Zoning Administrator Report is on file. Trustee Britton provided information correcting Zoning Permit #2 on the report submitted by Zoning Administrator David DeGrow. The size of the pole barn is 38' x 40' and the applicant is Cmeyla not William.

<u>Easements</u> Three Consumers Energy Easements have been found on the former MI Haus property not two. Only two have been approved for payment. Discussion. Motion by Britton/Fisher to approve three easements to be removed by Consumers for a total of \$2,100.00. Roll Call Vote:

<u>EGLE Grant</u> Motion by Britton/Ortner to accept the \$72,000.00 grant given to Frankenlust Township from the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) Recycling Infrastructure RFP. 5 aye, 0 nay. Carried.

<u>Mid-Valley Structures</u> Realtor Niedzwiecki sent an email indicating a serious inquiry of purchasing the former MI Haus property from Mid-Valley Structures which sells sheds and barns. Motion by Begick/Ortner to decline any offers from Mid-Valley Structures to purchase the property. Discussion. 5 aye, 0 nay. Carried.

<u>REU Adjustment</u> A spreadsheet was used to show the adjustments being recommended to adjust the REU (Residential Equivalent Unit) for businesses in the township. Motion by Fisher/Britton to approve the REU adjustments as presented. Discussion. 5 aye, 0 nay. Carried.

Amendment to Saginaw City Water Contract A letter was received from the City of Saginaw indicating the additional water connections that may be needed for Symphony and Delta College properties, will not be subject to the 425 provisions as discussed in recent negotiations. This letter will be attached to the current contract.

Special Assessment District A Public Hearing and Special Board Meeting will be held on September 19, 2023 at 4:00 p.m. The purpose of this hearing/meeting will be to present and approve the creation of a Special Assessment District for the purpose of financing the collection and disposal of garbage and rubbish, as well as the plans and costs for same.

<u>Elected Officials' Office Hours</u> Treasurer Ortner requested that she be allowed to adjust her office hours at the Township Administration Building. By consensus, the board concurred with Treasurer Ortner's request. As elected public officials, township board members must faithfully perform their official statutory duties as authorized and limited by state law. Currently, there are no stipulations, under the law, defining required office hours. It was agreed that, prior to the next election, Board members will review guidelines concerning this topic.

<u>Eagle Scout Project Sign</u> The current pavilion was designed, managed and built by a Boy Scout as his Eagle Scout Project. The board approved the sign being repainted by the former scout and rehung on the pavilion.
