BLIGHT CONTROL FRANKENLUST TOWNSHIP ord. no. 70

An Ordinance to provide for the regulation and control of the storage, accumulation, and disposition of junk, trash, rubbish, abandoned vehicles, wrecked, dismantled, or unusable vehicle, the maintenance of blight structures and other blighting factors or causes of blight and deterioration thereof, and to provide penalties for the violation thereof.

THE TOWNSHIP OF FRANKENLUST, BAY COUNTY, MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

Sec. 1.

The following words or terms when used herein shall be deemed to have the meanings set forth below:

- A) The term "junk" shall include, without limitation, parts of motor vehicles, broken and unusable furniture, stoves, refrigerators, or other appliances.
- B) The term "junk motor vehicles" shall include, without limitation, any vehicle which is not licensed for use upon the highways of the State of Michigan for a period in excess of 60 days, and shall also include, whether licensed or not, any motor vehicle which is inoperative for any reason for a period in excess of 60 days; provided that there is excepted from this definition unlicensed, but operative, vehicles which are kept as the stock in trade of a regularly licensed and established new or used automobile dealer or other motorized vehicle dealer; provided, further, such vehicles are excepted as are upon the premises of a motor vehicle repair garage; also excepted from this definition are unlicensed, but operative, vehicles which are recreational vehicles for use off the highways of Michigan.
- C) The term "abandoned vehicle" shall include, without limitation, any vehicle which has remained on private property for a period of 48 continuous hours, or more, without the consent of the owner or occupant of the property, or for a period of 48 continuous hours or more after the consent of the owner or occupant of the property has been revoked.
- D) The term "blighted structure" shall include, without limitation, any dwelling, garage or outbuilding, or any factory, shop, store, office building,

warehouse, or any other structure or part of a structure which, because of fire, wind, or other natural disaster, or physical deterioration, is no longer habitable as a dwelling, nor useful for the purpose for which it may have been intended.

- E) The term "**person**" shall include all natural persons, firms, copartnerships, corporations, and all associations of natural persons, incorporated or unincorporated, whether acting by themselves or by a servant, agent, or employee. All persons who violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance, whether as owner, occupant, lessee, agent, servant, or employee, shall, except as herein otherwise provided, be equally liable as principals.
- F) The term "trash" and "rubbish" shall include any and all forms of debris not otherwise classified in this Ordinance.

Sec. 2.

It is hereby determined that the storage or accumulation of trash, rubbish, junk, junk motor vehicles, abandoned vehicles, and the maintenance of blighted structures upon any private property within the Township of Frankenlust tends to result in blighted and deteriorated neighborhoods, the spread of vermin and disease, the increase in criminal activity, and therefore is contrary to the public peace, health, safety, and general welfare of the community.

Sec. 3

It shall be unlawful for any person to store or to permit the storage or accumulation of trash, rubbish, junk, junk motor vehicles, or abandoned vehicles on any private property in the Township except within a completely enclosed building or within a solid 6 foot fence upon the premises of a properly zoned or legally operating or approved junk dealer, junk buyer, dealer in used auto parts, dealer in second hand goods or junk, operator of an automobile repair garage and/or automobile wrecker business.

Sec. 4.

It shall be unlawful for any person to keep or maintain any blighted or vacant structure, dwelling, garage, outbuilding, factory, shop, store, or warehouse unless the same is kept securely locked, the windows kept glazed or neatly boarded up, and otherwise protected to prevent entrance thereto by unauthorized persons or unless such structure is in the course of construction in accordance with a valid building permit issued by the Township of

Frankenlust and unless such construction is completed within a reasonable time.

Sec. 5.

If, upon inspection, the Township Building Inspector, Township Constable, Township Supervisor, or County Health Officer shall find that any property within the Township is being used in violation of the above Sections of this Ordinance, the owner and/or occupant shall be notified of such violation which may be given by certified letter to the owner as he appears on the real property tax rolls of Frankenlust Township or by service upon the occupant personally by any official of the Township of Frankenlust or the Bay County Health Department.

Sec. 6.

The owner and/or occupant may appeal to the Township Board for a public hearing which shall be held at a regular or specially called Township Board meeting providing he files a request in writing with the Township Clerk within ten days of the receipt of the notice above specified. If a special hearing is requested, expenses connected with such hearing will be paid by the applicant.

Sec. 7.

If the owner and/or occupant of such premises shall not cause such material in violation of this ordinance, as described above, to be eliminated or removed within ten days after notice or within ten days after the decision of the Township Board is rendered in case of an appeal, the Township Supervisor shall direct some person, or persons, to remove and/or eliminate the same at the cost and expense of the owner and/or occupant of the premises. After causing such materials to be eliminated or removed, the total expense incurred by the Township shall be a lien upon the property and the same may be collected in any manner authorized by statute and, if not paid, may be placed on the Tax Roll and collected the same as other taxes.

Sec. 8.

Any violation of or any failure to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00 or by imprisonment not to exceed 90 days or both. Each day that a violation of this Ordinance is continued or permitted to exist without compliance shall constitute a separate offense punishable upon conviction in

the manner prescribed in this Section provided no person shall be imprisoned for a single but continuing violation of this Ordinance for a period of longer that 90 days. In addition to the criminal sanctions herein provided, the Township specifically reserves the right and shall have the authority to proceed in any court of competent jurisdiction for the purpose of obtaining an injunction, restraining order, or other appropriate civil proceedings to prevent, enjoin, abate, or remove any violation of this Ordinance.

Sec. 9.

Should any section, clause, or provision of this Ordinance be declared by any Court to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of such Section of this Ordinance or any part thereof other than the part so declared to be invalid.

Sec. 10.

In the event that any part of this Ordinance shall conflict with a portion of some other Frankenlust Township Ordinance, the language in this Ordinance shall be controlling.

Sec. 11.

This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days after publication and shall be published once in full in the Bay City Democrat, a newspaper circulating within the boundaries of the Township of Frankenlust, on or before the 18th day of September, 1997.
