Back To School Cont.

The first rule for parents is often forgotten: remember to take care of yourself so you can be better equipped to take care of others! Feeling sad, lonely, or stressed? We found an incredible CDC resource with helpful tools and articles called How Right Now. As always, our RCN Resource line is also here for referrals (651.356.8678). Beyond the basic rule of self-care, the Centers for Disease Control has some other relevant suggestions for parents with young children:

- Talk with teachers about the best way to separate from your child during the day -- brief goodbyes are often best;
- Try to stay calm and reassuring during transition—using a calm voice, with a relaxed face and body to let your child know that you wouldn't leave them if the child were not safe and protected.
- Make sure your child has a daily, predictable routine, with regular times for healthy meals, naps, and night sleep at home. Having a rested body and knowing what to expect at home helps children cope.
- Monitor your child's developmental milestones and learn what to do if there are concerns.



Finally, Minnesota families have a special resource for parents found in no other state: Every school district in Minnesota has an ECFE program. The Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) is a program serving families with children from birth to kindergarten. Among their many services they offer phone consultations with early childhood professionals, home visits, parenting classes and much more.
