedures than does the basic riding course required by Florida for the motorcycle endorsement. In the past Ray Vega taught the Experienced Rider Course in Miami and Wellington (as well as several other locations) on courses that were not designed to handle the ARC. Now Dominic DeSiato, the District Rider Educator, is teaching the ARC in Tampa and at a new course set up in Melbourne at the dog track. Dominic is currently working with our chapter Rider Educator, Doug Goethel, to schedule a rider course at the Melbourne location. Doug needs to know who is interested and whether they prefer a weekday or weekend for the one-day course.






OUR RALLY IS COMING!!!

FROM THE BACK OF THE BIKE By Marilyn Rich

Apalachicola, Florida on the "Forgotten Coast"


Apalachicola is a lovely historic village on "Florida's Forgotten Coast". This picturesque coast stretches along the Gulf of Mexico from St. Marks west to Mexico Beach. Development with high rises and malls is nonexistent. The town of Apalachicola is known as the "Oyster Capital of the World" and 90% of Florida's oysters are harvested there. Shrimping and fishing are also big industries in the area.

In olden times the town was a busy port through which cotton was shipped along with lumber, seafood, and sponges. This quaint town has many wonderful, restaurants, Bed & Breakfast Inns, and shops. There are numerous historic homes and museums. The Trinity Episcopal Church, one of the earliest prefabricated buildings in the U.S. arrived in 1839 by schooner from New York City. It was assembled with wooden pegs. Dr. John Gorrie, a local physician invented an early type of air conditioning system in order to treat patients with malaria. Another early resident, Alvin W. Chapman was a famous botanist.

On our recent motorcycle trip to the area, we rode through the Apalachicola National Forest and Tate's Hell State Forest. Beautiful tall pines lined roads with barely any traffic. An interesting tale explains the name "Tate's Hell". An early homesteader was lost while hunting for seven days and nights. When he finally immerged from the woods he told a passerby "I am Cebe Tate and I just came from Hell", then he collapsed and died!
