Two handicap ramps were completed recently. On November 13<sup>th</sup> a ramp was completed in less than optimal conditions. Lions Chuck, Tony, Ann and Bill Gaines worked in snow and very cold temperatures to complete a ramp for a Tawas veteran. As they finished the temperature had warmed up to 23 degrees. A second ramp was completed on December 4<sup>th</sup>, again for a disabled veteran. The veterans' organization will reimburse the club for the cost of the materials for this ramp. These ramps are the last to be constructed in 2019.
