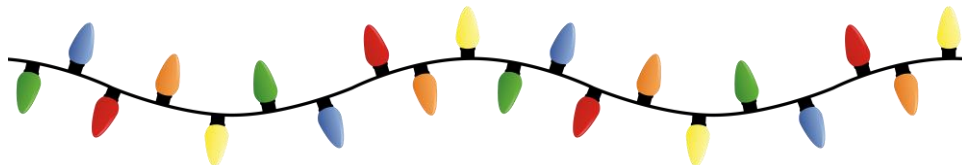
December 8: Lions / Rotary Christmas Gala – Lakewood Shores Beach Club
