Entry Fees

Fees are payable in U.S. funds. Returned checks will be assessed a \$20 service fee. Entries will not be accepted if received without signature, fees, or signed waiver agreement. An official AKC Entry Form must be used. Telephone, fax, or email entries are not accepted. No conditional entries will be accepted. Online entries at secreterrier.com are preferred and recommended.

Please Note: If entry is sent via next day air service (UPS), Airborne Express, Federal Express, Express Mail, etc., please indicate that no signature is necessary upon arrival or entry may not be accepted.

Closing Date

Pre-Entries close at the Test Secretary's address August 26, 2026, 5:00 PM or when the numerical limit is reached, whichever is first.

Refunds

Fees will not be refunded if a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by veterinarian, or barred by the Event Committee. If, because of civil disturbance, weather, or other acts beyond the control of the test-giving club, it is unsafe or impossible to conduct or complete the Test, no refund of entry fees will be made. Refunds will be made if, in the opinion of the Inspection Committee, for any entry found to be lame, unfit to compete, a female in season or for any other reason found to be barred from competition according to regulations governing this event.

Prizes

A Light Blue Ribbon will be awarded to each dog receiving a qualifying score. Special larger ribbons/rosettes will be awarded for dogs completing advanced titles. **Please advise** the Test Secretary if you expect to earn a BCAT, DCAT or FCAT title so that the award is ready for you if you are successful.

CONDITIONS UNIQUE TO THIS TEST

Field Conditions:

The field is reasonably flat, level, and mowed. The actual running area is approximately 157 yards long x 5 yards wide, with a cloth/plastic type barrier. The release line is ten feet behind the starting line. The course is 100 yards long with finish line timers (electronic or manual) and a 50-yard run-out area. Handlers may not walk/run the course with their dogs during the actual test.

The Lure:

The lure is propelled by a DRAG LURE SYSTEM whereby the lure, consisting of a squawker-type lure or plastic lure is dragged along the ground in front of the dog by a take-up reel. There is no trailing-line for the dog to step on or get caught in. At the end of the run, the lure is propelled back to the starting line by a separate mechanical system and replaced at the starting position prior to the next run. Safety is the number one consideration in running this event.

Timing will be by electronic timers with a manual (stopwatch) system back-up. In the event of manual timing, a starter's signal will signal the start when the dog's nose crosses the starting line, and the time will be recorded by two time-keepers, each operating individually, at the finish line. The time will be the mathematical average of the two manually recorded times.

Volunteers' dogs will run as necessary to allow volunteers to get into their assigned working area for the tests. Please mark your willingness to volunteer on the entry form or email the Test Secretary. Lunch is provided for volunteers.

Top 20 Recognition: The speed of the Top 20 fastest dogs of each breed will be posted on the AKC website. Please check the AKC website to see how your dog compares with other dogs in your breed. AKC Rules, Regulations, Policies and Guidelines are available at www.akc.org.

BASIC INFORMATION ABOUT FAST COURSING ABILITY TEST [Fast CAT]

Fast CAT is a timed straight 100-yard dash for dogs. It is meant to be a fun and healthy activity of interest to any dog owner. Dogs run singularly and receive points based upon their height and speed.

Fast CAT Points and Titles:

A dog's time to complete the 100-yard dash is converted into miles per hour [mph] according to the formula $204.545/\text{dog's time in seconds equals mph}$. (For example, a dog's time of 8.21 seconds is 24.91 mph)

Handicap: A handicap system is applied to the dog's mph to determine the number of points earned. The handicap is based upon the height of the dog at the withers: 1) below 12" equals 2x handicap; 2) 12" to less than 18" equals 1.5 handicap; 3) over 18" equals 1 handicap.

Points: Points are awarded based upon the dog's time in mph multiplied by handicap.

Titles: Titles are suffix titles and appear on the dog's registration, when awarded: BCAT = 150 points, DCAT = 500 points, FCAT = 1,000 points, FCAT1 and sequenced higher = for every additional 500 points. (For example, FCAT5 = 3,000 points).

Course and Equipment: The course used for this event is 100 yards long and fifteen to twenty feet wide with electronic timers at the start and finish. There is a 10' starting box. Dogs must start within the starting box which is interpreted to mean that at least the front feet must be within the box. The run begins when any part of the dog trips the electronic timer and ends when any part of the dog trips the finish line timers. For this test there is a fifty-yard run out to allow the dog to safely stop.

Fencing: The starting box, the course, and the run-out fenced in plastic fencing 4' high.

The Lure: The lure is a plastic bag propelled by a lure machine placed midway between the start and the finish. The machine is operated/and or supervised by a lure operator with at least three years' experience in the safe operation of the lure equipment. The lure is NOT a continuous loop, which is a system whereby the lure is attached to a continuous string that allows the lure to be returned with the same system as was used to propel the lure. A continuous loop system requires the dog to run along-side or on top of the string that is the loop. The lure used is a DRAG lure, which means that it is dragged from the start to the finish by a take up wheel. There is no trailing string for the dogs to potentially contact.

Lure Retrieval: The drag lure is attached to a different mechanical system that runs along the side of the course and returns the lure to the start. The retrieval system is not operated while the dog is on the course.

Electronic Timers: Timers measure the time in 1/100 of a second. Back up timers are run manually.

IMPORTANT. Running Order: Trial one and trial two each day will run concurrently. If practical and desired by the handler, both tests can be completed within an hour. **Indicate your preferred running time on the entry form.**

Inspections will be throughout the day and dogs must be re-inspected prior to their second run. You do not need to be present until 30 minutes prior to your run. (This for check in, fitness inspections, and entry into the running que.)

Handlers Meetings: A short handlers' meeting will be held prior to the start of the events each day and shortly after the lunch break. New entrants are encouraged to attend. There will also be experienced participants on site to answer any questions.

Times are tentative and may vary according to actual conditions at the event. Dogs not present at the assigned time will be inserted into the running order at the discretion of the Paddock Master. Although every dog entered and presenting by 5pm will be run, tardy dogs will run after dogs appearing at their assigned times.

CAR-DUN-AL CLUB RULES

Leashes: Flexi retracting leashes are not permitted on the test site. Exercise your dog(s) only in posted areas and clean up after them. Exhibitors must always exercise control over their children while on the event grounds. No private gasoline or diesel generators are permitted inside of any building or within 100 feet of any tent or the test run.

Assumption of Risk: By entering this event, entrants certify that they have read and understand, and agree to the Agreement that is a part of the entry form. The Club assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors. Neither the test committees nor the Club will be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog on the ground, whether because of an accident or any other cause. It is clearly understood that every dog entered in the event is in the care, custody and control of its owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the premises. Exhibitors, owners, and agents assume all responsibility for dogs and equipment on the site. (See Agreement on entry form.)

Errors on Entries: Owners are responsible for the accuracy of the information required on the entry forms.

Changes, additions, or corrections to an entry, entry substitutions, or cancellations by the owner must be received in writing (email accepted) by the Test Secretary prior to the closing date of the test. Other means of notification will not be accepted.

Conduct: It is expressly understood that all owners/agents/handlers are solely responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any person(s) whose dog and/or children create unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Event Committee, be asked to leave the test site. In such case no refund of any fees/monies paid will be made. All Owners/agents/exhibitors and other persons attending these events hereby waive any claim against the club or its agents, or any losses, damages, or injuries affecting self, dog, children, or personal property.

Leashes/Crates: All dogs must be held on a leash or confined to a crate except when competing. Dogs must be on a leash when being exercised. Dogs must be removed from the test grounds immediately following the end of the Test. Please be respectful.

Dogs in Vehicles: The Club reserves the right to remove any dog that appears, in the opinion of any member of the Event Committee, to be in distress in a parked vehicle or in a crate.

Cleanup: Please keep the grounds clean by picking up after yourself and your dog. Dispose of “poop” bags in the trash containers provided. Please keep your crating area, the test site, grounds, and soccer field clean so we may continue to be welcomed at these facilities.

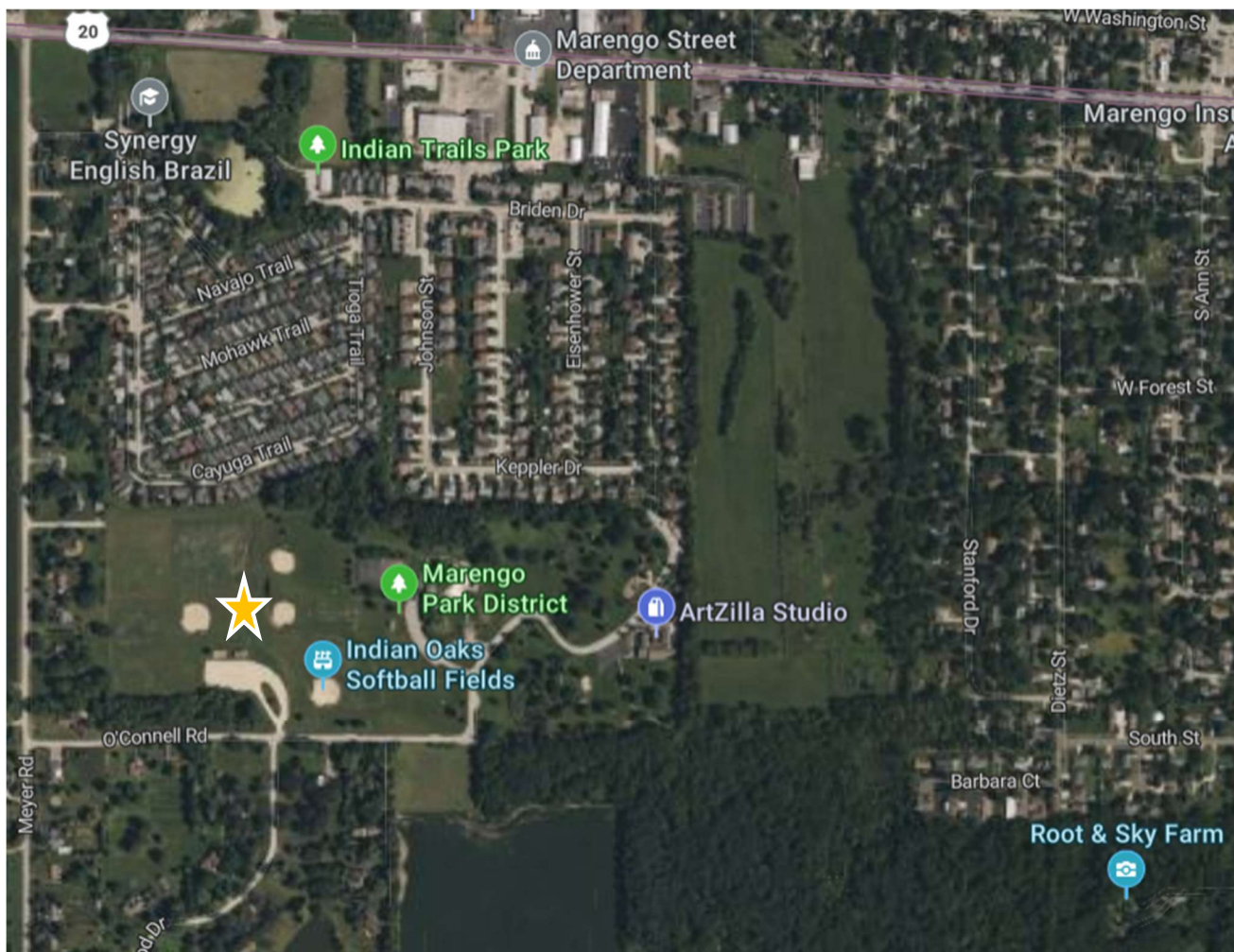
Concessions: Food is not available for purchase on the site (fast food is available nearby.)
