What it took to make Sacred Forest Yoga Festival a reality:

- \$2500 to rent Forestville for the duration of the festival.
- A core of directors who dedicated themselves to intensive visioning, brainstorming, planning, meeting, coordinating and creating hundreds of hours over the course of a few months.
- Generous vendors who offered their services on a donation basis three days of yoga classes, artists, musicians, teachers and healers (for context, a typical drop-in yoga class is between \$10-15, a massage is usually \$50-100, and so on).
- Kind community leaders and volunteers who stood up to provide for myriad pragmatic needs –
 marketing, education, security, camping / grounds logistics, firewood, maintenance and clean up,
 provision of water, niceties like snacks, paper towels and toilet paper, etc.
- Farmers and local stores who've supported the festival and provided sustenance.
- Talented musicians who brought their heart and soul, their equipment and their knowhow.
- Media outlets, poster development and printing, website design and radical networking (months of pounding the pavement to spread the word wide and far).
