

SOUTH CAROLINA STATE RALLY

Joe and I headed north to the South Carolina District Rally on Easter Sunday. We took a few extra days to get there so that we could travel on U.S. Hwy 301 out of Kingsland, Georgia. Joe and I remember travelling this route with our families (in our "much" younger days) as this was the main road out of Florida. So many signs of those bye gone days (shuttered motels and gas stations, gift shops and produce stands) stand lonely against the stretches of highway dotted with pecan trees, cotton fields, dilapidated buildings, and charming little towns.

The Rally was held in the lovely historic town of Newberry, S.C. (50 miles south of Greenville). Our stay was at the Hampton Inn (host hotel) which was a perfect location (within walking distance for all events, shopping, and dining). The Newberry Firehouse Conference Center was the site of most of the Rally functions, The Firehouse was constructed in the 1890's. Lots of great photos throughout the building depict pictures of those who served over the years. Another prominent historic building is the Newberry Opera House (site of the Rally's talent show and closing ceremonies). The Opera House was completed in 1881 at a cost of \$30,000. C.L. Norman, architect from Columbia, S.C., designed the French Gothic inspired structure. The building was designed as a place of entertainment for the local citizenry and as a seat of government for the city. Joe and I took the opportunity to learn about the history of the Opera House on one of the guided tours offered daily.

One of the most interesting stores we visited was C.T. Summer Hardware Store (founded in 1928). Three floors of items unavailable and maybe unheard of- anywhere else (Joe loved this)! Some items included bear traps, horseshoes, weathervanes, wash pots, red rubber inner tubes, fire buckets, and almost anything you would want from **any era**. I know I am digressing from the Rally, but this town was really a pleasure to visit and to spend time talking with the locals.

The Rally was well organized and offered many opportunities to enjoy the camaraderie of other wingers. There was free Nestles ice cream(yummy), a wonderful barbecue dinner, a guided bike ride to Lake Murray Dam, movie nights (at the Opera House) and several seminars. We played the games (Joe won a drill bit set and I won \$55 from the 50/25/25 raffle).





The weather for our entire nine days was perfect! Low humidity and low temperatures required light jackets for days and evenings. Our ride home was more direct (I -95) than our ride up to South Carolina, but again the weather was great and the ride was made even greater with Joe at the helm of the Goldwing.

So, as you can see from this picture of Glen Disbrow's bike from a recent short ride those pesky "LOVE bugs kinda make a mess. Not just on the bike but also on your helmet and visor and/or goggles, glasses, etc. Whatever you may be wearing for eye protection. Hopefully you are keeping your mouth closed. Get my drift???

Well, for we Floridians that do love to ride this is something we must put up with. Thankfully, it is only for a short few weeks. And of course, where can one go to get answers to clean them off our steeds?? Wait for it,..... the internet, of course, where else would one go??

Yes, there are all kinds of remedies on Facebook and other sites, naming all types of concoctions even using dryer sheets, however one I personally use is Hydrogen Peroxide.
