Michigan cities and townships are authorized to enact ordinances for the protection of public health, safety, and welfare. For example, the Township Board of Trustees have maintained a consistent enforcement policy to require repair or removal of dilapidated structures, clean-up of blighted properties, removal of inoperable or unlicensed vehicles, and correction of other unlawful conditions governed by the Township's blight and dilapidated buildings ordinances. The Township's Zoning Ordinance regulates the intensity and arrangement of land uses, structures, and site improvements. A zoning permit is required for new homes and additions, for decks, pools, garages, and pole barns, and for most fences and sheds. Site plan approval is required from the Planning Commission for larger land development and construction projects. Check out the Township's ordinances online at the township website Frankenlust.org. Are you contemplating plans for a building project this year? The zoning permit application form is also available on the Township's website or at the Township office during business hours. Thank you for helping to keep Frankenlust Township safe and looking great!

🛱 Fire Department – Bryan Kukla, Chief 🛱

Near the end of summer, fire hydrant exercising was completed for the hydrants in the Township. Every year, each hydrant is "exercised" to ensure proper operation and that adequate water flow is available for the fire department. It also improves water quality by clearing iron and other mineral deposits from the water mains. If you have a hydrant in your yard, you can help us by keeping a three-foot area around the hydrant clear of overgrown weeds and brush and especially the upcoming snow! Cold winter weather means thermostats are being turned up. Make sure your family is protected from the risk of carbon monoxide (CO), a colorless and odor-less poisonous gas, with a CO detector. Also remember to test your CO and smoke detectors monthly. Change your batteries at least annually and replace any detectors over ten years old. Our 12th Annual Open House was held back in September. Families were able to meet our firefighters, tour the fire trucks and also meet representatives from the Bay County Sheriff Department, Michigan State Police, U.S. Coast Guard, Bay County 911, and Medstar Ambulance. If you missed us this year, we hope you can join us next year! Mark your calendars for the Firefighter's of Frankenlust Association 45th Annual Fundraiser Banquet to be held on Saturday, February 26, 2022. Proceeds help fund nonbudgeted items for the fire department throughout the year. This year the Firefighter's Association will also be holding a gun raffle that will be drawn live at the event.
