

I hope your Christmas and New Year were spectacular! I am so happy you had some time off and also happy you are back and ready to serve our students.

Just a few reminders to get our brains (not trains) back on track!

- * If you have a student who is also working on an occupational certificate such
- as CNA, Phlebotomy, HBI Pact, you will need to list them on your attendance

as an IET student.

- * Be sure to take a look at your students' hours---are they close to 12 if so, give them some distance learning to get them over the hump. Are they close to 40- try putting them on CASAS Academy for part of their class time before giving the posttest.
- * If your new student scores NRS 4 on the pre-test, be sure to explain to them they are eligible for the fast track to GED and can take a GED ready as soon as they get 12 hours!
- * Be sure to review the goals sheet with your students—are they on track or do they need to adjust? Are they on the right educational pathway for the employment or further education they need?
- * Be sure to double check distance learning time from the break. Students hopefully put in some time and we want to be sure to give them credit for the hours they earned.

<u>December attendance and any ASPD's or portal submissions</u> that haven't been submitted yet are due the first day you come back to class.


If anyone has any students that they're struggling to get in to post test. Please reach out to one of us and we'll help.

It can only be printed when it is opened the first time. After that, it will print COPY on every time it is printed. They can come back to you to print it. Please copy it and put it in their folder. To get a duplicate copy,they will have to pay approximately \$20 and wait for it to be mailed. Please see the email dated January 6th for more information.
