This year's Special Exhibit will look at the history of one of the most important ingredients of Harsens Island life- Sports and Recreation-Called "Fins & Feathers" the exhibit will feature a Sneak Boat made locally here in Fair Haven, local decoys that saw heavy use in seasons past as well as fishing equipment for summer and winter with rods and reels as well as hand carved fish decoys and rare old lures. Remembering the ladies who graced our grand resorts, the exhibit features a fine summer frock rounded out with needed accessories.

Early in its history the St. Clair Flats region became known for unexcelled duck hunting and fishing. At first there were little individual outposts built along the channels but eventually five clubhouses centered on these sports were erected with membership rosters that included a "who's who" of Detroit society. Lost in 17 Minutes; The Tug O Wilcox. The 123-foot tug Ozias Wilcox was built in 1869 in Detroit MI. She was best in class on the lakes, with an A2 rating; she was valued at \$10,000. In her last days, she was under charter to bring a raft of logs from Georgian Bay-to-Bay City. She met her fate in a large gale on August 29,1893, she went down in seven minutes in twenty-five fathoms of water approximately fifteen miles from Tawas.

New Great Lakes Maritime Museum Opens in Centerline

The newest member of the Great Lakes Maritime Museum Community opened recently at 26560 Van Dyke Rd. just south of I-696. The Rudy Nautical Museum, a creation of Dennis and Kathy Novak, is a stunning collection of marine art, charts and maps, artifacts and ship models collected over many years.

Dennis grew up in Cottrellville Township and spent his free time roaming the shores of the St. Clair River between Algonac and Marine City. Educated in law, accounting and business planning, Dennis has been involved in numerous ventures including motel ownership on the river. Maritime history is his life-long passion and his commitment to education is clearly evident in every display in the elegant multi-room museum.

The museum contains the largest single collection of original art work by marine artist Ed Labernik of Duluth, MN., as well as a number of J. Clary works. The ship models were built by Harvey Nissley, on the most prolific ship model builders known to this author. Each of the exhibits focuses on topical areas such as shipwreck disasters on the Lakes, including the Fitzgerald, Bradley, and the Wexford, evolution of vessel design and function, shipping lines of note, the great recreational passenger steamers including the Christopher Columbus, Columbia and the Tashmoo, the War of 1812, and a special memorial exhibit dedicated to the military.

The stunning layout of this unusual museum heightens both the aesthetic and the educational value to the visitor.

Each piece of the exhibit includes a concise narrative relating to its history and significance. The educational aspect of the museum is most evident in the exhibit designed to educate young and old on the significance of the Great Lakes as a vital commercial avenue to the world as well as their importance as a natural resource. Mr. Novak prefers to personally guide his guests to ensure they receive full benefits of his effort. Calling ahead is appreciated.
