Jodi Stapler is a singer-songwriter whose catalog spans jazz standards, blues, rock, country, and modern electronic influences—reflecting a lifelong evolution shaped by both tradition and independent creation. She began in musical theater and jazz, becoming known for her interpretations of American Songbook and blues standards. Her path later moved through country in the '90s and rock bands in the 2000s, before shifting into self-produced songwriting where elements of electro-pop and electro-rock emerged. After nearly a decade of independent songwriting, Stapler's current work marks a return to her roots—blues, Americana, and story-driven songwriting. Her recent releases focus on organic instrumentation, soulful vocals, and emotionally grounded narratives. Her present direction is firmly centered in contemporary blues and Blues-Americana, where vintage influence meets a modern, independent voice.
