Paul Bunyan "Five K" Raffle Update

Community business partners and individuals have given sponsorships totaling \$3,800 with another \$250 pledged. Lion members have checked out 630 tickets, more than the 528 tickets that members sold last year. The Canoe Marathon sellers sold 363 tickets. 411 tickets were sold this past week at the Farmers Market and Neiman's Market bringing in \$2,135 in sales and donations.

The board approved Bob Visser's donation of the generator (value \$500) that powers the Christmas float in return for five years of paid dues.


