REAL MEAL Ministry

The need within the community is real, the families served are blessed and bless those who deliver the meals and pray with them, those who prepare, cook and serve are also blessed as the Lord's blessings are shared. This community ministry has afforded the opportunity to pray with homebound and/or elderly, provide socialization, wellness checks and an awareness of emerging needs. In the four months, this ministry has grown to provide meals to 70+ individuals each week. They are touched each week w/ the love of Jesus. Volunteers are needed, especially on a consistent basis. It is not necessary to commit to every week but consider once a month or more frequently as the Lord leads.

Stephen Hutchins of N. Augusta First Baptist shared the following: In 2 Cor 9:7, Paul reminds the church that God loves a cheerful giver. While in Proverbs, those who are generous are blessed.

There is a generosity ladder:

Extravagant—plus

Tither—faithfully gives 10%

Emerging—give occasionally, sometimes

Potential—never give or rarely

Consider how very much the Lord has blessed each of us with not only our salvation through Jesus redeeming sacrifice and

God's amazing love but also all the myriads of blessings we enjoy each day with every breath we take. Consider, too, how generous we are as individuals and families. Each of us can determine where we are on the generosity ladder and where do we want to be or even better, where the Lord wants us to be. None of us are in exactly the same circumstances or at the same step—but the consideration should be—Are we where the Lord wants us to be in our walk/relationship with Him.


Pastor Search
