The kids had lots to contribute to a discussion of how life was before electricity came to the island, as they took a look at the old stoves, organ and kitchen equipment.

In the Tashmoo Room were photos of the old steamer and park. They liked that people could eat on the boat, not quite the same as their Ferry crossing.

We saw the samples of coal and taconite that are transported by the freighters. Chuck Miller captured small groups as he continued his summer work on a model freighter.
