A few years ago it closed. Then the village folk stepped in to buy it. It not only revived, but it won Best Community Pub. This year, Meyriel has been invited to give a presentation there to speak about her life and work to the community. Meyriel said, "I am thrilled to be doing it....sort of helping to link the past with the present."

When not painting, Meyriel helps transport her triplet granddaughters around their hectic lives in SC and beyond. Her high school art teaching career spanned the UK and USA, with "retirement" giving her the gift of time in which to pursue the endless stack of ideas that have been marinading in her head.

Major Upcoming Exhibit -Brookgreen Gardens, Murrells Inlet, SC

Brookgreen Inspires - Women Create is the theme for our May 3- July 20, 2025 exhibit to be held at one of the prestigious Brookgreen Gardens galleries in Murrells Inlet, SC. The visionaries behind Brookgreen Gardens were Anna Hyatt and Archer Milton Huntington. Anna, a NAWA member in the early 1900s, originally planned Brookgreen to showcase her sculptures and SC flora and fauna. It is now considered one of the preeminent sculpture gardens exhibiting American sculpture from the 19th century to the present. It is meaningful to our members to have the opportunity to continue the NAWA sisterhood through Anna Hyatt Huntington's legacy at Brookgreen Gardens. Exhibit Chair is Staci Swider.
