Guided by our conference theme, “How the Spirit Moves Us,” we hope to explore ways that social work and spirituality collectively address the political, racial, environmental, economic, and health disparity issues that separate us. Together we will examine the ways that these global concerns are addressed through social work practice, education, and scholarship.

This conference will bring together academics, practitioners, and students from various disciplines for an exciting and informative exchange of scholarship and ideas related to spirituality in research, professional education, social work practice, and social policy/social action. This year’s conference is made even more exciting because it is our first time on the campus of an HBCU. The 60-minute sessions include the following formats:

- Scholarly paper presentations
- Experiential workshops
- Panel discussions
- Roundtable discussions
- E-poster presentations
- Student-authored paper presentations (30 min.)

Submissions are invited on diverse topics related to the conference them focusing on ways to incorporate spirituality into social work practice, teaching, and scholarship. The deadline for abstract submission is **January 10, 2022**, with notifications sent out no later than **March 7, 2022**. Submissions will undergo a double-blind, peer-review and must include the following information:

1. Title of presentation
2. Presentation format
3. Three learning objectives
4. An abstract describing the topic or planned workshop activity
5. Brief presenter(s) biography
