Terry said that the House of Hope was very grateful for our donation of 170+ pounds of non-perishable food and a check for \$50 that we had gathered over a period of three months from Feb.-May. Lena and Leo will park their bright yellow bike and trailer by the tent to attract attention and we will have our brochures and information available as hand outs on the table. FROM THE BACK OF THE BIKE BY MARILYN RICH

SEBRING FLORIDA "CITY ON THE CIRCLE"

Sebring is situated in central Florida amidst several beautiful lakes. It was established in1912 by George E. Sebring an Ohio pottery manufacturer. The city streets were planned to radiate out from a circle in the middle of town. Hence the title, "City on the Circle". It is the county seat for Highlands County. This area runs along the Lake Wales Ridge. The ridge is an ancient chain of islands now covered in scrub, hammocks, and cypress swamp. Highlands County has more than 84 lakes and Sebring has three within the city limits. Lake Jackson is the largest. Sebring is best known for The Sebring International Raceway and is home to the 12 Hours of Sebring. The race is a sports car race patterned after Europe's 24 Hours of Le Mans. Today it is home to many sports car and Indy car events. It is also the home of the Skip Barber Racing School. Originally the location was Hendricks Army Airfield in WWII. Several streets in Sebring are named for car makers or models such as Peugeot, Ferrari, Porsche, Corvette, and Thunderbird.

Hand Signals: This is an area we will work on this coming year!

With some riders using CB radio for communications and others using Bluetooth technology the use of hand signals is imperative. Whether your group riding or going solo, turn signaling lets the traffic around you know your intentions and tells fellow riders in your group to prepare for a turn. "Isn't that what turn signals on the bike are for?" you might ask. And the answer would be yes. However, some would argue that it's better to err on the side of safety and implement both, particularly during group rides. Plus, if you've ridden long enough you know that lights on bikes eventually fail you. 1. Right Turn - Bend your left arm at the elbow to form a 90-degree angle with your clenched fist held high.

Tickets and Level IV Applications

Hello to all! We hope everyone is well. 2022 Raffle Tickets are being distributed. If you have not asked for any yet, please send us an email and we will get them to you. Remember, if you sell 1500 tickets, Rider Ed will pay your chapter charter renewal fee. Remember this money goes to pay for your MFA and Riding classes. There are many states that don't have this privilege. It's a great deal and we are doing lots of classes again. We have been receiving many Levels Advancement Applications which is great! We are finding many errors, especially in the Level IV Applications which we would like to go over with you. When we receive an application with errors we have to send emails back and forth which wastes a lot of time processing the application.

First a "Letter of Recommendation" from the Chapter Director or other Chapter Officer is required to accompany the Level IV Application. Next, let's go over some of the common errors on the application. The N.9 Tour Rider/Co Rider Application (Level IV) – (make sure you use the newest form, 2018-01) 1. In the 2nd Section titled "MASTER APPLICATION" check one of the boxes titled "Black & Gold Patch Requested" or "Griffin Logo Patch Requested". Many Members have gone to the Black & Gold emblems on their vests so the Black & Gold will match. The member must pay \$8.00 if they want the Black & Gold patch. The \$35.00 Application Fee is paid for by the Rider Education Fund. If the member does not want the Black & Gold Patch they should check the Griffin Logo Patch Requested box which is in the standard GWRRA colors. By checking the appropriate box this will assure that the Member gets the patch that they want. 2. Make sure you fill in your "Current Safe Miles". For Level IV this figure should be at least 25,000 miles or

more.

3. Fill in the "Current CPR and First Aid" section.

4. Fill in the "Current Rider Course within the past 3 years" section.


5. The 3rd Section is titled "Master Recognition Program". DO NOT write anything in this section if your Application is just to enter into Level IV. This Section is only to be filled in by Members who are going beyond entry Level IV into Senior Master, Grand Master, or Life Grand Master.

6. The 4th Section is titled "SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS". This section is to be signed and dated by the Rider and/or Co-Rider. It is also to be signed and dated by a Validating Chapter Officer.

The Level IV Application along with the Letter of Recommendation is then sent to us. We then forward it to Susan Huttman for review and approval. Once she approves it, we sent it to the GWRRA Corporate Office along with the appropriate check amount. The patch is then sent to us and we will forward it to either the Chapter Director for presentation or send it directly to the Member.

Please, check and re-check the application before you sent it to us. This will reduce the amount of time the


member has to wait for their Level's achievement patch.




