#### **Peer Support Specialists**

Through the "lived-experience" of our peer support specialists, we will assist, encourage, empower and advocate with others on their journey to finding their own path to recovery. Recovery is possible but is not meant to be alone. We do recover together.

#### **Recovery Coordination**

In addition to our 'Recovering Hope' adult peer support groups, we also offer MARA meetings (Medication-Assisted Recovery Anonymous). Medication-Assisted Recovery Anonymous where non judgement is the code. It is a support group of people who believe in the value of medication as a means to recovery.

#### **DWI** Assessments

A DWI Substance Use Assessment is an alcohol and drug use assessment consisting of an interview by a Licensed or Certified Substance Use Counselor and a structured assessment questionnaire to evaluate a person's relationship with alcohol and/or drugs. It is required of everyone who is convicted of Driving While Impaired in the state of North Carolina.

## youth prevention services



#### We are Hope Week

This annual collaboration between Hope Coalition and Henderson County
Public Schools is a week-long initiative, which occurs just before spring break
to educate and raise awareness about the dangers of substance misuse. Activities
within the schools are student-led and vary to include banners signed by
students pledging to remain substance-free, tying white ribbons in
remembrance of those lost, and themed clothing days.
#WeAreHope week culminates with a banner-hanging event at the Historic
Henderson County Courthouse, featuring speakers from local government, law
enforcement, and other community leaders.

#### **Hope Rising**

Hope Rising is a youth diversion program that seeks to offer constructive alternatives to juvenile and criminal justice systems. The 12 session interactive curriculum assists at risk youth in healing and combating substance misuse. Youth from the department of juvenile justice are also required to perform community service, pay court costs and fines, and complete our drug and alcohol life skills program. When they have completed all requirements in the approved time period DJJ will determine if their contract can be closed. Through this program to support youth we also offer all parents the opportunity to take Triple P parenting classes.

#### **Henderson County Teen Court**

Hope Coalition has been tasked with the development of HC Teen Court, a restorative justice program. HC Teen Court is a diversionary court that keeps first and second-time juvenile offenders aged 11-17 and 18-19, out of the court system. The offenders who are willing to admit guilt are held accountable for their actions. A jury of the juvenile's peers may assign the juvenile to counseling, restitution, curfews, community service, or other rehabilitative measures. Teen Court programs are proven to reduce recidivism rates of young people and to restore their relationship with the community.

#### **Youth Council**

Henderson County Youth Council (HCYC) is a youth development program that teaches public speaking, strategic planning and other skills as a means to guide youth purpose. HCYC is a service-learning and leadership development program for high school students of Henderson County. HCYC is a student led and driven organization supported by United Way. The council consists of representatives from all public high schools including the Innovative High School and Early College and is open to youth enrolled in home schools. Youth are chosen through an application process that begins in the Spring.

#### The "Handle With Care" Model

This national modal created in Hendersonville provides a process for law enforcement to notify schools if they encounter a child at a traumatic scene, without disclosing the details. Once notified, schools and mental healthcare leaders can provide trauma-informed support if needed.

### harm reduction



Emphasizing public health and human rights, harm reduction programs provide essential health information and services while respecting individual dignity and autonomy. Harm reduction programs focus on limiting the risks and harms associated with unsafe drug use, which is linked to serious adverse health consequences, including HIV transmission, viral hepatitis, and death from overdose.

#### NARCAN/Naloxone Distribution

Naloxone (naloxone HCL, Narcan®, Evzio®) is an FDA-approved medication that reverses the effects of an opioid overdose by blocking receptors in the brain and restoring breathing.

#### Where to get Naloxone

In North Carolina there are four ways to find naloxone:

- Syringe exchange programs that offer naloxone
- NC health departments that offer naloxone
- North Carolina pharmacies that offer naloxone
- Talk to your medical care provider about getting naloxone

Lock Your Meds® is a national multi-media campaign produced by National Family Partnership®(NFP).
