

# "From the Potting Shed" Riverview Garden Club – Helpful Hints February 2023

While our gardens are still taking their winter naps, there are many garden chores to get started indoors during February. This month you can start seeds and begin planning your vegetable garden as well as perennial and annual flower beds and borders.

#### Things to do this month...

#### **Indoors**

- Give your garden tools a good cleaning and sharpening.
- Get your seed orders in if you haven't already done so.
- Collect all of your seed starting equipment together so you'll be ready to go. You will need lights, heat mats, sterile medium, and your preferred pot type.
- Get organized-take the time to organize your seeds and put them in order from the seeds you'll start first all the way down to those which should be direct sowed.
- Prevent "damping off" (a fungal disease that kills seedlings) by starting with clean containers and sterile soilless mix each year. Wash and sterilize flats, cell packs or pots with a 1:10 solution of bleach/water, and stock up on fresh seed-starting medium.
- Start your first seeds inside for broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, celery, eggplant, head lettuce, onions and parsley.
- Most perennial flowers should be started inside by the end of the month as well. You
  can also start flowers and herbs that have a long germination period, like rosemary,
  snapdragons and begonias indoors.

#### **Outdoors**

- While the air is still crisp and cool, your trees and shrubs should still be dormant, this is the perfect time for pruning. Use the opportunity to shape-up any fruit trees, grapevines, or shrubs in your landscape.
- Prune grape vines to no more than four fruiting canes with 7 to 10 buds each.
- Be on the lookout for dead, damaged, diseased wood in other trees and shrubs and prune it out. Remove suckers and water sprouts, too.

#### Plan your vegetable garden
