- 5. Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree to waive any further notice to them, their agents, or their attorneys regarding the forfeiture, disposition, and turnover of the \$353,900 and \$20,081.
- 6. Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree not to file any claim, answer, petition, or other documents in any proceedings concerning the \$353,900 and \$20,081.
- 7. Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree not to contest, and agree not to assist any other person and entity to contest, the forfeiture in any proceedings concerning the \$353,900 and \$20,081.
- 8. Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree to withdraw any claims, answers, counterclaims, petitions, or other documents they filed in any proceedings concerning the \$353,900 and \$20,081, including, but not limited to, the administrative forfeiture and the administrative claims.
- 9. Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree to waive the statute of limitations, the CAFRA requirements, Supplemental Rules for Admiralty or Maritime Claims and Asset Forfeiture Actions A, C, E, and G, 18 U.S.C. § 983, any and all constitutional, statutory, legal, equitable rights, defenses, and claims regarding the property, including, but not limited to, double jeopardy and due process under the Fifth Amendment to the United States Constitution in any proceedings concerning the \$353,900 and \$20,081.
- 10. Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree to waive all constitutional, statutory, legal, equitable rights, defenses, and claims regarding the property, including, but not limited to, a jury trial under the Sixth Amendment to the United States Constitution in any proceedings concerning the \$353,900 and \$20,081.
- 11. Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree to waive any and all constitutional, statutory, legal, equitable rights, defenses, and claims regarding the property, including, but not limited to, excessive fines and cruel and

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27 28 unusual punishments under the Eighth Amendment to the United States Constitution in any proceedings concerning the \$353,900 and \$20,081.

- 12. Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree to waive any and all constitutional, statutory, legal, equitable rights, defenses, and claims to the property under *Honeycutt v. United States*, 137 S. Ct. 1626 (2017) and *United* States v. Thompson, 990 F.3d 680 (9th Cir. 2021) in any proceedings concerning the \$353,900 and \$20,081.
- 13. Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree to the entry of this Order to dismiss the case and to turnover the \$353,900 and \$20,081 to the SEC Receiver.
- 14. Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree to waive the right to appeal any Order to dismiss the case and to turnover the \$353,900 and \$20,081 to the SEC Receiver.
- Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree to the conditions set forth in this Stipulation to Dismiss the Civil Forfeiture and to Turnover the \$353,900 and \$20,081 to the SEC Receiver as to Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries, and Order (Stipulation).
- 16. Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily agree to hold harmless the United States, the United States Department of Justice, the United States Attorney's Office for the District of Nevada, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the United States Marshals Service, the Department of the United States Treasury, the Internal Revenue Service, the Securities and Exchange Commission, their agencies, their agents, and their employees from any claim made by Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries or any third party arising out of the facts and circumstances of the case, its dismissal, and turnover of the \$353,900 and \$20,081 to the SEC Receiver.
- Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries knowingly and voluntarily release and forever discharge the United States, the United States Department of Justice,

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- the United States Attorney's Office for the District of Nevada, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the United States Marshals Service, the Department of the United States Treasury, the Internal Revenue Service, the Securities and Exchange Commission, their agencies, their agents, and their employees from any and all claims, rights, or causes of action of any kind that Christopher Humphries and Jessica Humphries now have or may hereafter have on account of, or in any way growing out of, the seizures, the dismissal of the case, and the turnover of the \$353,900 and \$20,081 to the SEC Receiver.
- 18. Within a practicable time for the United States, the government agrees to turnover the \$353,900 and \$20,081 to the SEC Receiver.
- 19. Each party acknowledges and warrants that their execution of this Stipulation is free and is voluntary.
- 20. This Stipulation contains the entire agreement between Christopher Humphries, Jessica Humphries, and the government in this case.
- 21. Except as expressly stated in this Stipulation, no party, officer, agent, employee, representative, or attorney has made any statement or representation to any other party, person, or entity regarding any fact relied upon in entering into this Stipulation, and no party, officer, agent, employee, representative, or attorney relies on such statement or representation in executing this Stipulation.
- 22. The persons signing this Stipulation warrant and represent that they have full authority to execute this Stipulation and to bind the persons, on whose behalf they are signing, to the terms of this Stipulation.
- 23. This Stipulation shall be construed and interpreted according to federal forfeiture law and federal common law. The jurisdiction and the venue for any dispute related to, and/or arising from, this Stipulation is the unofficial Southern Division of the United States District Court for the District of Nevada, located in Las Vegas, Nevada.
 - 24. Each party shall bear their own attorneys' fees, expenses, costs, and interest.
- 25. This Stipulation shall not be construed more strictly against one party than against the other merely by virtue of the fact that it may have been prepared primarily by
