The Paul Bunyan "Five K Raffle" was a tremendous success with all 3,000 tickets sold. Lion members sold 736 tickets, 25% of the total (\$3,075) and Over-the-Counter sales added 2262 tickets sold, 75% of the total (\$10,360). The donation jar added \$1,191.39. The many sponsors, both business partners and individuals, donated \$4,400. All of this adds up to \$19,026.39. After the prizes were awarded and expenses deducted, over \$13,000 will be added to our activities budget to support our many community projects.

The drawing was held on September 17th at the Paul Bunyan Festival. \$1,000 checks were mailed to Debbie Hayward of Reese, Jennifer Nattress of Blandon, PA, Bill Hamlin of Oscoda, Andrea McQueen of Livonia and Cindy Pangborn of Oscoda.
