We are just over a week out from starting sixday count and inspections at the Downtown Station. There are five zones at the DTCU and all five zones are scheduled for route inspections. With all the construction (unfinished) at the station, both union and district management attempted to utilize alternative inspection processes permitted in accordance with our local agreement with the Louisville installation. However, due to the excessive micromanagement from the buffoons calling the shots at Central Area, we were unable to reach any agreement for a modified route inspection with district management. In other words, upper management chose the more expensive way to conduct inspections which will likely take years to recover the costs associated to perform six-day count and inspections. I know, that's no surprise.

Inspections for the DTCU will take two weeks to perform for all five of the zones there. Immediately after that the Hikes Point station is scheduled to start on March 8th and the Iroquois station is scheduled for the weeks starting on March 15th and March 22nd before the district inspection team moves on to Lexington. Basically, without an agreement from the national parties for a modified inspection process, which is cheaper and less intrusive on letter carriers, route inspections will be in accordance with the M-39.

Our local agreement with the Louisville installation requires route inspections to be jointly conducted with branch representatives. That requirement allows us to resolve any issues or disputes with management quickly and enhances the union's ability to represent our members during the inspection week. Which is normally a very stressful week for our members.

To prepare our members for six-day count and inspections, the branch scheduled route protection classes for every Wednesday night in the month of September last year. However, attendance was unimpressive, and I suspect many members who weren't scheduled for inspections didn't bother to attend. Now that we're in Spring inspections, with


some of those members who didn't attend the route protection training we conducted, are asking the branch to put on the training again.

It's frustrating that more members don't take more interest in protecting their route assignments or trying to attend training when it's offered, but the branch will attempt to schedule route protection training in the next few weeks that will be beneficial to the members at the Hikes Point and Iroquois stations. Due to the late determination to conduct six-day inspections at the DTCU station, the inspection lead team representative for the Postal Service has agreed to perform extended dryrun training, if necessary, and to permit carriers to stop at any point during the office count and ask questions with union reps or have any concerns resolved to properly record data on their Form-

Hope to see many of you at the next union meeting.

First, I hope that when you read that, you hear his voice. Secondly and more importantly, that is to me the true definition of unionism. Some days now we report to work when it is dark and leave for home again when it's dark. Working conditions like these can make it hard to share experiences with letter carriers outside of work.


So, what do we do to begin to foster the attitude of unionism? We as a branch must hold management accountable for continual and blatant violations of the contract, in particular Article 8. We as members must make our steward aware of violations. We must be willing to write statements to help win grievances. Remember, the purpose of a grievance is not to make extra money for letter carriers (while that is a benefit!) or hurt the postal service financially, the purpose of a grievance ultimately, is to make management **STOP** violating our contractual rights.

In a similar vein, in my role as the Formal A representative for discipline for the Branch, I try

to be completely empathetic to what letter carriers are facing. Many times, carriers are not getting paid or fearing the loss of a job and that can be stressful both financially and mentally. I do my best to expedite these cases for quick resolution, because ultimately justice delayed is justice denied. In the spirit of true unionism when we get the decision, and to paraphrase the apostle Paul, if we win the case we rejoice, but if we lose the case we feel sorrow.

Ultimately my job as your representative is to serve the members. As long as you allow me to represent you, I will always give it all I have. In this role, I am often away from my bid assignment. I am so incredibly thankful for the letter carriers of Camp Taylor who consistently and diligently shoulder the burden of carrying the most difficult and strenuous route in the city, 1372.

I hope to see you at the next union meeting on February 25th.






I hope you enjoy your 15 minutes of fame!

In my opinion, Article 8 was written to protect those carriers that do not wish to work overtime. Article 8.5 provides that carriers on the overtime desired list will be worked prior to those not on the list. Specifically, Article 8.5.G provides that carriers not on the list shall be required to work overtime only if all the carriers on the list are scheduled to work 12 hours per day or 60 hours in the service week. This seems fairly cut and dry, but this topic has always been the driving factor of grievances in the Louisville installation. Management will not follow the rules set forth in Article 8 instead they choose to abuse those carriers not on the list. The abuse occurs daily in some of our stations. The remedy for these types of contractual violations has been 100 % of the top out pay or current \$36.00 an hour and has been in place since the arbitrations in 2011-2013. This has not stopped the abuse of our brothers and sisters carrying mail. It is time to up the ante to force, contractually compliance from Management. If 100% isn't enough to achieve this compliance, then maybe 200% might be enough or maybe 500% might force Management to comply. Either way it seems to be the right time to find out.

A long-forgotten part of Article 8 that hasn't been enforced is Article 8.5.F. This section deals with more protections for those carriers not on the list and again it is always violated by Management. At the last Steward's meeting, this topic was discussed. As a group, we will once again enforce this contractuall requirement. Article 8.5.F states: Excluding December, no full-time regular employee will be required to work overtime on more than four (4) of the employee's five (5) scheduled days in a service week or work over ten (10) hours on a regularly scheduled day, over eight (8) hours on a non-scheduled day, or over six (6) days in a service week. Article 8.5.F applies to both full-time regular and full-time flexible employees. The only two exceptions to the work

hour limits provided for in this section are for all full-time employees during the penalty overtime exclusion period (December) and for full-time employees on the ODL during any month of the year (Article 8.5.G). Both work and paid leave hours are considered "work" for the purposes of the administration of Article 8.5.F and 8.5.G.

Management has been put on notice that Branch 14 will enforce Article 8.5F to the maximum extent. We had a mutual agreement that we will overlook overtime violations up to .25 clicks, that has ended after receiving notification of a PDI for .03 clicks of overtime. To the Manager that has caused this backlash, I hope you enjoy your 15 minutes of fame. I can insure you that this will be discussed with ALL of your bosses and your threats to discipline over it before you properly investigated it will be addressed. The winds have shifted here in Louisville. Fast and Furious has arrived. Until next month please keep your head on a swivel and keep vigilant about your safety, only you can protect yourself and stay safe on the route. The key thieves are back again in multiply stations.

Made friends with hard work, aches, and pains


Work was hard, the truth can't be denied
