These visual clues can help you identify distracted drivers, allowing you to increase your own awareness and safety on the road:

1. *Race Car Driver*: Arguably the most dangerous in my opinion as he/ she just comes out of seemly nowhere.

2. *Animated:* Wild hand gestures like a band leader.

3. *Lane Wandering:* Drifting in and out of lanes without signaling, or crossing lane markings.

4. *Erratic Speed*: Inconsistent speed, such as sudden acceleration or deceleration without apparent reason.

5. *Delayed Reactions*: Slow responses to traffic signals, stop signs, or other changing traffic conditions.

6. *Frequent Braking*: Unnecessary or unpredictable braking, indicating inconsistent attention.

7. *Vehicle Weaving*: Swaying within the lane or swerving between lanes, suggesting lack of control.

8. *Ignoring Traffic Signals*: Failing to notice or react to red lights, stop signs, or pedestrian crossings.

9. *Tailgating*: Following too closely because the driver is not maintaining proper attention on the road ahead.

10. *Inconsistent Signaling*: Not using turn signals, or using them incorrectly (e.g., signaling left when turning right).

11. *Not Keeping Up with Traffic Flow*: Driving significantly slower or faster than the flow of traffic.

12. *Wide Turns:* Making unusually wide or sharp turns that require oversteering to correct.

13. *Sudden Lane Changes*: Changing lanes unexpectedly or without signaling.

14. *Straddling Two Lanes:* Driving in the middle of two lanes, without committing to one lane.

15. *Running Off the Road*: Occasionally driving on the shoulder or outside the road boundaries.

16. *Failure to Yield*: Not yielding when required, such as at yield signs or when merging onto highways.
