NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ADOPT THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE OF THE LOS VAQUEROS RESERVOIR JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Los Vaqueros Reservoir Joint Powers Authority, pursuant to the authority vested in it by sections 87300 et seq. of the Government Code, proposes adoption of its conflict of interest code. A copy of that conflict of interest code has been posted to the agency's website at www.losvaquerosjpa.com. A comment period has been established commencing on December 20, 2022 and closing on February 13, 2023. All inquiries should be directed to the contact listed below.

The Los Vaqueros Reservoir Joint Powers Authority proposes to adopt its conflict of interest code to include positions that involve the making or participation in the making of decisions that may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest, as set forth in subdivision (a) of section 87302 of the Government Code. The code carries out the purposes of the law and no other alternative would do so and be less burdensome to affected persons.

The proposed code and further explanation regarding its purposes can be obtained from the agency's contact set forth below.

Any interested person may submit written comments relating to the proposed amendment by submitting them no later than February 13, 2023, or at the conclusion of the public hearing, if requested, whichever comes later. At this time, no public hearing is scheduled. A person may request a hearing no later than February 13, 2023.

The Los Vaqueros Reservoir Joint Powers Authority has determined that the code:

- 1. Imposes no mandate on local agencies or school districts.
- 2. Imposes no costs or savings on any state agency.
- 3. Imposes no costs on any local agency or school district that are required to be reimbursed under Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code.
- 4. Will not result in any nondiscretionary costs or savings to local agencies.
- 5. Will not result in any costs or savings in federal funding to the state.
- 6. Will not have any potential cost impact on private persons, businesses or small businesses.
