Welcome to State Transit Tourism Services

Sydney's buses, trains and ferries will take you to every corner of Sydney and its beautiful harbour. The tourism services arm of the state government public transport system is designed especially for visitors to the city - offers appealing and affordable sightseeing by road, rail or water. You can buy individual tickets for each of the touring possibilities listed on this page, or the whole lot in one neat package called SydneyPass.

Sydneypass

SydneyPass is the way to see the top sights of Sydney at your own pace. With your SydneyPass you have the flexibility to use the transport of your choice over a 7 calendar day period. SydneyPass gives unlimited travel on the Sydney and Bondi Explorers, three Sydney Harbour Ferry Cruises, the Manly Ferries and SuperCats, RiverCats and all State Transit Sydney Buses and Sydney Ferries, plus the use of the CBD CityRail network in the 'red' TravelPass zone, including return travel on AirportLink service.

**Bondiexplorer**

The 'blue' Bondi Explorer travels on a 30km circuit visiting Sydney's famous Bondi beach and beautiful harbour bayside suburbs of Double Bay, Rose Bay, Watsons Bay. Services operate every 30 minutes from 8.45am, 7 days a week. Get on and off the bus as often as you like. The last bus of the day leaves Circular Quay at 4.15pm, terminating at 6.15pm.

Sydneyexplorer

The famous 'red' Sydney Explorer connects 26 of Sydney's top tourist attractions. A continuous service, every 20 minutes from 8.40am, 7 days a week. Get on and off as often as you like. The last bus of the day leaves Circular Quay at 5.20pm terminating at 7.13pm.

Regular Sydney Trains

You get unlimited train travel on CityRail services within the areas bounded by Chatswood to the north, Bondi Junction to the east, Canterbury and Croydon to the west, and Bardwell Park and Rockdale to the south. Trains travelling around the underground central city network connecting Central Railway Station, Town Hall, Wynyard, Circular Quay, Museum and St James stations are also included. Airport Link includes one return journey only.

**Services to Manly, Zoo or Darling Harbour and Parramatta**

SydneyPass includes travel on the JetCat service between Circular Quay and Manly, the Taronga Zoo Ferry and the Darling Harbour Ferry, also the sleek RiverCat Service to Parramatta. Four great ways to see spectacular Sydney Harbour.

**Commuter Bus Services**

A fleet of modern buses providing a complete network of services for Sydney commuters is freely available with SydneyPass.

**Harbour Ferry Cruises**

Three wonderful Day Cruises to show off our great harbour, leaving 10.30am and 1pm (12.30pm weekends and public holidays), plus an 8pm Harbour Lights Cruise (Mon-Sat). Enjoy cruising on an authentic Sydney Harbour Ferry. Full commentary on board.
