PUBLIC NOTICE**

To: All Frankenlust Township Property Owners,
Possessors and Occupants of Land

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the provisions of Frankenlust Township Ordinance No. 4A the Frankenlust Township Weed Ordinance, requires each owner, possessor, or occupant of land in Frankenlust Township to destroy "weeds" (which includes certain types of weeds, and grasses and vegetation in excess of 10 inches in height or in (spread) before they reach seed-bearing state, and to prevent them from perpetuating themselves and from becoming a detriment to public health by cutting them to a depth of 165 feet from the road edge or the depth of the lot, whichever is less. If such weeds are not cut by May 1, 2025, a township agent may enter upon an owner's property and cut them. The township will have a lien upon the property for the cost of cutting the weeds. If the cost is not paid by the time township taxes are levied upon the tax roll, the cost will be added to the tax bill for the property and collected in the same manner as property taxes. In addition, the owner, possessor, or occupant may be subject to criminal prosecution since any violation of the Frankenlust Township Weed Ordinance is a misdemeanor offense which carries a \$100.00 fine per violation. Each day that a violation continues is a separate offense. The township may cut weeds as many times as is necessary and charge the cost to the property owners. RESIDENTS IN THIS AREA ARE PLANNING TO HAVE A WATERBODY TREATED WITH HERBICIDES AND ALGAECIDES FOR CONTROL OF AQUATIC WEEDS AND/OR ALGAE.

This notice is being circulated as required by Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE) rules. All required permit(s) for the treatment have been or will be secured from the EGLE before work commences.

You are receiving this notice if you are in, or if you are within 100 feet of the proposed treatment area. We also provide this notice, by request, to persons who may not be waterfront residents.

We usually work with groups of homeowners, established Lake Boards, Special Assessment Districts and various owners associations. Please feel free to contact us or any of these in your situation if you have any questions about the proposed treatment plan.

There are normally two types of treatments: algae control and weed control.

Algae Control - If we are doing only an algae control treatment it's possible that no water use restrictions apply. we will post the shoreline with yellow signs before these products are applied to the waterbody as required by the EGLE.

Weed Control / Water Dye - If we are treating for weeds, using blue dye, or with certain algae control products then there will be limited restrictions on the use of the water, and we will post the shoreline with yellow signs before these products are applied to the waterbody as required by the EGLE.

TREATMENT NOTICE

****This notice is to be distributed between 7 - 45 days prior to first proposed treatment****

We treat each waterbody using all best management practices in a treatment plan worked out between the persons in charge and an aquatic manager. A typical plan will include multiple treatments from May to October. However, due to the differences in season plans and the uncertainty of weather, please watch your shoreline for the posting of the yellow signs throughout the summer.

IN MOST CASES YOUR WATERBODY WILL BE TREATED MORE THAN ONCE EACH SEASON; CHECK THIS WITH YOUR ASSOCIATION.

The posted signs will indicate the date of the treatment, the product name, the active ingredient and any restrictions as to the use of the water for swimming, watering lawns or agricultural uses. We post **NEW SIGNS FOR EACH TREATMENT**.

When more than one product is used, the longest restrictions should be followed. If you have any questions, we can be reached at the number on the other side of this notice.

Only products which have been registered and approved for use in the aquatic environment by the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development, the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy and the US Environmental Protection Agency are applied.

We anticipate using one or more of the products listed. Please be aware of the restrictions on each product. If the EGLE changes any restrictions, they will be noted on the signs we post.

PRODUCTS & RESTRICTIONS: (Information below is from product labels and MI-EGLE guidelines. When 2 or more labels exist for a single active ingredient the most stringent information is provided)

Diquat Dibromide: Do not use the treated water for swimming for 24 hours after treatment. Do not use treated water to irrigate turf or ornamentals for 3 days after treatment. Do not use the treated water for Domestic, Agricultural uses or Livestock Watering for a period of 5 days after treatment. *Common trade names: Reward, Tribune.*

2,4-D: Do not use the treated water for swimming for 24 hours after treatment. Do not use treated water to irrigate ornamentals, for Domestic, Agricultural or for Livestock Watering for a period of up to 21 days after treatment. There is no use restriction for turf irrigation. *Common trade names: Navigate, Sculpin G.*

Triclopyr: Do not use the treated water for swimming for 24 hours after treatment. Do not use treated water to irrigate ornamentals, for Domestic, Agricultural or for Livestock Watering for up to 120 days or until the active ingredient has dissipated below a non-detectable level as determined by water testing (usually after 2-3 weeks). There is no use restriction for turf irrigation. *Common trade names: Renovate 3, Renovate OTF, and Navitrol.*

Endothal: Do not use the treated water for swimming for 24 hours after treatment. There is no use restriction for turf irrigation, ornamentals, domestic or agricultural uses or for livestock watering. *Common trade names: Aquathol-K, Hydrothol-191*

Fluridone: Do not use the treated water for swimming for 24 hours after treatment. Do not use treated water to irrigate turf or ornamentals for up to 30 days after treatment. Do not use the treated water for Domestic or Agricultural uses for a period of up to 30 days after treatment. There is no use restriction for Livestock Watering. *Common trade names: Avast!, Sonar.*

Copper based algaecides: NO WATER USE RESTRICTIONS. Copper is the active ingredient. Informational posting only. *Common trade names: Copper Sulfate, Cutrine, Captain (XTR), Argos.*

Copper based herbicides: Do not use the treated water for swimming for 24 hours after treatment. No restriction for turf, ornamentals, Domestic, Agricultural uses and Livestock Watering. *Common trade names: Komeen, Harpoon, Current.*

Glyphosate: Do not use the treated water for swimming for 24 hours after treatment. No restriction for turf, ornamentals, Domestic or Agricultural uses and Livestock Watering. *Common trade names: Shoreklear-Plus, Aqua-Star, Shoreline Defense.*

Imazamox: Do not use the treated water for swimming for 24 hours after treatment. Do not use treated water to irrigate turf for 1 day after treatment. No restriction for Ornamentals, Domestic, Agricultural uses or Livestock Watering. *Common trade names: Clearcast.*

Flumioxazin: Do not use the treated water for swimming for 24 hours after treatment. Do not use treated water to irrigate turf, ornamentals or Agricultural uses for up to 5 days after treatment. No restriction for Domestic or Livestock Watering. *Common trade names: Clipper, Schooner, Propeller.*

Florpyrauxifen-Benzyl: Do not use the treated water for swimming for 24 hours after treatment. No Restriction for turf, Do not use treated water to irrigate ornamentals or Agricultural uses for up to 35 days after treatment. No restriction for Domestic or Livestock Watering. *Common trade names: ProcellaCOR.*

You are advised to avoid use of this waterbody the entire day products are scheduled to be applied and until appropriate restrictions have expired. There are no fishing restrictions or fish consumption restrictions. Ornamentals refers to flowers, bushes, shrubs and other types of decorative plantings. Domestic use includes but is not limited to: washing of household items, clothes, dishes, etc. Domestic animals (i.e. dogs, cats, etc.) using treated waters fall under the swimming restriction.

We are sending this letter to make you aware that Enbridge Energy will be conducting maintenance to an Enbridge pipeline in your area throughout the months of June and July 2025.

What to expect- Residents may notice intervals of increased construction activity and occasional petroleum odors near the worksite in Frankenlust Township and Portsmouth Township during this time. Please reference the accompanying map for location of the worksite. Additionally, on approximately **June 24th and June 25th** between the hours of 9AM-3PM, there may be intermittent petroleum odor and a high-pitched whistle sound as we release high pressured air from the pipeline. This activity allows our team to complete the work safely.




Pipeline maintenance is underway in your area

Mosquito Control

BAY COUNTY RESIDENTS AND VISITORS:

Bay County Mosquito Control may treat this area to help reduce the occurrence of vector and nuisance mosquitoes by targeting areas in which they breed. The following habitats may be treated by certified applicators: artificial containers, cross country drains, flooded fields, flood plains, flooded woodlots, idle swimming pools, ponds, roadside ditches, sewage lagoons, tires, tree holes, and catch basins.

Outdoor public recreation areas (i.e., campgrounds, rest areas, parks, playgrounds, picnic areas, athletic fields) may also be treated to reduce the mosquito population. Method of application may include aerial application, hand application, hand-held spreaders, hand-held pressure sprayers, backpack blowers, truck-mounted pressure sprayers or truck-mounted ultra-low volume cold aerosol foggers.
