Clustered bushmint	<i>Hyptis alata</i>	Prefers moist soil
Cut-leaf coneflower	<i>Rudbeckia lacinata</i>	
Elliott's aster	<i>Symphotrichum elliottii</i>	
Frostweed	<i>Verbesina virginica</i>	
Golden canna	<i>Canna flaccida</i>	Wetland plant, Larval host for Brazilian skipper
Goldenrod – Pinebarren	<i>Solidago fistulosa</i>	
Hammock twinflower	<i>Dyschoriste humistrata</i>	Larval host for Common Buckeye butterfly
Helmet skullcap	<i>Scutellaria integrifolia</i>	
Lanceleaf coreopsis	<i>Coreopsis lanceolata</i>	
Lizard's tail	<i>Saururus cernuus</i>	Wetland plant
Maryland goldensaster	<i>Chrysopsis mariana</i>	
Meadowbeauty	<i>Rhexia sp.</i>	Wetland plant
Pennyroyal	<i>Piloblephis rigida</i>	
Pickerelweed	<i>Pontederia cordata</i>	Wetland/aquatic plant
Porterweed	<i>Stachytarpheta jamaicensis</i>	
Rayless sunflower	<i>Helianthus radula</i>	
Rice button aster	<i>Symphotrichum dumosum</i>	Shrubby wildflower. Larval host for pearl crescent butterfly
Scarlet hibiscus	<i>Hibiscus coccineus</i>	Wetland plant
Silkgrass	<i>Pityopsis graminifolia</i>	
Spider lily	<i>Hymenocallis latifolia</i>	
Spiderwort	<i>Tradescantia ohiensis</i>	
Swamp milkweed (pink)	<i>Asclepias incarnata</i>	Larval host for Monarch, Queen & soldier butterflies; Needs moist to wet site
Tropical sage	<i>Salvia coccinea</i>	Red flower
Twinflower	<i>Dyschoriste oblongifolia</i>	Larval host for Common Buckeye butterfly
White beardtongue	<i>Penstemon multiflorus</i>	
White violet	<i>Viola primulifolia</i>	Good for shade
White wild indigo	<i>Baptisia alba</i>	Larval host for wild indigo duskywing & Zarucco duskywing butterflies
Wild petunia	<i>Ruellia caroliniensis</i>	Larval host for Common Buckeye & White Peacock butterflies
Yellowtop	<i>Flaveria linearis</i>	Shrubby wildflower

Shrubs

Beautyberry	<i>Callicarpa americana</i>	Birds eat the berries
Coontie	<i>Zamia integrifolia</i>	Evergreen
Coralbean	<i>Erythrina herbacea</i>	Attracts hummingbirds
Firebush 1 & 3-gal (\$10)	<i>Hamelia patens</i>	Attracts hummingbirds
Oakleaf hydrangea 3-gal (\$10)	<i>Hydrangea quercifolia</i>	Full or part shade
Privet cassia	<i>Senna ligustrina</i>	Larval host for Cloudless Sulphur, Sleepy Orange and the introduced Orange-Barred

		Sulphur butterflies
Simpson's stopper	Myrcianthes fragrans	Plants less than 1 year old
Sleepy hibiscus	Hibiscus furcellatus	Shrubby wildflower
Sweet acacia	Vachellia farnesiana	Shrub or very small tree
Wild coffee	Psychotria nervosa	Prefers part to full shade
Wild coffee (Dull-leaf)	Psychotria sulzneri	Prefers part to full shade
Yellow Star anise	Illicium parviflorum	Prefers part to full shade

Vines

Carolina yellow jessamine	Gelsemium sempervirens	Winter color
Coral honeysuckle	Lonicera sempervirens	Attracts hummingbirds
Corky-stem passionvine	Passiflora suberosa	Larval host for Gulf Fritillary, Variegated Fritillary, Zebra Longwing, Julia butterflies
Climbing aster	Symphotrichum caroliniensis	
Wild plumbago	Plumbago zeylanica	Vine or groundcover. Larval host for Cassius blue butterfly. Does well in shade

Grass

Muhly grass	Muhlenbergia capillaris	Perennial clumping grass

Browne's savory	Clinopodium brownie	Fragrant leaves
Creeping sage	Salvia misella	
Frogfruit	Phyla nodiflora	Flowering groundcover. Larval host for Phaon Crescent, White Peacock and Common Buckeye butterflies
Sunshine mimosa	Mimosa strigillosa	Flowering groundcover
